1 2	AN ACT TO CREATE AND EMPOWER THE MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON THE ECONOMIC STATUS OF WOMEN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) (a) There is hereby created the Mississippi
5	Commission on the Economic Status of Women. The commission shall
6	be composed of eleven (11) members to be appointed as follows:
7	(i) Six (6) members shall be appointed by the
8	Governor; and
9	(ii) Five (5) members shall be appointed by the
10	Lieutenant Governor.
11	(b) The members of the commission shall be women and
12	men of recognized ability and achievement who are representative
13	of the ethnic and cultural diversity of the population of this
14	state. Members shall serve for terms of four (4) years each, and
15	no member may serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms. All
16	vacancies shall be filled by the appointing authority for the
17	unexpired term.
18	(c) The commission shall elect a chairman, vice
19	chairman and secretary from among its members for terms of two (2)
20	years each, and any member is eligible for successive elections to
21	office.

(e) Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for
expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972,
and shall receive per diem as provided in Section 25-3-69,
Mississippi Code of 1972.

(f) The Lieutenant Governor shall notify the Governor after he has made his appointments, and the Governor shall then designate a place and time for the initial, organizational meeting of the commission.

32 (2) The commission shall have the powers and authority
33 necessary to carry out the duties imposed upon it by this act,
34 including, but not limited to, the following:

35 (a) To employ such administrative, technical and other 36 personnel as may be necessary for the performance of its powers 37 and duties;

38 (b) To hold hearings, make and sign any agreements, and 39 do or perform any acts which may be necessary, desirable or proper 40 to carry out the purposes of this act;

(c) To cooperate with any state agency, authority, board, commission, department or institution to facilitate its implementation of the powers and duties granted to the commission in this act; and each such state agency, authority, board, commission, department or institution shall cooperate with the commission in the performance of its duties;

47 (d) To appoint advisers or advisory committees from
48 time to time when the commission determines that the experience or
49 expertise of such advisers or advisory committees is needed for
50 projects of the commission; and

51 (e) To apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts and 52 services from the state, the government of the United States or

56 (3) (a) The commission shall study, but not be limited to,57 the following areas:

58 (i) Women's educational and employment problems,59 needs and opportunities;

60 (ii) The socioeconomic factors that influence the61 economic status of women;

(iii) The development of individual potential;
(iv) State laws in regard to the civil, economic
and political rights of women, including pensions, tax
requirements, property rights, marriage and dissolution of
marriage provisions, and similar matters;

67 (v) The effect of social attitudes and pressures
68 and economic considerations in shaping the roles to be assumed by
69 women in the society; and

(vi) Any laws, practices or conditions concerning or affecting women which impose special limitations or burdens upon them or upon society, or which limit or tend to limit economic opportunities available to women.

(b) The commission shall act as an information center
on the economic status of women and women's educational,
employment and other related needs.

(c) The commission shall recommend, develop, prepare or coordinate materials, projects or other activities and shall give technical and consultative advice to public or private groups or persons concerned with any of the following:

No. 2311 00\SS01\R85 PAGE 3 81 (i) Preventing or minimizing problems brought about by the changing roles and responsibilities of women; and 82 83 (ii) Developing programs to encourage and enable women to be fully contributing members of society. 84 85 (d) The commission may encourage women's organizations and other groups to institute local self-help activities designed 86 to meet women's educational, employment and related needs. 87 88 (4) The commission shall make a report to the Legislature at the close of each fiscal year on its activities, findings and 89 90 recommendations. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 91

and after July 1, 1999.

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
