## SENATE BILL NO. 2745

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-23-147, Mississippi Code of 1972, 2 TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE AN ANNUAL 3 RECOGNITION PROGRAM FOR SCHOOLS FOR PROVIDING FULL INCLUSION OF 4 CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES IN ALL ASPECTS OF ACADEMIC AND 5 EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-23-147, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:[LR1]

37-23-147. (1) The State Department of Education shall 9 10 establish goals for the performance of children with disabilities that will promote the purpose of IDEA and are consistent, to the 11 maximum extent appropriate, with other goals and standards for 12 13 children established by the State Department of Education. 14 Performance indicators used to assess progress toward achieving those goals that, at a minimum, address the performance of 15 16 children with disabilities on assessments, drop-out rates, and graduation rates shall be developed. Every two (2) years, the 17 progress toward meeting the established performance goals shall be 18 reported to the public. 19 (2) In accordance with individuals with Disabilities 20 Education Act (IDEA) regulation 300.550, it is the policy of the 21 Mississippi Department of Education that each child with a 2.2 23 disability be educated with children having no disabilities in

24 <u>his/her age range to the maximum extent appropriate, including</u>

25 <u>children in public or private institutions or other care</u>

26 <u>facilities</u>. No special classes, separate schools or other removal

27 of children with disabilities from the regular educational

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environment shall occur unless the nature or severity of the 28 29 disability is such that education in regular classes with the use of supplementary aids and services cannot be achieved 30 satisfactorily. Students with disabilities are afforded an equal 31 32 opportunity to participate in nonacademic and extracurricular services and activities. Local school districts and other 33 agencies who provide special education and related services to 34 children with disabilities are required to adopt this policy and 35 the procedures necessary to implement it. 36 (3) To encourage the full inclusion of children with 37 disabilities in all aspects of academic and extracurricular 38 activities, the State Department of Education shall provide 39 40 special recognition to the schools receiving such designation and their school districts. Examples of such recognition may include, 41 but not be limited to: public announcements and events, 42 43 certificates of recognition and plaques for teachers, principals, superintendents and parents, and media announcements utilizing the 44 services of Mississippi Educational Television. This special 45 recognition shall be awarded to one (1) elementary, one (1) middle 46 47 school, and one (1) high school, based on entries submitted to the Mississippi Advisory Committee for Special Education by the 48 deadline of March 31. These entries shall be in the form of a 49 50 report, not to exceed five (5) pages, listing name, address and telephone number of the school district/school; teacher or staff 51 52 responsible for administering the program; type of position held by each of these employees including credentials; description of 53 the program; number of students with disabilities included; type 54 and level of severity of disabilities; number of students without 55 disabilities involved in the program; how long the program has 56 57 been in operation; benefit of program to all students; and a description of how this program could be replicated by other 58 school districts. Winners of the Exemplary Inclusion Program 59 contest shall be chosen by the Mississippi Advisory Committee for 60 Special Education in April of each year. 61 62 Recognition shall be given to these schools during the May Mississippi State Board of Education meeting each year. 63

67 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 68 and after July 1, 2000.
