SENATE BILL NO. 2958

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 67-1-71, 87-1-5, 97-33-1, 97-33-7, 97-33-17, 97-33-25 AND 97-33-27, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 3 CLARIFY THE WATERS UPON WHICH GAMING ABOARD CRUISE VESSELS IS ALLOWED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 67-1-71, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: 67-1-71. The commission may revoke or suspend any permit 8 issued by it for a violation by the permittee of any of the 9 10 provisions of this chapter or of the regulations promulgated under it by the commission. 11 12 Permits must be revoked or suspended for the following 13 causes: (a) Conviction of the permittee for the violation of 14 15 any of the provisions of this chapter; (b) Willful failure or refusal by any permittee to 16 17 comply with any of the provisions of this chapter or of any rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto; 18 (c) The making of any materially false statement in any 19 20 application for a permit; 21 (d) Conviction of one or more of the clerks, agents or employees of the permittee, of any violation of this chapter upon 22 the premises covered by such permit within a period of time as 23 24 designated by the rules or regulations of the commission; 25 (e) The possession on the premises of any retail 26 permittee of any alcoholic beverages upon which the tax has not been paid; 27

28 (f) The willful failure of any permittee to keep the 29 records or make the reports required by this chapter, or to allow 30 an inspection of such records by any duly authorized person;

(g) The suspension or revocation of a permit issued to 32 the permittee by the federal government, or conviction of violating any federal law relating to alcoholic beverages; 33

34 The failure to furnish any bond required by this (h) chapter within fifteen (15) days after notice from the commission; 35 36 and

37 (i) The conducting of any form of illegal gambling on the premises of any permittee or on any premises connected 38 39 therewith or the presence on any such premises of any gambling device with the knowledge of the permittee. 40

The provisions of item (i) of this section shall not apply to 41 gambling or the presence of any gambling devices, with knowledge 42 43 of the permittee,

44 (a) On board a cruise vessel in the waters within the State of Mississippi, which lie adjacent to the State of 45 Mississippi south of the three (3) most southern counties in the 46 47 State of Mississippi, which are not man-made water bottoms, or 48 rivers, creeks, bayous or other naturally occurring bodies of water other than: 49

(i) The Back Bay of Biloxi east of a straight line 50 51 drawn from the point at which the western city limits of the City of D'Iberville intersect the north shore of the Back Bay of Biloxi 52 53 to the point at which Interstate I-110 crosses the south shore of 54 the Back Bay of Biloxi;

(ii) St. Louis Bay; or

56

(iii) The Mississippi Sound; or

57 (b) On any vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 58 whenever such vessel is on the Mississippi River or navigable waters within any county bordering on the Mississippi River. 59 60 The commission may, in its discretion, issue on-premises

61 retailer's permits to a common carrier of the nature described in 62 this paragraph.

No permit shall be revoked except after a hearing by the commission with reasonable notice to the permittee and an opportunity for him to appear and defend.

In addition to the causes specified in this section and other 66 67 provisions of this chapter, the commission shall be authorized to suspend the permit of any permit holder for being out of 68 69 compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section 70 93-11-153. The procedure for suspension of a permit for being out of compliance with an order for support, and the procedure for the 71 72 reissuance or reinstatement of a permit suspended for that 73 purpose, and the payment of any fees for the reissuance or 74 reinstatement of a permit suspended for that purpose, shall be governed by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be. 75 76 If there is any conflict between any provision of Section 77 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 and any provision of this chapter, the provisions of Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be, 78 79 shall control.

80 SECTION 2. Section 87-1-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 81 amended as follows:

If any person, by playing at any game whatever, or 82 87-1-5. 83 by betting on the sides or hands of such as do play at any game, 84 or by betting on any horse race or cockfight, or at any other sport or pastime, or by any wager whatever, shall lose any money, 85 86 property or other valuable thing, real or personal, and shall pay 87 or deliver the same or any part thereof, the person so losing and paying or delivering the same, or his wife or children, may sue 88 for and recover such money, property or other valuable thing so 89 90 lost and paid or delivered, or any part thereof, from the person 91 knowingly receiving the same, with costs. However, this section shall not apply to betting, gaming or wagering: 92

(a) On a cruise vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1

94 whenever such vessel is in the waters within the State of

95 Mississippi, which lie adjacent to the State of Mississippi south

96 of the three (3) most southern counties in the State of

97 Mississippi, which are not man-made water bottoms, or rivers,

98 <u>creeks</u>, bayous or other naturally occurring bodies of water other
99 <u>than</u>:

100 (i) The Back Bay of Biloxi east of a straight line 101 drawn from the point at which the western city limits of the City 102 of D'Iberville intersect the north shore of the Back Bay of Biloxi 103 to the point at which Interstate I-110 crosses the south shore of 104 the Back Bay of Biloxi;

<u>(iii) The Mississippi Sound</u>;

(ii) St. Louis Bay; or

107 (b) On a vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 whenever 108 such vessel is on the Mississippi River or navigable waters within 109 any county bordering on the Mississippi River; or

110 (c) That is legal under the laws of the State of 111 Mississippi.

SECTION 3. Section 97-33-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

114 97-33-1. If any person shall encourage, promote or play at any game, play or amusement, other than a fight or fighting match 115 116 between dogs, for money or other valuable thing, or shall wager or 117 bet, promote or encourage the wagering or betting of any money or 118 other valuable things, upon any game, play, amusement, cockfight, 119 Indian ball play, or duel, other than a fight or fighting match between dogs, or upon the result of any election, event or 120 contingency whatever, upon conviction thereof, he shall be fined 121 122 in a sum not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00); and, unless such fine and costs be immediately paid, shall be imprisoned for 123 124 any period not more than ninety (90) days. However, this section shall not apply to betting, gaming or wagering: 125

6 (a) On a cruise vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1

127 whenever such vessel is in the waters within the State of Mississippi, which lie adjacent to the State of Mississippi south 128 129 of the three (3) most southern counties in the State of 130 Mississippi, which are not man-made water bottoms, or rivers, 131 creeks, bayous or other naturally occurring bodies of water other than (i) the Back Bay of Biloxi east of a straight line drawn from 132 the point at which the western city limits of the City of 133 134 D'Iberville intersect the north shore of the Back Bay of Biloxi to the point at which Interstate I-110 crosses the south shore of the 135 136 Back Bay of Biloxi, (ii) St. Louis Bay, or (iii) the Mississippi Sound, and in which the registered voters of the county in which 137 138 the port is located have not voted to prohibit such betting, 139 gaming or wagering on cruise vessels as provided in Section 140 19-3-79;

(b) On a vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 whenever such vessel is on the Mississippi River or navigable waters within any county bordering on the Mississippi River, and in which the registered voters of the county in which the port is located have not voted to prohibit such betting, gaming or wagering on vessels as provided in Section 19-3-79; or

147 (c) That is legal under the laws of the State of148 Mississippi.

SECTION 4. Section 97-33-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

97-33-7. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person or 151 152 persons, firm, copartnership, or corporation to have in 153 possession, own, control, display, or operate any cane rack, knife rack, artful dodger, punch board, roll down, merchandise wheel, 154 155 slot machine, pinball machine, or similar device or devices. Provided, however, that this section shall not be so construed as 156 157 to make unlawful the ownership, possession, control, display or 158 operation of any antique coin machine as defined in Section 159 27-27-12, or any music machine or bona fide automatic vending

160 machine where the purchaser receives exactly the same quantity of 161 merchandise on each operation of said machine. Any slot machine 162 other than an antique coin machine as defined in Section 27-27-12 163 which delivers, or is so constructed as that by operation thereof 164 it will deliver to the operator thereof anything of value in 165 varying quantities, in addition to the merchandise received, and any slot machine other than an antique coin machine as defined in 166 167 Section 27-27-12 that is constructed in such manner as that slugs, tokens, coins or similar devices are, or may be, used and 168 169 delivered to the operator thereof in addition to merchandise of any sort contained in such machine, is hereby declared to be a 170 171 gambling device, and shall be deemed unlawful under the provisions 172 of this section. Provided, however, that pinball machines which 173 do not return to the operator or player thereof anything but free additional games or plays shall not be deemed to be gambling 174 175 devices, and neither this section nor any other law shall be 176 construed to prohibit same.

(2) No property right shall exist in any person, natural or 177 178 artificial, or be vested in such person, in any or all of the 179 devices described herein that are not exempted from the provisions 180 of this section; and all such devices are hereby declared to be at all times subject to confiscation and destruction, and their 181 possession shall be unlawful, except when in the possession of 182 183 officers carrying out the provisions of this section. It shall be the duty of all law-enforcing officers to seize and immediately 184 185 destroy all such machines and devices.

(3) A first violation of the provisions of this section
shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and the party offending shall, upon
conviction, be fined in any sum not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars
(\$500.00), or imprisoned not exceeding three (3) months, or both,
in the discretion of the court. In the event of a second
conviction for a violation of any of the provisions of this
section, the party offending shall be subject to a sentence of not

193 less than six (6) months in the county jail, nor more than two (2) 194 years in the State Penitentiary, in the discretion of the trial 195 court.

196 (4) Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the 197 contrary, it shall not be unlawful to operate any equipment or 198 device described in subsection (1) of this section or any gaming, 199 gambling or similar device or devices by whatever name called 200 while:

On a cruise vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 201 (a) 202 whenever such vessel is in the waters within the State of 203 Mississippi, which lie adjacent to the State of Mississippi south 204 of the three (3) most southern counties in the State of 205 Mississippi, which are not man-made water bottoms, or rivers, creeks, bayous or other naturally occurring bodies of water other 206 207 than (i) the Back Bay of Biloxi east of a straight line drawn from 208 the point at which the western city limits of the City of 209 D'Iberville intersect the north shore of the Back Bay of Biloxi to the point at which Interstate I-110 crosses the south shore of the 210 211 Back Bay of Biloxi, (ii) St. Louis Bay, or (iii) the Mississippi Sound, and in which the registered voters of the county in which 212 213 the port is located have not voted to prohibit such betting, 214 gaming or wagering on cruise vessels as provided in Section 19-3-79; 215

(b) On a vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 whenever such vessel is on the Mississippi River or navigable waters within any county bordering on the Mississippi River, and in which the registered voters of the county in which the port is located have not voted to prohibit such betting, gaming or wagering on vessels as provided in Section 19-3-79; or

(c) That is legal under the laws of the State ofMississippi.

(5) Notwithstanding any provision of this section to thecontrary, it shall not be unlawful (a) to own, possess, repair or

226 control any gambling device, machine or equipment on board any cruise vessel in this state of not less than one hundred fifty 227 228 (150) feet in overall length or vessel in this state of not less than one hundred fifty (150) feet in overall length or on the 229 230 business premises appurtenant to any such cruise vessel or vessel during any period of time in which such cruise vessel or vessel is 231 232 being constructed, repaired, maintained or operated in this state; 233 (b) to install any gambling device, machine or equipment on board 234 any cruise vessel in this state of not less than one hundred fifty 235 (150) feet in overall length or vessel in this state of not less than one hundred fifty (150) feet in overall length; (c) to 236 237 possess or control any gambling device, machine or equipment 238 during the process of procuring or transporting such device, 239 machine or equipment for installation on any such cruise vessel or 240 vessel; or (d) to store in a warehouse or other storage facility 241 any gambling device, machine, equipment, or part thereof, 242 regardless of whether the county or municipality in which the warehouse or storage facility is located has approved gaming 243 244 aboard cruise vessels or vessels, provided that such device, 245 machine or equipment is operated only in a county or municipality 246 that has approved gaming aboard cruise vessels or vessels. Anv 247 gambling device, machine or equipment that is owned, possessed, controlled, installed, procured, repaired, transported or stored 248 249 in accordance with this subsection shall not be subject to 250 confiscation, seizure or destruction, and any person, firm, 251 partnership or corporation which owns, possesses, controls, installs, procures, repairs, transports or stores any gambling 252 253 device, machine or equipment in accordance with this subsection 254 shall not be subject to any prosecution or penalty under this 255 section. Any person constructing or repairing such cruise vessels 256 or vessels within a municipality shall comply with all municipal ordinances protecting the general health or safety of the 257 258 residents of the municipality.

259 SECTION 5. Section 97-33-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 260 amended as follows:

261 97-33-17. (1) All monies exhibited for the purpose of 262 betting or alluring persons to bet at any game, and all monies 263 staked or betted, shall be liable to seizure by any sheriff, 264 constable, or police officer, together with all the appliances 265 used or kept for use in gambling, or by any other person; and all 266 the monies so seized shall be accounted for by the person making 267 the seizure, and all appliances seized shall be destroyed; 268 provided, however, this section shall not apply to betting, gaming 269 or wagering on:

(a) A cruise vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 270 271 whenever such vessel is in the waters within the State of Mississippi, which lie adjacent to the State of Mississippi south 272 273 of the three (3) most southern counties in the State of 274 Mississippi, which are not man-made water bottoms, or rivers, 275 creeks, bayous or other naturally occurring bodies of water other than (i) the Back Bay of Biloxi east of a straight line drawn from 276 277 the point at which the western city limits of the City of 278 D'Iberville intersect the north shore of the Back Bay of Biloxi to the point at which Interstate I-110 crosses the south shore of the 279 Back Bay of Biloxi, (ii) St. Louis Bay, or (iii) the Mississippi 280 281 Sound, and in which the registered voters of the county in which 282 the port is located have not voted to prohibit such betting, 283 gaming or wagering on cruise vessels as provided in Section 19 - 3 - 79;284

(b) A vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 whenever such vessel is on the Mississippi River or navigable waters within any county bordering on the Mississippi River, and in which the registered voters of the county in which the port is located have not voted to prohibit such betting, gaming or wagering on vessels as provided in Section 19-3-79; or

291

(c) That is legal under the laws of the State of

292 Mississippi.

(2) Nothing in this section shall apply to any gambling
device, machine or equipment that is owned, possessed, controlled,
installed, procured, repaired or transported in accordance with
subsection (4) of Section 97-33-7.

297 SECTION 6. Section 97-33-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 298 amended as follows:

97-33-25. If any person shall sell or buy, either directly or indirectly, any chance in what is commonly called pool, upon any event whatever, or shall in any manner engage in such business or pastime, he shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or shall be imprisoned in the county jail not more than ninety (90) days; provided, however, this section shall not apply to betting, gaming or wagering:

On a cruise vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 306 (a) 307 whenever such vessel is in the waters within the State of 308 Mississippi, which lie adjacent to the State of Mississippi south of the three (3) most southern counties in the State of 309 310 Mississippi, which are not man-made water bottoms, or rivers, 311 creeks, bayous or other naturally occurring bodies of water other 312 than (i) the Back Bay of Biloxi east of a straight line drawn from the point at which the western city limits of the City of 313 D'Iberville intersect the north shore of the Back Bay of Biloxi to 314 315 the point at which Interstate I-110 crosses the south shore of the Back Bay of Biloxi, (ii) St. Louis Bay, or (iii) the Mississippi 316 317 Sound, and in which the registered voters of the county in which 318 the port is located have not voted to prohibit such betting, 319 gaming or wagering on cruise vessels as provided in Section 320 19-3-79;

321 (b) On a vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 whenever 322 such vessel is on the Mississippi River or navigable waters within 323 any county bordering on the Mississippi River, and in which the 324 registered voters of the county in which the port is located have

325 not voted to prohibit such betting, gaming or wagering on vessels 326 as provided in Section 19-3-79; or

327 (c) That is legal under the laws of the State of328 Mississippi.

329 SECTION 7. Section 97-33-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 330 amended as follows:

331 97-33-27. If any person shall bet on a horse race or a yacht 332 race or on a shooting match, he shall be fined not more than Five 333 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), and, unless the fine and costs be 334 immediately paid, he shall be imprisoned in the county jail not 335 more than ninety (90) days; provided, however, this section shall 336 not apply to betting, gaming or wagering:

(a) On a cruise vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 337 whenever such vessel is in the waters within the State of 338 Mississippi, which lie adjacent to the State of Mississippi south 339 340 of the three (3) most southern counties in the State of 341 Mississippi, which are not man-made water bottoms, or rivers, creeks, bayous or other naturally occurring bodies of water other 342 343 than (i) the Back Bay of Biloxi east of a straight line drawn from 344 the point at which the western city limits of the City of 345 D'Iberville intersect the north shore of the Back Bay of Biloxi to the point at which Interstate I-110 crosses the south shore of the 346 Back Bay of Biloxi, (ii) St. Louis Bay, or (iii) the Mississippi 347 348 Sound, and in which the registered voters of the county in which the port is located have not voted to prohibit such betting, 349 350 gaming or wagering on cruise vessels as provided in Section 351 19-3-79;

352 (b) On a vessel as defined in Section 27-109-1 whenever 353 such vessel is on the Mississippi River or navigable waters within 354 any county bordering on the Mississippi River, and in which the 355 registered voters of the county in which the port is located have 356 not voted to prohibit such betting, gaming or wagering on vessels 357 as provided in Section 19-3-79; or

358 (c) That is legal under the laws of the State of 359 Mississippi.

360 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 361 and after its passage.
