SENATE BILL NO. 2924 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-37-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE DATE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND PREPARATION OF THE 3 STATEWIDE SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM STRATEGIC PLAN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 49-37-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:[CRG1] 49-37-9. (1) Before October 1, 2001, the Mississippi 8 Scientific Information Management System Coordinating Council 9 10 shall develop and prepare a strategic plan for the development and implementation of a statewide scientific information management 11 12 system. (2) The strategic plan shall include, but not be limited to, 13 the following: 14 15 (a) A detailed analysis of the sources, types, amounts and methods by which scientific information is currently collected 16 17 in the state and of methods or systems currently used to manage that scientific information; 18 (b) An identification of the current costs of 19 20 collection, management, analysis, updating, use and dissemination of scientific information in the state with particular emphasis on 21 22 costs to state agencies; (c) A description of current efforts by agencies and 23 24 organizations collecting scientific information to provide broad 25 access to that information; (d) An identification of planned scientific information 26 management programs and needs and an evaluation of how those 27

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planned programs or needs may be met or integrated into the 28 29 statewide scientific information management system; (e) A clearly-defined, comprehensive statement of the 30 31 mission, goals and objectives of the statewide scientific 32 information management system; A detailed analysis of the benefits and 33 (f) capabilities of a statewide scientific information management 34 35 system; (g) A plan for the development and implementation of a 36 statewide scientific information management system in a phased 37 38 manner; A timeline for the development and implementation 39 (h) 40 of a statewide scientific information management system; A detailed analysis and estimate of the costs for 41 (i) development and implementation of the statewide scientific 42 information management system and a recommended method for funding 43 the development and implementation of the system; and 44 45 (j) Any other information the coordinating council 46 deems appropriate. 47 In addition, the strategic plan shall recommend (3) appropriate policies and standards for use in management of 48 scientific information and for providing access to that 49 information. The strategic plan shall also address information 50 accuracy and quality issues, ease of access issues, training and 51 52 technical support issues and interagency coordination issues. 53 (4) Upon completion of the strategic plan, the coordinating 54 council shall provide copies to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the 55 56 Chairmen of the Senate Environmental Protection, Conservation and 57 Water Resources Committee and the Senate Appropriations Committee, the Chairmen of the House Conservation and Water Resources 58 59 Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, the Legislative Budget Office, the Performance Evaluation and Expenditure Review 60 61 Committee and the Legislative Reference Bureau. 62 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

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and after its passage.

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
