7	FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
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9	<u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Purpose. The Legislature finds and declares

- 19 (2) **Veterans defined.** For the purpose of this act,
- 20 "veteran" means a person who served on active duty (other than for
- 21 training) in any component of the United States Armed Forces for a
- 22 period of one hundred eighty (180) days or more, unless released
- 23 earlier because of service-connected disability, and who was
- 24 discharged or released from the Armed Forces under honorable
- 25 conditions.

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- 26 (3) **Priority defined.** For the purposes of this act,
- 27 "priority for veterans" means that eligible veterans who register
- 28 or otherwise apply for services will be extended the opportunity

- 29 to participate or otherwise receive the services of the covered
- 30 providers before the providers extend the opportunity and services
- 31 to other registered applicants.
- 32 (4) **Priority employment directed.** The State Workforce
- 33 Investment Board will establish procedures to provide eligible
- 34 veterans with priority services set forth in the provision of the
- 35 programs and services which are within their jurisdiction.
- 36 (5) **Services defined.** Priority over nonveterans in the
- 37 provisions of employment, training and other services provided by
- 38 the Workforce Investment Act. Services are those activities or
- 39 efforts including, but not limited to, assessment, registration,
- 40 case management, referral to supportive services, which are
- 41 directed to help customers.
- 42 (6) **Service providers.** The partners established by the
- 43 State and Local Workforce Investment Boards who actually provide
- 44 the services to program participants.
- 45 (7) Implementation and performance measures. The State
- 46 Auditor shall:
- 47 (a) Develop measures of service for veterans that will
- 48 serve as indicators of compliance with the provisions of this act
- 49 by all covered service providers.
- 50 (b) Annually publish and submit to the Governor, the
- 51 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro
- 52 Tempore of the Senate, beginning not later than July 1, 2000, a
- 53 report detailing covered providers' compliance with the provisions
- 54 of this act.
- 55 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 56 and after its passage.
