338 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 339 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

344 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 345 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 346 347 Services" for Fiscal Year 2002 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2001 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 348 349 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2002 budget by the 350 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 351 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 352 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 353 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 354 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 355 356 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2001 appropriation for "Personal

357 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, 358 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 359 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2001 "Personal Services" 360 361 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 362 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 363 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 364 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

Of the general funds appropriated to the "Service Budget" in the category "Subsidies, Loans and Grants," the sum of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) may be used for Special Olympics and choir and tumbling team consisting of students from the institutions included in this act.

370 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 371 Section 1, authorized for expenditure in Section 2, and allocated 372 in Section 3 to the "Central Office", funds are included for an 373 Alzheimer's education and training program.

374 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 375 Section 1, authorized for expenditure in Section 2, and allocated 376 in Section 4 to the "Central Office", funds are included to 377 compensate part-time members of the Sexual Predator Review Board 378 at an hourly rate not to exceed the hourly rate for similarly 379 qualified and titled full-time state employees, plus fringe 380 benefits allowable for such part-time employees.

381 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 382 Section 1, authorized for expenditure under the provisions of 383 Section 2, and allocated under the provisions of Section 4, funds 384 in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars

(\$200,000.00) may be expended for the support of a pilot project to provide authority for East Mississippi State Hospital and Mississippi State Hospital to contract with local hospitals located in counties with a population of less than fifty thousand (50,000) to provide emergency in-patient care to individuals

390 committed by the Chancery Court to East Mississippi State Hospital 391 or Mississippi State Hospital for treatment of mental illness if, 392 at the time that such commitment is made, a bed is not available 393 for admission to East Mississippi State Hospital or Mississippi 394 State Hospital. East Mississippi State Hospital and Mississippi 395 State Hospital shall have the authority to contract with local hospitals located in counties with a population of less than fifty 396 thousand (50,000) for in-patient emergency care for a period not 397 398 to exceed seven (7) days at a rate not to exceed One Hundred and 399 Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) per day with East Mississippi State Hospital or Mississippi State Hospital providing One Hundred 400 401 Dollars (\$100.00) and the local government providing Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per day for such care. Payment for such physician fees 402 403 shall be made at the Medicaid rate of reimbursement and paid by 404 East Mississippi State Hospital or Mississippi State Hospital. 405 Funds provided for the initiation of this pilot project shall not 406 be expended for in-patient hospital care unless there is participation in the reimbursement for such care by the local 407 408 government as required by the provisions of this section.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 409 SECTION 8. 410 Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health has the authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to 411 412 another special fund treasury fund under the control of the 413 Department of Mental Health. The purpose of this authority is to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the 414 415 intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall submit written justification for 416 417 the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth (15th) of 418 419 the month prior to the effective date of the transfer.

420 SECTION 9. The executive director of the Department of 421 Mental Health and the directors of each separate facility operated 422 by the Department of Mental Health are hereby authorized to

423 transfer spending authority from any major objects to any other 424 major objects in any amounts deemed necessary for the efficient 425 management and operation of their budgets, provided that the total spending authority remains unchanged after such transfers and the 426 427 total of such transfers into any major object do no exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the original appropriated amount for 428 429 that major object plus any escalations of spending authority that 430 have occurred during any given fiscal year.

431 SECTION 10. The Department of Mental Health is hereby 432 authorized to accept and expend in any major objects deemed necessary by the Department of Mental Health any non-federal funds 433 434 from any source for the purposes of defraying the operational 435 costs of any of the separate budget entities operated by the Department of Mental Health. Such non-federal funds shall include 436 437 patient revenues, including Medicaid income, and grants, 438 contributions and donations from any individual, public, or 439 private organization, received in excess of amounts originally anticipated when spending authority was appropriated. Such 440 441 non-federal funds shall be received and expended under the rules 442 and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in 443 a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

444 SECTION 11. The Department of Mental Health and its facilities shall have the authority, within funding and spending 445 446 authority appropriated under the provisions of Sections 1 and 3, 447 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, and allocated under the 448 provisions of Section 4 of this act, to transfer funds to the Division of Medicaid in payment of Medicaid match and designate 449 450 that the funds thus transferred shall be applied to Medicaid match 451 obligations arising in the subsequent fiscal year.

452 SECTION 12. Any person within the Department of Mental 453 Health who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday 454 proclaimed by the Governor, may at the discretion of the Director 455 of the Institution and the Executive Director of the Department of

456 Mental Health and within available personnel funds, be paid "call 457 back pay" in lieu of "compensatory time credit."

458 SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated to the "Service 459 Budget" in the category "Subsidies, Loans and Grants," funds are 460 included for the support of community mental health services for 461 Fiscal Year 2001.

462 Provided, however, that none of the funds appropriated for 463 the support of community mental health services shall be made 464 available to any Regional Mental Health/Retardation Center which 465 does not receive from each of its participating counties a dollar 466 amount equivalent to what the proceeds of a three-fourths (3/4)467 mill tax on all taxable property in the county in Fiscal Year 1982 468 would have been or the amount of funds contributed to the center by the county in Fiscal Year 1984, whichever shall be greater. By 469 470 means of performance contracts, the Department of Mental Health 471 shall disburse the funds appropriated in this section for services 472 for the mentally ill, mentally retarded and alcohol/drug abusers. The State Board of Mental Health and the Department of Mental 473 474 Health shall be responsible for selecting the types of services 475 which shall be provided with the funds appropriated in this 476 section, for developing and monitoring performance contracts and 477 for holding contractors accountable for utilization of funds.

478 SECTION 14. Funds presently included or any funds received 479 in the future for timber funds at Ellisville State School and East Mississippi State Hospital are hereby authorized for transfer to 480 481 the regular operating budgets of the respective facilities. Each 482 facility shall receive such funds as "Special" funds, and such 483 funds shall be available for use in payment of any and all 484 expenses of each facility, paid by the State Treasurer upon 485 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 486 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 487 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 488 SECTION 15. The Department of Mental Health and its

489 facilities shall have the express legal authority, within funding 490 and spending authority appropriated under the provisions of 491 Section 1, authorized for expenditure under the provisions of Section 2, and allocated under the provisions of Section 4 of this 492 493 act, to purchase land for use by residential facilities operated 494 by the Department, either directly or by means of transferring 495 funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property 496 Management, and to transfer such funds to Bureau of Building, 497 Grounds, and Real Property Management for the purposes of 498 constructing and equipping group homes for persons with mental illness, mental retardation, and/or substance abuse; constructing 499 500 and equipping such other buildings as may be required for 501 treatment of persons with mental illness, mental retardation, 502 and/or substance abuse; repair and renovate existing buildings; 503 and to construct, repair and/or renovate employee housing. Any 504 intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded (ICF/MR) 505 constructed with funds authorized in this section shall be 506 authorized to participate in Medicaid Funding available for such 507 services.

508 SECTION 16. Of the General Funds appropriated to the 509 "Service Budget" in the category of "Subsidies, Loans and Grants," 510 the sum required may be expended to fund the Home and Community 511 Based Waiver Option for community mental retardation services as 512 authorized under Section 43-13-117 (29) of the Mississippi Code of 513 1972 (Annotated).

514 SECTION 17. With the funds herein appropriated, the 515 Department of Mental Health is authorized to provide home and 516 community based treatment and institutional treatment to not more 517 than ten (10) persons at any given time who, on or after reaching their twenty-first birthday (age 21), suffered a severe brain 518 519 injury and whose condition as a result of that brain injury would have resulted in their classification as developmentally disabled 520 521 if such injury had occurred prior to their twenty-first birthday.

522 SECTION 18. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the 523 524 special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Mental Health Funds 3372, 3373, 3374, 3382, 3385, 3386 and 3387 525 526 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending 527 June 30, 2001.....\$ 6,000,000.00 528 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the 529 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2000, or change the 530 531 purpose for which the funds were originally authorized. SECTION 19. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 532 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 533 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 534 535 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 536 intended mission of this agency. 589 SECTION 20. None of the funds appropriated herein may be 590 used to pay for alternative residential placement or 591 hospitalization for mental health, mental retardation, or 592 substance treatment of a person committed to the Department of 593 Mental Health under Sections 41-21-61, et. seq., 41-21-107, 594 41-31-1, et. seq., 43-21-315, and 43-21-611, Mississippi Code of 595 1972.

596 SECTION 21. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 597 of Section 1, authorized for expenditure in Section 2, and allocated in Section 4 to Mississippi State Hospital, funds not to 598 599 exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) may be 600 expended for pre-planning costs associated with a project or projects to renovate buildings on the campus of Mississippi State 601 602 Hospital to meet standards of the Joint Commission on 603 Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations.

604 SECTION 22. None of the funds appropriated for the support of community mental health, mental retardation, or substance abuse 605 606 services shall be made available to any service provider which, 607 upon determination of the Executive Director of the Department of 608 Mental Health, has an outstanding monetary obligation owed to the 609 Department of Mental Health or to the Division of Medicaid, 610 pursuant to an audit or programmatic review performed by the 611 Department of Mental Health, that has not been resolved, including those audits or programmatic reviews that occurred prior to 612 613 July 1, 2000.

514 SECTION 23. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 515 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 516 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 517 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 518 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 519 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 520 SECTION 24. This act shall take effect and be in force from
