SENATE BILL NO. 2334

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS UNDER THE MINIMUM 2 EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYING ELEMENTARY SCHOOL 3 GUIDANCE COUNSELORS BASED UPON STUDENT ENROLLMENT; TO PROVIDE AN 4 ADDITIONAL ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS IN EACH SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEAR UNTIL EACH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL HAS EMPLOYED AT LEAST ONE COUNSELOR; TO 5 AUTHORIZE SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO USE SUCH ALLOTMENTS TO EMPLOY SCHOOL 6 7 SOCIAL WORKERS OR PUBLIC SCHOOL NURSES WITH APPROPRIATE 8 CERTIFICATION; TO PROVIDE CERTAIN CONDITIONS ON THE EMPLOYMENT OF 9 STATE-FUNDED SCHOOL GUIDANCE COUNSELORS AND TO PRESCRIBE THE COMPREHENSIVE COUNSELING SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED; AND FOR RELATED 10 11 PURPOSES.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. (1) Beginning with the 2000-2001 school year, in 13 14 addition to other funds allotted under the minimum education 15 program, each school district shall be allotted sufficient funding to employ one (1) elementary school guidance counselor, with 16 funding for an additional elementary school guidance counselor to 17 be allotted per fiscal year until each elementary school in the 18 19 school district has one (1) state-funded school guidance 20 counselor. However, until the time that there is a counselor in 21 every elementary school at a counselor/student ratio of 1:500 or 22 greater, the annual appropriation for elementary school guidance counselors shall not be reduced. 23

(2) The State Department of Education may, however, increasethe number of positions funded each year beyond the above

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(3) Local school boards shall be authorized, in their 27 discretion, to utilize such minimum program allotments to employ 28 29 licensed social workers who possess a master's degree in social work and have had specific classes in individual and group 30 31 counseling as determined by the State Department of Education. 32 Local school boards shall also be authorized, in their discretion, 33 to utilize such minimum program allotments to employ public school 34 nurses who possess a bachelor's degree in nursing as a minimum qualification. 35

36 (4) The assignment of state-funded school guidance
37 counselors, social workers or public school nurses to the
38 particular schools within the district shall be at the discretion
39 of the local school board with the following restrictions:

40 (a) The counselor/student ratio shall be no greater 41 than 1:500, or one (1) counselor per school building, whichever is 42 greater;

43 (b) No individual shall be employed as a school
44 guidance counselor, social worker or public school nurse without
45 appropriate training and certification as determined by the State
46 Department of Education; and

(c) State-funded school guidance counselors, social workers or public school nurses shall be full-time professional personnel, shall spend at least seventy-five percent (75%) of work time in a direct counseling relationship with pupils and shall devote no more than one-fourth (1/4) of the workday to administrative activities.

53 (5) State-funded school guidance counselors shall provide 54 the following comprehensive counseling services: (a) academic and 55 personal advisement; (b) student assessment and assessment 56 consultation; (c) career and educational planning; (d) individual

No. 2334 00\SS01\R30 PAGE 2 57 and group counseling; (e) preventive classroom counseling activities and crisis intervention; (f) referrals to community 58 59 agencies; (g) educational consultation with teachers, 60 administrators, parents and community leaders; (h) educational and career placement services; and (i) follow-up counseling services. 61 (6) Nothing in this section shall prohibit any school 62 district from employing with local funds more school guidance 63 counselors, social workers or public school nurses than are 64 65 provided for in this section.

(7) The State Department of Education may adopt regulations
regarding the activities of the school guidance counselor, school
social worker or public school nurse as are not inconsistent with
this section.

70 (8) This section shall stand repealed from and after July 1,71 2003.

72 <u>SECTION 2.</u> All new programs authorized in this act are 73 subject to the availability of funds specifically appropriated 74 therefor by the Legislature.

75 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 76 and after July 1, 2000.

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
