SENATE BILL NO. 2494 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 69-7-327, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE WORDS "KEEP REFRIGERATED" ON CONTAINERS OF EGGS; TO AMEND SECTION 69-7-329, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE 2 3 4 TEMPERATURE REQUIREMENTS FOR EGGS FOR MARKETING PURPOSES; AND FOR 5 RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 69-7-327, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 8 amended as follows:[BD1] 69-7-327. Any container or subcontainer in which eggs are 9 marketed to consumers shall bear on the outside portion of the 10 container, but shall not be limited to, the following: 11 (a) The applicable consumer grade provided for in this 12 13 article. 14 (b) The applicable size or weight class provided for in this article. 15 The word "eggs." 16 (C) (d) The numerical count of the contents. 17 The name and address of the producer, packer or 18 (e) distributor. 19 The date the eggs were graded applied legibly to 20 (f) 21 the carton or on the tape used to seal the carton. Such date shall be expressed as the consecutive day of the year. 22 23 (g) The words "keep refrigerated" or words of similar <u>meaning</u>. 2.4 Words and numerals used to designate the grade and size shall 25 be in clearly legible bold-faced type at least three-eighths (3/8) 26 inch in height. 27

SECTION 2. Section 69-7-329, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 32 amended as follows:[BD2] 33 34 69-7-329. Any person, business, cooperative, partnership, corporation or the like engaged in the marketing, processing, 35 transporting, storing, displaying for sale or selling of 36 37 eggs \* \* \* shall, in addition to maintaining <u>all such</u> egg handling facilities in a manner commensurate with laws governing food 38 establishments, keep the eggs at <u>an ambient</u> temperature <u>no greater</u> 39 than <u>forty-five (45)</u> degrees Fahrenheit \* \* \*. 40 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 41

42 and after July 1, 2000.
