1 2 3	AN ACT TO DEFINE THE COMPREHENSIVE COUNSELING SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY SCHOOL GUIDANCE COUNSELORS, TO INCLUDE CRISIS INTERVENTION AND PREVENTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. Beginning with the 2000-2001 school year the
6	assignment of K-12 school guidance counselors to the particular
7	schools within the district shall be at the discretion of the
8	local school board with the following restrictions:
9	(a) No individual shall be employed as a school
10	guidance counselor without appropriate training and certification
11	as determined by the State Department of Education; and
12	(b) School guidance counselors shall be full-time
13	professional personnel, shall spend a minimum of eighty-five
14	percent (85%) of work time in direct counseling relationships with
15	students.
16	(2) School guidance counselors shall provide the following
17	comprehensive counseling services:
18	(a) Academic and personal/social counseling;
19	(b) Student assessment and assessment counseling;
20	(c) Career and educational counseling;
21	(d) Individual and group counseling (large/small);
22	(e) Crisis intervention and preventive counseling;
23	(f) Referrals to community agencies;
24	(g) Educational consultations and collaboration with
25	teachers, administrators, parents, and community leaders;
26	(h) Educational and career placement services;

- 27 (i) Follow-up counseling services.
- 28 (3) The State Department of Education may adopt regulations
- 29 regarding the activities of the school guidance counselor as are
- 30 not inconsistent with this section.
- 31 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 32 and after July 1, 2000.
