SENATE BILL NO. 3255 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AID OF THE PUBLIC 2 COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FOR 3 FISCAL YEAR 2001. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 5 SECTION 1. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may 6 be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning 8 9 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.....\$ 100,375,171.00. (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 10 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 11 12 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the 13 aid of public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001..... 14 15 27,527,120.00. (3) The money appropriated by this act shall be apportioned 16 as follows: 17 (a) The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges 18 shall distribute to each of the public community and junior 19 20 colleges, out of any money appropriated from the State General Fund, the sum of Three Hundred Ninety-nine Thousand One Hundred 21 22 Fifty-three Dollars (\$399,153.00) and out of any money appropriated from the Education Enhancement Fund, the sum of One 23 Hundred Forty-two Thousand One Hundred Twenty-seven Dollars 24 25 (\$142, 127.00).

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(b) The remainder of the appropriation for public

27 community and junior colleges shall be distributed in twelve (12) monthly installments beginning July 25, 2000, on the basis of the 28 29 number of full-time academic and technical public community and 30 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent 31 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside 32 within the State of Mississippi. Provided, however, that 33 34 technical students shall be weighted at 1.19 times that of 35 academic students.

36 The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior 37 Colleges shall visit each public community and junior college and 38 shall determine, on the basis of an audit of students, who shall 39 be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the 40 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

If, pending determination of the full-time academic 41 42 enrollment of students at the public community and junior colleges 43 entitled to participate in this appropriation, as provided for in this subsection, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges 44 45 shall find and determine that any such public or community junior college does not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the 46 47 necessary expenses of its operation for the period commencing July 1, 2000, until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, 48 49 then, in that event, the State Board for Community and Junior 50 Colleges is expressly authorized to make an advance to any such 51 public community or junior college or colleges not having 52 sufficient operating funds for such period from the funds appropriated hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any 53 54 such advance to any one public community or junior college shall not exceed thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state 55 56 appropriated funds received by such public community or junior 57 college during the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further, 58 that the amount of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro rata part of the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public 59

60 community or junior college when enrollment has been ascertained 61 and distribution of funds is made.

62 (4) No part of the amount herein appropriated shall be used by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for 63 64 administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the 65 extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges. 66 SECTION 2. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may 67 be necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the 68 69 State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support, maintenance and equipping of vocational-technical departments in 70 71 the public community and junior colleges which meet the 72 requirements for vocational-technical education departments for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 73 74 2001.....\$ 2,870,408.00.

75 The following sum, or so much thereof as may be (2) 76 necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the 77 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the 78 support, maintenance and equipping of vocational-technical 79 departments in the public community and junior colleges which meet 80 the requirements for vocational-technical education departments for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending 81 82 June 30, 2001.....\$ 772,288.00.

(3) Such departments shall be open to students enrolled in the institutions, and to other students who may qualify for such courses, and to those meeting requirements for either civilian or veteran rehabilitation, whether or not enrolled in such institutions as regular students.

88 (4) Such funds shall be disbursed to such public community 89 and junior colleges on the basis of the full-time vocational 90 enrollment of each such public community and junior college as of 91 the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its 92 equivalent of the preceding year, counting only students who

93 reside within the State of Mississippi.

94 (5) No part of the funds hereby appropriated shall be spent95 for building or for regular academic instruction.

96 (6) The funds disbursed under the provisions of this act
97 shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community and
98 Junior Colleges.

105 (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 106 necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the 107 Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, for the 108 support of part-time academic credit courses operated by public 109 community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning 110 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.....\$ 3,905,292.00.

111 (3) These funds shall be disbursed by the State Board for 112 Community and Junior Colleges to such public community and junior 113 colleges as may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time 114 equivalency of part-time and summer academic students, counting 115 only students who reside within the State of Mississippi.

116 SECTION 4. (1) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 117 118 General Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 119 Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of paying for nursing faculty supplement, in accordance with Section 37-129-1 et 120 121 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, and aid to nursing education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001 122 123\$ 5,839,750.00.

124 (2) The following sum, or so much thereof as may be125 necessary, is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the

Education Enhancement Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of paying for nursing faculty supplement, in accordance with Section 37-129-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, and aid to nursing education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.....\$ 1,571,194.00. SECTION 5. The following public community and junior

133 colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by 134 Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of this act:

135 Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College, East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community 136 137 College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community 138 College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College, Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College, 139 Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District, Northeast 140 141 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community 142 College, Pearl River Community College, and Southwest Mississippi 143 Community College.

144 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 145 of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the 146 purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any 147 public community and junior college employee who is serving as a 148 member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.

149 SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 150 151 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 152 Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring nursing and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing and 153 154 allied health student loans and providing instructional support 155 for the Rural Health Corps for the fiscal year beginning 156 July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.....\$ 1,200,000.00. 157 The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as 158 follows:

(1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)public community and junior colleges.

161 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of 162 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and 163 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the 164 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent 165 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside 166 within the State of Mississippi.

167 The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and 168 make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget 169 Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments 170 of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual 171 community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by 172 the Legislative Budget Office.

The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health Insurance Plan. Any funds appropriated in these sections which are not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.

SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of establishing and operating One-Stop Career Centers at each of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001......\$ 4,500,000.00. SECTION 10. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

192 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 193 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 194 Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the 195 cost of Sign Language Interpreter Training at the public community 196 and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, 197 and ending June 30, 2001......\$ 179,050.00.

205 SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 206 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the 207 Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the 208 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the cost of servicing the debt on bonds issued for the 209 210 Education Technology Program at the community and junior colleges 211 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending 212 June 30, 2001.....\$ 3,141,678.00.

The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 215 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 (2), 216 217 2 (2), 3 (2), and 4 (2), Thirty Million Eighty Thousand Six Hundred Sixty-three Dollars (\$30,080,663.00) shall be derived from 218 219 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Sections 220 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972 and Three Million 221 Six Hundred Ninety-five Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-one Dollars 222 (\$3,695,231.00) shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 223 224 1972.

225 SECTION 14. Should revenues generated and deposited to the Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1), 226 227 Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section 37-61-33 (6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds 228 229 appropriated herein from said source, the State Board for 230 Community and Junior Colleges shall notify the Department of 231 Finance and Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced 232 to insure that expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.

SECTION 15. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition (MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi resident for the purposes of participating in this appropriation regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of enrollment, as set out in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 37-155-5(d)(iii).

SECTION 16. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

It is the intent of the Legislature that no 280 281 faculty salaries be reduced. 282 SECTION 18. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 283 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 284 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 285 Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the 286 cost of the Golden Triangle Education Center for Manufacturing Technology, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending 287 288 June 30, 2001.....\$ 100,000.00. 289 SECTION 19. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 290 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the

Education Enhancement Fund No. 4302 in the State Treasury to the 291 credit of the Public Community and Junior Colleges, for the fiscal 292 293 year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001..... 294\$ 615,000.00. 295 SECTION 20. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the Mississippi Public Community and Junior Colleges 296 297 may expend out of these funds such sums as may be necessary to 298 provide transportation and transportation related services, 299 including the operation or use of buses, vans or other vehicles 300 owned or leased by the Mississippi Public Community and Junior 301 Colleges in support of the annual meeting of the Southern Legislative Conference hosted by the State of Mississippi. 302 303 SECTION 21. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 304 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 305 306 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 307 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 308 309 SECTION 22. This act shall take effect and be in force from

310 and after July 1, 2000.
