SENATE BILL NO. 3190 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-41, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW FOR POSTAUDIT OF TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT RECORDS OF PUBLIC 3 OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES; TO ALLOW A DESIGNEE OF THE GOVERNOR TO APPROVE TRAVEL OUTSIDE OF THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES; TO ALLOW 5 FOR MULTIPLE CONTRACTS WITH MULTIPLE TRAVEL AGENCIES FOR THE 6 PROVISION OF NECESSARY TRAVEL SERVICES FOR STATE OFFICERS AND 7 EMPLOYEES; TO REQUIRE APPROVAL BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION BEFORE THE ADMINISTRATIVE 8 9 HEAD OF EACH STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER LEARNING MAY CONTRACT 10 WITH A COMMERCIAL TRAVEL AGENCY TO PROVIDE TRAVEL SERVICES; AND 11 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 12 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 amended as follows:[BD1] 14 25-3-41. (1) When any officer or employee of the State of 15 16 Mississippi, or any department, agency or institution thereof, 17 after first being duly authorized, is required to travel in the performance of his official duties, such officer or employee shall 18 19 receive as expenses for each mile actually and necessarily traveled, when such travel is done by a privately owned automobile 2.0 or other privately owned motor vehicle, the mileage reimbursement 21 rate allowable to federal employees for the use of a privately 22 owned vehicle while on official travel. 23 (2) When any officer or employee of any county or

(2) When any officer or employee of any county or
municipality, or of any agency, board or commission thereof, after
first being duly authorized, is required to travel in the
performance of his official duties, such officer or employee shall
receive as expenses Twenty Cents (20¢) for each mile actually and
necessarily traveled, when such travel is done by a privately
owned motor vehicle; provided, however, that the governing

31 authorities of a county or municipality may, in their discretion, 32 authorize an increase in the mileage reimbursement of officers and employees of such county or municipality, or of any agency, board 33 or commission thereof, in an amount not to exceed the mileage 34 35 reimbursement rate authorized for officers and employees of the 36 State of Mississippi in subsection (1) of this section. 37 Where two (2) or more officers or employees travel in 38 one (1) privately owned motor vehicle, only one (1) travel expense allowance at the authorized rate per mile shall be allowed for any 39 40 one (1) trip. When such travel is done by means of a public carrier or other means not involving a privately owned motor 41 vehicle, then such officer or employee shall receive as travel 42 43 expense the actual fare or other expenses incurred in such travel. In addition to the foregoing, a public officer or 44 45 employee shall be reimbursed for other actual expenses such as meals, lodging and other necessary expenses incurred in the course 46 of such travel, subject to limitations placed on meals for 47 intrastate and interstate official travel by the Department of 48 Finance and Administration, provided, that the Legislative Budget 49 50 Office shall place any limitations for expenditures made on matters under the jurisdiction of the Legislature. The Department 51 52 of Finance and Administration shall set a maximum daily expenditure annually for such meals and shall notify officers and 53 54 employees of changes to these allowances immediately upon approval 55 of such changes. Travel by airline shall be at the tourist rate unless such space was unavailable. The officer or employee shall 56 57 certify that tourist accommodations were not available if travel is performed in first class airline accommodations. 58 59 expense accounts shall be submitted by such officers or employees 60 in such number as the department, agency or institution may require; but in any case one (1) copy shall be furnished by state 61 62 departments, agencies or institutions to the Department of Finance and Administration for preaudit or postaudit. 63 The Department of 64 Finance and Administration shall promulgate and adopt reasonable 65 rules and regulations which it deems necessary and requisite to 66 effectuate economies for all expenses authorized and paid pursuant

to this section. Requisitions shall be made on the State Fiscal

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- 68 Officer who shall issue his warrant on the State Treasurer.
- 69 Provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not
- 70 include agencies financed entirely by federal funds and audited by
- 71 federal auditors.
- 72 (5) Any officer or employee of a county or municipality, or
- 73 any department, board or commission thereof, who is required to
- 74 travel in the performance of his official duties, may receive
- 75 funds prior to such travel, in the discretion of the
- 76 administrative head of the county or municipal department, board
- 77 or commission involved, for the purpose of paying necessary
- 78 expenses incurred during such travel. Upon return from such
- 79 travel, the officer or employee shall provide receipts of
- 80 transportation, lodging, meals, fees and any other expenses
- 81 incurred during the travel. Any portion of the funds advanced
- 82 which is not expended during the travel shall be returned by the
- 83 officer or employee. The Department of Audit shall adopt rules
- 84 and regulations regarding advance payment of travel expenses and
- 85 submission of receipts to ensure proper control and strict
- 86 accountability for such payments and expenses.
- 87 (6) No state or federal funds received from any source by
- 88 any arm or agency of the state shall be expended in traveling
- 89 outside of the continental limits of the United States until the
- 90 governing body or head of the agency makes a finding and
- 91 determination that the travel would be extremely beneficial to the
- 92 state agency and obtains a written concurrence thereof from the
- 93 Governor or his designee and the Department of Finance and
- 94 Administration.
- 95 (7) Where any officer or employee of the State of
- 96 Mississippi, or any department, agency or institution thereof, or
- 97 of any county or municipality, or of any agency, board or
- 98 commission thereof, is authorized to receive travel reimbursement
- 99 under any other provision of law, such reimbursement may be paid
- 100 under the provisions of this section or such other section, but

101 not under both.

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- The Department of Finance and Administration may 102 103 contract with one or more commercial travel agencies, after 104 receiving competitive bids or proposals therefor, for such travel 105 agency or agencies to provide * * * necessary travel services for 106 state officers and employees. However, the administrative head of 107 each state institution of higher learning may, in his discretion, contract with a commercial travel agency to provide necessary 108 109 travel services for all academic officials and staff of the 110 university in lieu of participation in the state travel agency 111 contract. Any such decision by a university to contract with a 112 separate travel agency shall be approved by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and * * * the Executive 113 Director of the Department of Finance and Administration. 114 115 Before executing a contract with one or more travel 116 agencies, the Department of Finance and Administration shall advertise for competitive bids or proposals once a week for two 117
 - (b) Before executing a contract with <u>one or more</u> traveragencies, the Department of Finance and Administration shall advertise for competitive bids <u>or proposals</u> once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a regular newspaper having a general circulation throughout the State of Mississippi. * * * If the department determines that it should not contract with any of the bidders initially submitting proposals, the department may reject all such bids, advertise as provided herein and receive new proposals before executing the contract <u>or contracts</u>. The contract <u>or contracts may</u> be for a <u>period not greater than</u> three (3) years, with an option for the travel agency <u>or agencies</u> to renew the contract <u>or contracts</u> on a one-year basis on the same terms as the original contract <u>or contracts</u>, for a maximum of two (2) renewals. After the travel agency <u>or agencies have</u> renewed the contract twice or <u>have</u> declined to renew the contract for the maximum number of times, the Department of Finance and Administration shall advertise for bids in the manner required by
 - (c) Whenever any state officer or employee travels in

this section and execute a new contract or contracts.

- 134 the performance of his official duties by airline or other public
- 135 carrier, he shall have his travel arrangements handled by such
- 136 travel agency or agencies.
- 137 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 138 and after July 1, 2000.
