SENATE BILL NO. 2728

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-9-73, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 CREATE THE CRIME OF FLEEING OR ELUDING A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER 3 IN A MOTOR VEHICLE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 97-9-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 97-9-73. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to obstruct or resist by force, or violence, or threats, or in any 8 9 other manner, his lawful arrest or the lawful arrest of another person by any state, local or federal law enforcement officer, and 10 any person or persons so doing shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, 11 12 and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not 13 more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not more than six (6) months, or both. 14

(2) The driver of a motor vehicle who is given a visible or 15 audible signal by a law enforcement officer by hand, voice, 16 emergency light or siren directing the driver to bring his motor 17 vehicle to a stop when such signal is given by a law enforcement 18 officer acting in the lawful performance of duty who has a 19 20 reasonable suspicion to believe that the driver in question has committed a crime, and who willfully fails to obey such direction, 21 22 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) 23 or imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed six (6) 24 months, or both. It shall not be unlawful for a person driving a 25 motor vehicle after dusk to proceed to the nearest well-lit public 26

30 this section by operating a motor vehicle in such a manner as to

31 <u>indicate a reckless or willful disregard for the safety of persons</u>

32 or property, or who so operates a motor vehicle in a manner

33 <u>manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life, shall</u>

34 be guilty of a felony, and upon conviction thereof, shall be

- 35 punished by a fine not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars
- 36 (\$5,000.00), or by commitment to the custody of the State
- 37 Department of Corrections for not more than five (5) years, or
- 38 <u>both.</u>

39 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

40 and after July 1, 2000.
