SENATE BILL NO. 3257 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF 1 2 STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING FOR THE SUPPORT AND 3 MAINTENANCE OF STUDENT FINANCIAL AID AND THE MISSISSIPPI POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE BOARD, FOR FISCAL 4 5 YEAR 2001. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 8 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning: (1) for the Omnibus 10 Loan or Scholarship Act of 1991, in accordance with Section 11 37-143-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972; (2) to defray the 12 13 expenses incurred by the State of Mississippi in accordance with 14 the terms of contracts between the State of Mississippi and the Southern Regional Education Board under the Southern Regional 15 16 Education Program, in accordance with Section 37-135-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972; (3) to provide instruction in graduate 17 and professional schools in institutions outside the state for 18 qualified students who are residents of Mississippi when such 19 instruction is not available for them in the regularly supported 20 21 Mississippi institutions of higher learning, in accordance with Section 37-101-221, Mississippi Code of 1972; (4) for the 22 23 Post-Secondary Education Assistance Fund, for the purpose of providing loans to students in accordance with Section 37-106-1 et 2.4 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972; (5) for the purpose of reimbursing 25 institutions for scholarships granted under the provisions of 26 27 Section 37-107-1 (deceased or disabled law enforcement officers'

and firemen's spouses children); (6) for the purpose of 28 29 reimbursing institutions for scholarships granted under the provisions of Section 37-108-1 (POW or MIA children); (7) for the 30 31 Public Management Graduate Intern Program, for the purpose of 32 providing a practical work experience in a specific state or local 33 agency and office, including offices of the Legislature, to students in accordance with Section 37-110-1 et seq., Mississippi 34 35 Code of 1972; (8) for the support and maintenance of the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program and the 36 37 Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant Program; (9) for the support and maintenance of the Higher Education Legislative Plan; (10) for 38 the support and maintenance of the Critical Teacher Shortage 39 40 Scholarship Program; and (11) for the support and maintenance of the Department of Student Financial Aid, for the fiscal year 41 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001..... 42 43 .....\$ 23,360,340.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 44 45 necessary, is hereby authorized out of the proceeds derived from 46 any federal funds, research grants, donations, fees, or other 47 special source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available, for: (1) the Consolidated Revolving Loan Fund, in 48 accordance with Section 37-143-19, Mississippi Code of 1972; (2) 49 the expenses incurred by the State of Mississippi in accordance 50 with the terms of contracts between the State of Mississippi and 51 52 the Southern Regional Education Board under the Southern Regional Education Program; (3) the Post-Secondary Education Assistance 53 54 Fund, for the purpose of providing loans to students; (4) for the 55 Public Management Graduate Intern Program; (5) for the support 56 and maintenance of the Critical Teacher Shortage Scholarship 57 Program; and (6) for the support and maintenance of the Department of Student Financial Aid, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 58 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.....\$ 59 11,472,394.00. SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 60 61 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of carryover 62 funds in State Treasury Fund 325E, pursuant to Section 37-106-33, 63 Mississippi Code of 1972, for the support and maintenance of the 64 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program and the

65 Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant Program, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001..... 66 67 .....\$ 67,183.00. 68 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Four 69 Million Five Hundred Fifty-three Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-seven Dollars (\$4,553,337.00) shall be derived from funds 70 deposited pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 71 72 1972.

73 SECTION 5. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in 74 accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures established 75 by law.

Provided, however, that none of the funds apportioned in this act for the Out-of-State Educational Program shall be paid to or for the benefit of any student who enters a school outside the State of Mississippi for the first time, subsequent to July 1, 1982, in any discipline in the fields of medicine or dentistry.

81 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, the 82 Board of Trustees of the State Institutions of Higher Learning 83 84 shall expend from the support of the out-of-state graduate and 85 professional studies program an amount not exceeding the funding necessary, contingent upon the availability of qualified 86 87 applicants, for ten (10) new entering optometry students and the number of returning optometry students who received funding under 88 89 the program during the preceding school year; for ten (10) new 90 entering chiropractic students, with not more than twenty-five 91 (25) chiropractic students overall; and seven (7) new entering 92 osteopathic medical students and the number of returning osteopathic medical students who received funding under the 93 94 program during the preceding school year, for these courses of 95 study.

96 SECTION 7. In the allocation of funds appropriated under the 97 provisions of Sections 1, 2 and 3 among the student financial aid

98 programs included herein, it is the intention of the Legislature 99 that priority shall be given and funds shall be first allocated to 100 all students eligible for financial aid under the provisions of 101 Sections 37-107-1 through 37-107-7 and Sections 37-108-1 through 102 37-108-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 8. All funds provided for in this act shall be 103 104 accounted for in a detailed statement showing when, to whom, and 105 for what purpose applied, and this statement shall be submitted at 106 the next regular session of the Legislature within ten (10) days 107 after the convening thereof. A report of loans made and receipt of repayment of loans to the fund shall be reported. The amount 108 109 of repayment that is in arrears shall also be included. Such report shall include the number of students at each institution 110 receiving financial assistance and the amount of such assistance, 111 and an estimate of the financial requirement of the various loan 112 113 programs for the next year. No public or private institution of 114 higher learning receiving funds under the respective provisions of this act, for the purpose of issuing scholarship grants or loans, 115 shall issue any official transcripts for any persons who have any 116 117 amount of repayment in arrears on that date such official 118 transcript is requested.

Furthermore, all funds received and expended shall be reported and otherwise accounted for in accordance with the provisions of Section 37-143-21, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2002 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2001 budget request process.

127 SECTION 10. Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and 128 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be 129 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of 130 Mississippi and Section 25-4-103, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 11. Should revenues generated and deposited to the Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds appropriated herein from said source, the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall notify the Department of Finance and Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure that expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.

138 SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 139 140 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 141 142 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 143 SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from 144 145 and after July 1, 2000.
