SENATE BILL NO. 3261

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING 2 THE EXPENSES OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE, 3 AND GRAIN DIVISION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2001. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of 8 defraying the expenses of the State Department of Agriculture and 9 Commerce Support and Grain Division for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.....\$ 8,379,728.00. 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special 13 source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department 14 15 of Agriculture and Commerce, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001..... 16 17 1,933,900.00. The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of 18 this section include subscription fees produced from the Market 19 20 Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. 21 22 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall 23 be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of 24 25 expenditure: 26 SUPPORT

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 68 69 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 70 Services" for Fiscal Year 2002 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2001 71 72 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 73 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2002 budget by the 74 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 75 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 76 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 77 78 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure act. 79 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 80 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2001 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, 81 82 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 83 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2001 "Personal Services" 84 85 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 86 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 87 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 88 89 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with

90 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law.

91 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 92 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are

93 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 94 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

95 SECTION 4. The funds appropriated and authorized to be expended under the provisions of this act shall be expended for 96 97 the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the State 98 Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation of all programs and activities (except operation of the State Lime Plants 99 100 and the Division of Plant Industry, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink 101 Bollworm-Plant Quarantine Inspection Stations and Fire Ant 102 Program) authorized to be conducted and carried on by said department; including, but not limited to: the administration of 103 104 the Feed, Fertilizer and Dairy Act; the Weights and Measure Act; the Meat Inspection Act of 1968; the Mississippi Pure Seed Law; 105 106 and the following additional programs and activities: enforcement 107 of the egg law; publication and distribution of the Mississippi 108 Market Bulletin, agricultural statistics, market news service at 109 Stoneville, Mississippi; operation of the grain laboratory; inspection, grading and certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay, 110 111 grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans, 112 seed, syrup, and port grain inspection.

SECTION 5. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall from time to time adjust the schedule of fees collected under the grain inspection program so that the revenue therefrom equals or exceeds the operational costs of the grain inspection program and the expenses incurred in complying with the requirements of the United States Grain Standards Act, P. L. 94-583.

SECTION 6. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish nonbudgeted enterprise funds for all "for profit" activities related to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. The funds shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted

126 accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department 127 of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that any regulations promulgated by the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce concerning the labeling of liming materials include the actual analysis of said lime. Nothing in the regulations shall prevent any manufacturer from selling his products to any consumer as long as the labeling is accurate.

134 SECTION 8. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 135 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 136 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of 137 Agriculture and Commerce for the support of the Beaver Control 138 Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending 139 June 30, 2001......\$ 500,000.00.

140 SECTION 9. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 141 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 142 Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program, to the 143 Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the support of the 144 Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, 145 and ending June 30, 2001......\$ 402,216.00.

146The special funds authorized in this Section for the Beaver147Control Program are to be derived as follows: Two Hundred148Twenty-seven Thousand Six Hundred Eight Dollars

149 (\$227,608.00) from counties; One Hundred Seventy-four Thousand Six 150 Hundred Eight Dollars (\$174,608.00) from fees charged private 151 persons/organizations.

152 SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 153 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 154 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 155 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 156 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 157 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 158 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from

159 and after July 1, 2000.
