- 2 1972, TO REVIEW THE CATEGORIES OF LIFETIME LICENSES FOR POSSIBLE
- 3 ELIMINATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-153, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 brought forward as follows:[LTR1]
- 7 49-7-153. (1) Any resident may purchase a lifetime
- 8 sportsman license by filing an application in the office of the
- 9 department. The license shall qualify the licensee to take all
- 10 fish, game and fowl, except waterfowl, including deer and turkey,
- 11 in the manner provided by law. The license shall also permit the
- 12 licensee to hunt with primitive weapons and bow and arrow, and to
- 13 take crabs, oysters, shrimp and any other saltwater fish
- 14 authorized to be taken under a recreational permit. Any resident
- 15 may purchase a lifetime fishing license by filing an application
- 16 in the office of the department. The lifetime fishing license
- 17 shall entitle the licensee to fish in the public waters of the
- 18 state, including the taking of crabs, oysters, shrimp and any
- 19 saltwater fish authorized to be taken under a recreational permit.
- 20 (2) The department may issue a lifetime sportsman license at
- 21 a fee to be determined by the commission at an amount not less

- 22 than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for a person over twelve (12)
- 23 years of age; not less than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for a
- 24 person between the ages of two (2) years and twelve (12) years
- 25 inclusive; and not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for a
- 26 person under two (2) years of age. The department may issue a
- 27 golden lifetime sportsman license at a fee to be determined by the
- 28 commission, in an amount not less than One Thousand Dollars
- 29 (\$1,000.00). The categories for lifetime fishing licenses shall
- 30 be the same as the categories for lifetime sportsman licenses.
- 31 The fee for each category of lifetime fishing licenses shall be
- 32 one-half (1/2) of the fee for the comparable category of sportsman
- 33 licenses. The difference in the fee charged for the golden
- 34 lifetime license and the fee for a lifetime license shall be
- 35 considered a donation to the Wildlife Endowment Fund. All
- 36 lifetime licenses shall be issued from the office of the
- 37 department. Each application for a lifetime license must be
- 38 accompanied by a certified copy of the birth certificate of the
- 39 individual to be named as the license holder, if the individual is
- 40 twelve (12) years of age or under.
- 41 (3) The commission shall establish proof of residency
- 42 requirements for the purchase of a lifetime license, and shall
- 43 also establish such restrictions on and regulations for lifetime
- 44 licenses as it deems necessary and proper. An applicant for a
- 45 resident lifetime license must have been domiciled in this state
- 46 for eighteen (18) consecutive months immediately preceding the
- 47 date of his application for a license. The burden of proving
- 48 domicile shall be on the applicant.
- 49 (4) (a) The department may issue a nonresident lifetime
- 50 sportsman license for a fee which shall be established by the
- 51 commission. The fee for such license shall not be less than Three
- 52 Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00).

- 53 (b) The department may issue a native son or daughter
- 54 nonresident lifetime sportsman license. The fee shall be One
- 55 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). The applicant must provide a
- 56 certified copy of the original birth certificate showing that the
- 57 applicant was born in Mississippi and/or if the parents' address
- 58 was in Mississippi at the time of birth as shown on the birth
- 59 certificate.
- 60 (5) Any materially false statement contained in an
- 61 application for a lifetime license renders void the license issued
- 62 pursuant to that application, and subjects the applicant to
- 63 criminal prosecution under Section 49-7-45.
- (6) Nothing in this section exempts an applicant for a
- 65 lifetime license from meeting other qualifications or requirements
- otherwise established by law for the privilege of hunting or
- 67 fishing.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 69 and after July 1, 2000.
