- TO PROVIDE FOR A COMMERCIAL GIG FISHING LICENSE; AND FOR RELATED 2
- 3 PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 49-15-80, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5
- amended as follows:[LTR1] 6
- 7 49-15-80. (1) (a) All vessels to be used in catching or
- 8 transporting fish in the waters of the State of Mississippi for
- 9 commercial purposes shall, before beginning operations, obtain an
- 10 annual license from the commission and pay a license fee according
- 11 to the following schedule:
- 12 (i) All resident vessels engaged in commercial
- hook and line fishing shall be issued a separate annual license by 13
- the commission at a fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). All 14
- 15 nonresident vessels engaged in commercial hook and line fishing
- shall be issued a separate annual license by the commission at a 16
- fee of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00). Each individual engaged in 17
- 18 commercial hook and line fishing must obtain a commercial hook and
- line fisherman license and pay the following license fees: One 19
- 20 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for a resident commercial hook and line
- 21 fisherman license; or Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) for a

- 22 nonresident commercial hook and line fisherman license. If a duly
- 23 licensed commercial hook and line vessel is engaged in commercial
- 24 fishing, each individual aboard must possess a commercial hook and
- 25 line fisherman license.
- 26 (ii) A resident fee of One Hundred Dollars
- 27 (\$100.00) or a nonresident fee of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00),
- 28 on boats using trammel nets, gill nets or seines not more than one
- 29 thousand two hundred (1,200) feet in length.
- 30 <u>(iii) All resident vessels engaged in commercial</u>
- 31 gig fishing shall be issued a separate annual license by the
- 32 <u>commission at a fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). All</u>
- 33 <u>nonresident vessels engaged in commercial gig fishing shall be</u>
- 34 <u>issued a separate annual license by the commission at a fee of</u>
- 35 Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00). Each individual engaged in
- 36 <u>commercial gig fishing must obtain a commercial gig fisherman</u>
- 37 <u>license subject to the following license fees: resident</u>
- 38 commercial gig fisherman license One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00); or
- 39 for a nonresident commercial gig fisherman license Four Hundred
- 40 Dollars (\$400.00). If a duly licensed commercial gig fishing
- 41 <u>vessel is engaged in commercial fishing, each individual aboard</u>
- 42 <u>must possess a commercial gig fisherman license.</u>
- (b) Beginning September 15, 1994, no nonresident shall
- 44 be issued a commercial fishing license under this chapter for the
- 45 taking of fish using any type of net if that nonresident's state
- 46 of domicile prohibits the issuing of commercial fishing licenses
- 47 to residents of this state to engage in like activity.
- 48 (2) Each factory or manufacturing establishment engaging in
- 49 the manufacture of oil, fish scrap, fish meal, fertilizer or other
- 50 products from menhaden, shall pay a license fee of Five Hundred
- 51 Dollars (\$500.00).
- 52 (3) Each boat or vessel engaging in the catching, taking or

- 53 transporting menhaden in the waters of the State of Mississippi,
- 54 the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and shall pay Fifty
- 55 Dollars (\$50.00) on each net, seine, trawl or purse net used in
- 56 catching or taking menhaden in the waters of the State of
- 57 Mississippi.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 59 and after July 1, 2000.
