SENATE BILL NO. 2745 (As Passed the Senate)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-23-147, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE AN ANNUAL 3 RECOGNITION PROGRAM FOR SCHOOLS FOR PROVIDING FULL INCLUSION OF CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES IN ALL ASPECTS OF ACADEMIC AND 4 EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-23-147, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:[LR1] 37-23-147. (1) The State Department of Education shall 9 establish goals for the performance of children with disabilities 10 that will promote the purpose of IDEA and are consistent, to the 11 maximum extent appropriate, with other goals and standards for 12 13 children established by the State Department of Education. 14 Performance indicators used to assess progress toward achieving those goals that, at a minimum, address the performance of 15 16 children with disabilities on assessments, drop-out rates, and graduation rates shall be developed. Every two (2) years, the 17 progress toward meeting the established performance goals shall be 18 reported to the public. 19 (2) To encourage the full inclusion of children with 20 21 disabilities in all aspects of academic and extracurricular activities, the State Department of Education shall provide 2.2 23 special recognition to the schools receiving such designation and their school districts. Examples of such recognition may include, 2.4 but not be limited to: public announcements and events, 25 certificates of recognition and plaques for teachers, principals, 26

27 <u>superintendents and parents, and media announcements utilizing the</u>

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services of Mississippi Educational Television. This special 28 recognition shall be awarded to one (1) elementary, one (1) middle 29 school, and one (1) high school, based on entries submitted to the 30 Mississippi Advisory Committee for Special Education by the 31 32 deadline of March 31. These entries shall be in the form of a report, not to exceed five (5) pages, listing name, address and 33 telephone number of the school district/school; teacher or staff 34 responsible for administering the program; type of position held 35 by each of these employees including credentials; description of 36 the program; number of students with disabilities included; type 37 and level of severity of disabilities; number of students without 38 disabilities involved in the program; how long the program has 39 been in operation; benefit of program to all students; and a 40 description of how this program could be replicated by other 41 school districts. Winners of the Exemplary Inclusion Program 42 43 contest shall be chosen by the Mississippi Advisory Committee for Special Education in April of each year. 44 Recognition shall be given to these schools during the May 45 Mississippi State Board of Education meeting each year. 46 47 Information on these exemplary programs shall be provided to other school districts and the general public through news releases, the 48 state department website, and other similar avenues. 49 50 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 51 and after July 1, 2000.
