SENATE BILL NO. 2860

1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS UNDER THE MINIMUM 2 EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYING SCHOOL GUIDANCE 3 COUNSELORS (K-12) BASED UPON SCHOOL STUDENT ENROLLMENT, TO PROVIDE 4 CERTAIN CONDITIONS ON THE EMPLOYMENT OF STATE-FUNDED SCHOOL GUIDANCE COUNSELORS AND TO PRESCRIBE THE COMPREHENSIVE COUNSELING 5 SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED TO INCLUDE CRISIS INTERVENTION AND 6 PREVENTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 9 SECTION 1. 29 the particular schools with the district shall be at the discretion of the local school board with the following 30 31 restrictions: The counselor/student ratio shall be no greater 32 (a) 33 than 1:250; No individual shall be employed as a school 34 (b) 35 guidance counselor without appropriate training and certification as determined by the State Department of Education; and 36 37 (c) School guidance counselors shall be full-time professional personnel, shall spend a minimum of eighty-five 38 percent (85%) of work time in direct counseling relationships with 39 40 students. State-funded school counselors shall provide the 41 (4) 42 following comprehensive counseling services: Academic and personal/social counseling; 43 (a) 44 (b) Student assessment and assessment counseling; 45 Career and educational counseling; (C) 46 (d) Individual and group counseling (large/small); 47 Crisis intervention and preventive counseling; (e) (f) Referrals to community agencies; 48 49 Educational consultation and collaboration with (g) teachers, administrators, parents and community leaders; 50 51 (h) Educational and career placement services; and 52 Follow-up counseling services. (i) Nothing in this section shall prohibit any school 53 (5) 54 district from employing with local funds more school guidance 55 counselors than are provided for in this section. (6) The State Department of Education may adopt regulations 56 regarding the activities of the school guidance counselor as are 57 58 not inconsistent with this section. 59 SECTION 2. All new programs authorized in this act are subject to the availability of funds specifically appropriated 60 61 therefor by the Legislature.
