SENATE BILL NO. 3048

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE METHOD OF CALCULATION FOR THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF COUNTY 3 SHERIFFS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:[JMR1]

25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
(2) through (9), the salaries of sheriffs of the various counties
are hereby fixed as full compensation for their services.

From and after October 1, 1998, the annual salary for each sheriff shall be based upon the total population of his county according to the latest federal decennial census in the following categories and for the following amounts; however, no sheriff shall be paid less than the salary authorized under this section to be paid the sheriff based upon the population of the county according to the 1980 federal decennial census:

17 (a) For counties with a total population of <u>less</u> than
18 <u>twenty-five thousand (25,000)</u>, a salary of <u>Sixty-five Thousand</u>
19 <u>Dollars (\$65,000.00)</u>.

(b) For counties with a total population of more than
<u>twenty-five thousand (25,000)</u> and not more than <u>seventy-five</u>
<u>thousand (75,000)</u>, a salary of <u>Eighty Thousand Dollars</u>
<u>(\$80,000.00)</u>.

(c) For counties with a total population of more than
 <u>seventy-five thousand (75,000)</u>, a salary of <u>Ninety-five Thousand</u>
 <u>Dollars (\$95,000.00)</u>.

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In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 28 (2) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County may, 29 in its discretion, pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 30 31 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars 32 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 33 county for the following reasons: 34 35 The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates (a)

and maintains a restitution center within the county;(b) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates

38 and maintains a community work center within the county;
39 (c) There is a resident circuit court judge in the

40 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;41 (d) There is a resident chancery court judge in the

42 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;

43 (e) The Magistrate for the Fourth Circuit Court
44 District is located in the county and maintains his office at the
45 Leflore County Courthouse;

46 (f) The Region VI Mental Health-Mental Retardation
47 Center, which serves a multicounty area, calls upon the sheriff to
48 provide security for out-of-town mental patients, as well as
49 patients from within the county;

50 (g) The increased activity of the Child Support 51 Division of the Department of Human Services in enforcing in the 52 courts parental obligations has imposed additional duties on the 53 sheriff; and

54 (h) The dispatchers of the enhanced E-911 system in 55 place in Leflore County has been placed under the direction and 56 control of the sheriff.

(3) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County may, in
its discretion, pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
(\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
county for the following reasons:

64 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
65 and maintains the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility within
66 the county;

67 (b) The State Hospital is operated and maintained68 within the county at Whitfield;

69 (c) Hudspeth Regional Center, a facility maintained for 70 the care and treatment of the mentally retarded, is located within 71 the county;

72 (d) The Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Training73 Academy is operated and maintained within the county;

74 (e) The State Fire Academy is operated and maintained75 within the county;

(f) The Pearl River Valley Water Supply District, ordinarily known as the "Reservoir District," is located within the county;

79 (g) The Jackson International Airport is located within 80 the county;

81 (h) The patrolling of the state properties located
82 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff;
83 and

84 (i) The sheriff, in addition to providing security to
85 the nearly one hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county,
86 has the duty to investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution
87 of any misdemeanor or felony committed upon any state property
88 located in Rankin County.

(4) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall
pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount
equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

93 (5) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 94 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County may, in 95 their discretion, pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 96 county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00),

97 payable beginning April 1, 1997.

In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 98 (6) 99 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount 100 101 equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature 102 finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this 103 subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons: 104 (a) Hinds County has the greatest population of any 105 county, two hundred fifty-four thousand four hundred forty-one 106 (254,441) by the 1990 census, being almost one hundred thousand 107 (100,000) more than the next most populous county; 108 (b) Hinds County is home to the state capitol and the seat of all state government offices; 109 110 (c) Hinds County is the third largest county in geographic area, containing eight hundred seventy-five (875) 111 112 square miles; 113 Hinds County is comprised of two (2) judicial (d) districts, each having a courthouse and county office buildings; 114 115 There are four (4) resident circuit judges, four (e) (4) resident chancery judges, and three (3) resident county judges 116 117 in Hinds County, the most of any county, with the sheriff acting 118 as chief executive officer and provider of bailiff services for 119 all; 120 (f) The main offices for the clerk and most of the judges and magistrates for the United States District Court for 121 122 the Southern District of Mississippi are located within the 123 county; The state's only urban university, Jackson State 124 (g) 125 University, is located within the county; 126 (h) The University of Mississippi Medical Center, 127 combining the medical school, dental school, nursing school and hospital, is located within the county; 128

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(i) Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium, the state's

130 largest sports arena, is located within the county;

(j) The Mississippi State Fairgrounds, including theColiseum and Trade Mart, are located within the county;

(k) Hinds County has the largest criminal population in the state, such that the Hinds County Sheriff's Department operates the largest county jail system in the state, housing almost one thousand (1,000) inmates in three (3) separate detention facilities;

(1) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department handles more
mental and drug and alcohol commitments cases than any other
sheriff's department in the state;

141 (m) The Mississippi Department of Corrections maintains142 a restitution center within the county;

(n) The Mississippi Department of Corrections regularly
houses as many as one hundred (100) state convicts within the
Hinds County jail system; and

(o) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department is regularly
asked to provide security services not only at the Fairgrounds and
Memorial Stadium, but also for events at the Mississippi Museum of
Art and Jackson City Auditorium.

150 (7) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 151 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Wilkinson County, in 152 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 153 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 154 155 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts 156 157 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 158 correctional facility within the county.

(8) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars

163 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 164 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 165 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts 166 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 167 correctional facility within the county.

168 In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of (9) 169 this section, the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 170 171 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars 172 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 173 174 county for the following reasons:

(a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
and maintains the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
the county;

(b) In 1996, additional facilities to house another one thousand four hundred sixteen (1,416) male offenders were constructed at the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within the county; and

182 (c) The patrolling of the state properties located
183 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff
184 justifying additional compensation.

185 (10) The salaries herein provided shall be payable monthly 186 on the first day of each calendar month by chancery clerk's warrant drawn on the general fund of the county; however, the 187 188 board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on 189 its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid 190 semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If a 191 pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or 192 193 legal holiday.

194 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 195 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,

196 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 197 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States 198 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the 199 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 200 extended.

201 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 202 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 203 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, or October 1, 2000, 204 whichever occurs later.
