SENATE BILL NO. 3108

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI MILITARY LICENSE TAG DESIGN 2 APPROVAL COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF SUCH 3 COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMITTEE SHALL APPROVE THE DESIGN 4 OF CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE TAGS PRIOR TO THE MANUFACTURE OF 5 SUCH TAGS; TO AMEND SECTIONS 27-19-51, 27-19-53, 27-19-54, 6 27-19-56.5, 27-19-56.12 AND 27-19-56.13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 7 IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is hereby established the Mississippi 10 Military License Tag Design Approval Committee. The committee shall be composed of the Adjutant General and members appointed by 11 the Adjutant General who shall be active and retired members from 12 each branch of the United States Armed Forces, including the 13 National Guard and Reserves. No motor vehicle license tags shall 14 15 be issued pursuant to Sections 27-19-51, 27-19-53, 27-19-54, 27-19-56.5, 27-19-56.12 and 27-19-56.13 unless the committee 16 17 approves the design of such tags before they are manufactured. (2) The committee shall meet when necessary upon 18 notification of the Adjutant General to approve or disapprove of 19 the design of motor vehicle license tags issued pursuant to 20 Sections 27-19-51, 27-19-53, 27-19-54, 27-19-56.5, 27-19-56.12 and 21 22 27-19-56.13. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the committee and decisions of the committee shall be by a majority 23 24 vote of those present and voting. 25 (3) The committee shall not approve any design which contains the color yellow or which does not contain the colors 26 red, white and blue. 27

28 SECTION 2. Section 27-19-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

29 amended as follows:[WAN1]

(1) In recognition of their many and varied 30 27-19-51. patriotic services rendered the state, the United States and the 31 citizens thereof, Mississippians who have completed an active duty 32 career with the Armed Forces of the United States and active duty 33 and retired members of the Army National Guard, Air National Guard 34 35 of Mississippi, and the United States Reserves, including both enlisted and officer personnel, upon application and subject to 36 37 the provisions of this section may be issued distinctive motor vehicle license plates or tags identifying these persons with such 38 39 organizations. For the purposes of this section the term "Armed 40 Forces" includes the United States Merchant Marines and members 41 thereof in maritime service during the period from December 7, 1941 to August 15, 1945. The distinctive plates or tags so issued 42 shall comply with the provisions of Section 27-19-41 and shall be 43 44 of such color and design as may be agreed upon by the Mississippi 45 Military License Tag Design Approval Committee and the State Tax Commission for the Army National Guard or Air National Guard, by 46 47 the Mississippi chapters of the Retired Officers Association and the Retired Non-Commissioned Officers Association and the State 48 49 Tax Commission for retired active duty members of the Armed Forces of the United States, and by the State Tax Commission for retired 50 51 members of the United States Merchant Marines. Each distinctive license plate shall bear the words "National Guard" or the name of 52 53 the appropriate armed service and need not bear prefixed numbers 54 identifying the county of issuance.

55 (2) The surviving spouse of any person who was issued a 56 distinctive license plate or tag under subsection (1) of this 57 section because of completion of an active duty career with the 58 Armed Forces of the United States or because of retirement from 59 the Army National Guard, Air National Guard or United States 60 Reserves, or any prisoner of war issued a distinctive license 61 plate or tag under Section 27-19-54, shall be eligible to receive

62 the same type of distinctive license plate or tag which the 63 deceased spouse was issued.

64 The distinctive license plates here provided for shall (3) be prepared by the State Tax Commission and shall be issued 65 through the tax collectors of the several counties of the state in 66 like manner as are other motor vehicle license plates or tags and 67 such officers shall be entitled to their regular fees for such 68 service. Applicants for such distinctive plates shall present to 69 70 the issuing official proof of their membership in the Army 71 National Guard, Air National Guard of Mississippi, or United States Reserves by means of certificate signed by the commanding 72 73 officer of such applicant on forms prescribed by the Adjutant General of Mississippi. Retired members of the Armed Forces of 74 75 the United States applying for such plates shall present to the issuing officials a copy of their active duty retirement orders or 76 77 other proof of retirement from active service with one of the 78 Armed Forces of the United States. The distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be used only upon and for personally or 79 80 jointly owned private passenger vehicles (to include station 81 wagons, recreational motor vehicles and pickup trucks) registered 82 in the name, or jointly in the name, of the member making application therefor, and when so issued to such applicant shall 83 84 be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard 85 license plate or license tag normally issued for such vehicle.

In addition to use of such distinctive license plates or 86 (4) 87 tags on such personally or jointly owned vehicles, such 88 distinctive plate or tag may be used on state-owned vehicles 89 operated by the State Military Department provided the prefix "MNG" is placed ahead of the number thereon. Motor vehicles for 90 91 which such distinctive license plates or tags are issued shall be 92 registered by the proper official as are other motor vehicles. 93 The distinctive license plates issued hereunder shall (5) 94 not be transferable between motor vehicle owners; and in the event

95 the owner of a vehicle bearing such distinctive plate shall sell, 96 trade, exchange or otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate 97 shall be retained by the owner to whom issued and returned by the 98 owner to the tax collector of the county or the State Tax 99 Commission, as the case may be.

100 The Adjutant General is authorized to recognize not more (6) than one hundred (100) senior staff officers, commanders, command 101 sergeants major and senior enlisted advisors by designating the 102 103 issue of National Guard distinctive license plates or tags 104 numbered "1" through "100." These license plates or tags shall be retained by the individual so designated and may be transferred 105 106 between vehicles or individuals under procedures established by 107 the State Tax Commission. The Adjutant General is responsible for 108 furnishing the State Tax Commission necessary information to effect issue or transfer of these specially numbered license 109 110 plates or tags.

(7) National Guard plates or tags shall be prepared and furnished for the licensing year commencing November 1, 1962, and annually thereafter. The Adjutant General shall furnish the State Tax Commission with an estimate of the number of such distinctive plates or tags required in each of the several counties of the state.

(8) The provisions of this section are supplementary to the laws of this state pertaining to the licensing of motor vehicles and nothing herein shall be construed as abridging or repealing any of such laws.

121 SECTION 3. Section 27-19-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 122 amended as follows:[WAN2]

123 27-19-53. (1) Any legal resident of the State of 124 Mississippi who is a veteran of service in the Armed Forces of the 125 United States, and who is rated as having one hundred percent 126 (100%) permanent service-connected disability by the Veterans' 127 Administration is privileged to purchase annually one (1) motor

vehicle license plate or tag in his or her county of legal residence, for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) in total cost, regardless of make or model of motor vehicle. The registration year of such motor vehicle shall commence the first day of the month in which application for registration is made, as provided in Section 27-19-31.

134 (a) Not more than one (1) such motor vehicle license135 plate or tag shall be issued to each such qualified veteran.

(b) This section pertains only to taxes or plates forprivate passenger motor vehicles or pickup trucks.

138 (c) Proof of ownership of each particular motor vehicle
139 for which a license plate or tag is requested must be shown at
140 time of application for such plate or tag.

(d) Vehicles owned by such veterans are hereby exempt 141 142 from all ad valorem and privilege taxes; however, the surviving 143 spouse of a deceased person who was issued a license plate or tag 144 under this section shall be entitled to apply for or retain a license issued under this section and may continue annually to 145 146 renew registration for one (1) motor vehicle license plate or tag 147 under this section for as long as the spouse remains unmarried. At 148 the time of application or renewal registration, a surviving 149 spouse who desires to retain the distinctive plate or tag issued 150 under this section shall file with the county tax collector a 151 sworn statement that the spouse is unmarried. Any such vehicle when so registered shall be exempt from all ad valorem and 152 153 privilege taxes.

154 (2) The State Tax Commission is directed to furnish each 155 veteran obtaining a license tag under subsection (1) an emblem, 156 which the veteran shall attach securely to the tag, showing that 157 the tag was issued to a disabled American veteran. <u>The design of</u> 158 <u>the tag shall be approved by the Mississippi Military License Tag</u> 159 <u>Design Approval Committee.</u>

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(3) A license issued under this section shall not be

161 transferable to any other person.

162 (4) Any person evading or violating any of the provisions of 163 this section, or attempting to secure benefits hereunder to which 164 he is not entitled, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon 165 conviction shall be fined not less than One Hundred Dollars 166 (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

167 SECTION 4. Section 27-19-54, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 168 amended as follows:[WAN3]

169 27-19-54. (1) Any legal resident of the State of 170 Mississippi who was a prisoner of war or who is a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor is privileged to obtain one (1) motor 171 172 vehicle license plate or tag on an annual basis in his county of 173 legal residence. The registration year of such motor vehicle shall commence the first day of the month in which application for 174 registration is made, as provided in Section 27-19-31, Mississippi 175 176 Code of 1972.

177 (2) This section pertains only to tags or plates for private178 passenger motor vehicles or pickup trucks.

179 (3) Proof of ownership of each particular motor vehicle for 180 which a license plate or tag is requested and proof that the owner 181 thereof is a former prisoner of war or a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor must be shown at time of application 182 183 for such plate or tag. A certificate from the State Veterans 184 Affairs Board stating that said individual is a former prisoner of war or a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor shall be 185 186 sufficient proof.

187 (4) Vehicles owned by such former prisoners of war, a
188 recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor or the unmarried
189 surviving spouse of any such person are hereby exempt from all
190 motor vehicle registration fees and privilege taxes.

191 (5) The State Tax Commission is directed to furnish to the 192 tax collector of each county a sufficient number of distinctive 193 motor vehicle license plates or tags which shall be of such color

and design as the State Tax Commission shall prescribe subject to the approval of the Mississippi License Tag Commission <u>and the</u> <u>Mississippi Military License Tag Design Approval Committee</u>, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 27-19-41. However, such distinctive plates or tags shall bear and include the words "Ex-POW."

200 (6) A license issued under this section shall not be transferable to any other person; however, the surviving spouse of 201 202 a deceased person who was issued a license plate or tag under this 203 section shall be entitled to apply for or retain a license issued 204 under this section and may continue annually to renew registration 205 for one (1) motor vehicle license plate or tag under this section 206 for as long as the spouse remains unmarried. At the time of application or renewal registration, a surviving spouse who 207 208 desires to retain the distinctive plate or tag issued under this 209 section shall file with the county tax collector a sworn statement 210 that the spouse is unmarried.

(7) Any person evading or violating any of the provisions of this section, or attempting to secure benefits hereunder to which he is not entitled, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

As used in this section, the term "prisoner of war" 216 (8) 217 means any regularly appointed, enrolled, enlisted or inducted member of the military or naval forces of the United States who 218 219 was held as a prisoner of war for any period of time by any government of any nation with which the United States has been at 220 war; and it also means any regularly appointed, enrolled, enlisted 221 222 or inducted member of the Armed Forces of the United States who 223 was held as a prisoner of war for any period of time subsequent to 224 June 25, 1950, by any hostile force with which the Armed Forces of 225 the United States were actually engaged in armed conflict 226 subsequent to such date and prior to August 21, 1954, or any

227 person (military or civilian) assigned to duty on the U.S.S. 228 Pueblo who was captured by the military forces of North Korea on 229 January 23, 1968, and thereafter held prisoner by the government 230 of North Korea for any period of time ending on or before December 231 23, 1968, except any person who, at any time, voluntarily, 232 knowingly and without duress, gave aid to or collaborated with or in any manner served any such hostile force; and it also means any 233 234 regularly appointed, enrolled, enlisted or inducted member of the 235 Armed Forces of the United States who was held as a prisoner of 236 war for any period of time during the Vietnam Conflict by any force hostile to the United States, except any such member who, at 237 238 any time, voluntarily, knowingly and without duress, gave aid to 239 or collaborated with, or in any manner served, such hostile force. 240 The term "Vietnam Conflict" relates to the period beginning 241 February 28, 1961, and ending on such date as shall thereafter be 242 determined by presidential proclamation or concurrent resolution 243 of the Congress.

244 SECTION 5. Section 27-19-56.5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 245 amended as follows:[WAN4]

In recognition of the patriotic service rendered 246 27-19-56.5. 247 by Mississippians who survived the attack on Pearl Harbor and by Mississippians who are recipients of the Purple Heart Medal, any 248 249 such person is privileged to obtain one (1) distinctive motor 250 vehicle license plate or tag identifying him as a Pearl Harbor survivor or a Purple Heart Medal recipient. The distinctive 251 252 plates or tags shall be of a color and design designated by the 253 Tax Commission and approved by the Mississippi Military License Tag Design Approval Committee. 254

The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the Tax Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of the counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license plates or tags. A tag fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), in addition to all other taxes and fees, shall be collected by the

260 tax collector for the Pearl Harbor distinctive tag. Distinctive 261 tags issued to Purple Heart Medal recipients under the provisions 262 of this section shall be exempt from ad valorem taxes, privilege taxes and all other taxes and fees. The tax collector shall 263 264 forward the additional fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) charged for 265 issuance of a Pearl Harbor distinctive tag to the Tax Commission which shall deposit such fee to the credit of the State General 266 267 An applicant for such distinctive plates shall present to Fund. 268 the issuing official either (a) written proof that the applicant 269 is an honorably discharged former member of one of the Armed Forces of the United States and, while serving in the Armed Forces 270 271 of the United States, was present during the attack on the island 272 of Oahu, Territory of Hawaii, on December 7, 1941, between the hours of 7:55 a.m. and 9:45 a.m., Hawaii time, or (b) written 273 proof that the applicant is a Purple Heart Medal recipient. 274 The 275 distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be used only 276 upon a personally or jointly owned private passenger vehicle (to 277 include station wagons, recreational motor vehicles and pickup 278 trucks) registered in the name, or jointly in the name, of the 279 person making application therefor, and when issued to such person 280 shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard license plate or license tag normally issued for such 281 282 vehicle.

The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by such owner and returned to the tax collector.

288 SECTION 6. Section 27-19-56.12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 289 amended as follows:[WAN5]

27-19-56.12. In recognition of the patriotic service
rendered by Mississippians who are honorably discharged veterans
who served in the United States Armed Forces in Saudi Arabia or

293 Kuwait during Operation Desert Storm or Operation Desert Shield, in Panama during the invasion, in Grenada during the invasion, 294 295 during the Vietnam Conflict, during the Korean Conflict, during World War II or during World War I, any such person is privileged 296 297 to obtain one (1) distinctive motor vehicle license plate or tag 298 identifying him as a veteran. The State Tax Commission is further 299 authorized to develop a decal to be affixed to the license tag 300 indicating the veteran's service in the above enumerated wars or 301 conflicts. The distinctive plates or tags shall be of a color and 302 design designated by the Tax Commission and approved by the Mississippi Military License Tag Design Approval Committee. 303

304 The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the Tax 305 Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of the 306 counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license 307 plates or tags. An additional tag fee of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) 308 shall be collected by the tax collector for such license plates or 309 tags and shall be forwarded to the Tax Commission which shall deposit such fee to the credit of a fund to be administered by the 310 311 board overseeing the veterans nursing homes in this state for the 312 benefit of indigent veterans who are residents of such nursing 313 homes.

An applicant for such distinctive plates shall present to the 314 315 issuing official written evidence of the veteran's service. Such 316 evidence shall include a copy of the applicant's DD-214 form or an equivalent document. The distinctive license plates or tags so 317 318 issued shall be used only upon a personally or jointly owned 319 private passenger vehicle (to include station wagons, recreational 320 motor vehicles and pickup trucks) registered in the name, or jointly in the name, of the person making application therefor, 321 322 and when issued to such person shall be used upon the vehicle for 323 which issued in lieu of the standard license plate or license tag normally issued for such vehicle. 324

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5 The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable

between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by such owner and returned to the tax collector.

330 SECTION 7. Section 27-19-56.13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 331 amended as follows:[WAN6]

27-19-56.13. In recognition of the patriotic service 332 rendered by Mississippians who are recipients of the Distinguished 333 Flying Cross and the Air Medal, any such person is privileged to 334 335 obtain one (1) distinctive motor vehicle license plate or tag identifying him as recipient of the Distinguished Flying Cross or 336 337 the Air Medal. The distinctive plates or tags shall be of a color 338 and design designated by the Tax Commission and approved by the Mississippi Military License Tag Design Approval Committee. 339

The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the Tax 340 341 Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of the 342 counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license plates or tags. An additional tag fee of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) 343 344 shall be collected by the tax collector for such license plates or tags and shall be forwarded to the State Tax Commission which 345 346 shall deposit such fee to the credit of the State General Fund. An applicant for such distinctive plates shall present to the 347 348 issuing official written proof that the applicant is a recipient 349 of the Distinguished Flying Cross or the Air Medal. The distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be used only 350 351 upon a personally or jointly owned private passenger vehicle (to 352 include station wagons, recreational motor vehicles and pickup trucks) registered in the name, or jointly in the name, of the 353 person making application therefor, and when issued to such person 354 355 shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the 356 standard license plate or license tag normally issued for such vehicle. 357

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The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable

359 between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a 360 vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or 361 otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by 362 such owner and returned to the tax collector.

363 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 364 and after July 1, 2000.
