COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 3073

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-22-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
PROVIDE THAT SECOND LEVEL FUNDING PROGRAM FUNDS IN ADDITION TO
MINIMUM EDUCATION PROGRAM FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE TO NEWLY ESTABLISHED
REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CENTERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 37-22-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

7 amended as follows:[RDD1]

37-22-3. There is herein provided a Second Level Funding 8 Program which shall qualify any school district within a county 9 10 wherein there is only one (1) school district located for additional state funding on an annual basis. The nonparticipation 11 of any line consolidated school district to conform their district 12 13 administration to receive second level funding under the provisions of this section shall not prohibit the participation of 14 15 any other school districts located within any of the affected counties in such funding program. In the event the board of 16 17 trustees of a line consolidated school district elects to participate in second level funding, it shall merge its 18 administration with the county in which the majority of its 19 20 facilities are located. The State Board of Education shall designate the county in which the majority of such line 21 22 consolidated district facilities are located in accordance with its established inventory of school district facilities. 23 The 24 school boards in any such county having only one (1) school 25 district on July 1, 1989, and the school boards in any county having more than one (1) school district which hereafter adopts a 26 plan for the transition of all administrative functions into one 27

(1) school district for such county, shall qualify for this Second 28 29 Level Funding Program. Any uniform millage assistance grant received by an agricultural high school shall not affect the 30 granting of second level funding grants to any school district 31 32 under the provisions of this section; and any agricultural high school located in such school district shall also be eligible for 33 such second level funding grants. The state funds available to 34 such school district for the Second Level Funding Program shall be 35 Thirty-six Dollars (\$36.00) per pupil in average daily attendance. 36 The total state funds needed for the Second Level Funding Program 37 annually shall be the total of the amounts needed by all of the 38 school districts in the state having one (1) school district 39 40 within the county. Second Level Funding Program funds shall also be available to any two (2) or more school districts within a 41 county which jointly establish a regional high school center 42 pursuant to Section 37-7-417, Mississippi Code of 1972. In order 43 44 to qualify for additional state funds under this provision, the newly established regional high school shall be the only high 45 school in operation in the county. The State Second Level Funding 46 47 Program Fund is hereby established in the State Treasury which shall be used to distribute the funds to school districts entitled 48 under the provisions of this section. Any such funds shall be 49 transferred to the school district maintenance fund of such 50 district in the manner prescribed in Section 37-19-47, Mississippi 51 52 Code of 1972, and shall be expended in the manner provided by law for classroom instructional purposes. 53

54 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 55 and after July 1, 2000.
