SENATE BILL NO. 2478 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 49-1-39 AND 49-5-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE FEDERAL MIGRATORY BIRD TREATY ACT BY REMOVING THE PROVISION ALLOWING THE KILLING OF HAWKS AND OWLS; AND 1 2 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 49-1-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:[LTR1] 8 49-1-39. The commission <u>may</u> issue permits to kill any 9 species of animals or <u>native</u>, <u>nonmigratory</u> birds which may become 10 injurious to agricultural or other interests in any particular community. All migratory birds, including hawks, owls, and eagles 11 12 and their nests and eggs are protected by the Migratory Bird 13 Treaty Act and federal regulations promulgated under this act. All species of blackbirds, cowbirds, starlings, crows, grackles, 14 15 and English sparrows may be killed without a permit when such 16 birds are committing or about to commit depredations on shade or 17 ornamental trees or agricultural crops. SECTION 2. Section 49-5-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 18 amended as follows:[LTR2] 19 20 49-5-7. (1) No wild bird other than a game bird shall be pursued, taken, wounded, killed, captured, possessed or exported 21 at any time, dead or alive. No part of the plumage, skin, or body 22 of any bird protected by this section or of any birds coming from 23 24 without the state, the importation of which is prohibited into the 25 United States, shall be sold or had in possession for sale in this 26 state.

27 No person shall molest, take or destroy or attempt to molest,

S. B. No. 2478 00\SS03\R770 PAGE 1 take or destroy the nests or eggs of any wild bird, or have such nest or eggs in his possession, except under the authority of a permit duly issued for scientific purposes.

(2) * * * This section shall not apply to game birds for 31 32 which there is an open season under state law; birds, or parts thereof collected or possessed under the authority of a 33 34 certificate duly issued for scientific purposes; or to the * * * English * * * sparrow, crow and starling or to the nests or eggs 35 36 of such unprotected birds. Nor shall anything contained in this section prohibit any person on his own land or land under his 37 control from killing or destroying any English sparrow, * * * 38 crow, or crow blackbird, or any animal by nature destructive of 39 gardens, crops or property of any kind. * * * This section shall 40 not apply to introduced pheasants, which are hereby classified as 41 42 domestic fowls.

43 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 44 and after its passage.
