## SENATE BILL NO. 2597

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-7-321, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO PROVIDE THAT SCHOOL DISTRICT SECURITY GUARDS OR RESOURCE 3 OFFICERS WITH POLICE POWER SHALL HAVE A MINIMUM LEVEL OF BASIC LAW 4 ENFORCEMENT TRAINING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-7-321, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: [RDD1] 37-7-321. (1) The school board of any school district 8 within the State of Mississippi may, in its discretion, employ one 9 10 or more persons as security personnel and shall be authorized to designate them as peace officers in or on any property operated 11 12 for school purposes by such board upon taking such oath and making 13 such bond as required of a constable of said county. Individuals employed or appointed within a school district as security guards, 14 15 school resource officers or who will have as their primary duty the powers of a peace officer shall receive, within two (2) years 16 17 of initial employment, a minimum level of basic law enforcement training as jointly determined and prescribed by the State Board 18 19 of Law Enforcement Training and Standards and the State Board of 20 Education. Individuals employed or appointed in said positions 21 who do not have as their primary duty the powers of a peace 22 officer shall be exempt from this requirement.

discretion, and subject to the approval of the Federal
