SENATE BILL NO. 2316

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-7-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 INCREASE THE COMPENSATION OF COUNTY PATROL OFFICERS IN A CERTAIN 3 COUNTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 45-7-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:[JMR1]

7 45-7-5. (1) Subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of 8 this section, the board of supervisors may compensate the county patrol officers in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars 9 10 (\$500.00) per month for any one county; in no case shall any one 11 patrol officer receive compensation in excess of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) per month. In addition to such compensation, 12 the board of supervisors may furnish the patrol officers means of 13 transportation. 14

(2) (a) The board of supervisors of any county having a population of thirty-one thousand six hundred fifty-three (31,653) according to the 1960 federal decennial census, having a land area of nine hundred thirty-eight (938) square miles, and wherein U.S. Highway 49 and Mississippi Highway 16 intersect, may compensate the county patrol officers in an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month for any such county; in no case

S. B. No. 2316 00\SS03\R356 PAGE 1 22 shall any one patrol officer receive compensation in excess of 23 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per month.

(b) The board of supervisors of any county bordering on
the Louisiana line and Mississippi River may fix the compensation
of the county patrol officers at an amount not to exceed Four
Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) per month per patrol officer.

28 (c) The board of supervisors of any county bordering on 29 the Mississippi River wherein is located a national park and 30 cemetery, wherein U.S. Highways 80 and 61 intersect, and having a population in excess of forty-two thousand (42,000) according to 31 the 1960 federal decennial census, may compensate the county 32 patrol officers in an amount not to exceed One Thousand Five 33 34 Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) per month for any such county but in 35 no case in excess of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per month per 36 officer.

(d) The board of supervisors of any Class 4 county
bordering on the state of Alabama wherein U.S. Highway 98 and
Mississippi Highway 63 intersect, having a land area of four
hundred eighty-one (481) square miles, may, in its discretion,
compensate each of its county patrol officers in an amount not in
excess of Six Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$650.00) per month.

43 (e) The board of supervisors of any county in which
44 U.S. Highway 45 and Mississippi Highway 16 intersect may, in its
45 discretion, compensate its county patrol officers in an amount not
46 to exceed <u>Twenty-two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00) annually</u> per
47 patrol officer.

48 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 49 and after July 1, 2000.
