SENATE BILL NO. 3306 (As Passed the Senate)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 878, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 1990, 2 AS LAST AMENDED BY CHAPTER 947, LOCAL AND PRIVATE LAWS OF 1997, TO EXTEND THE DATE UPON WHICH THE HATTIESBURG TOURISM COMMISSION IS 3 REPEALED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 878, Local and Private Laws of 1990, as amended by Chapter 1013, Local and Private Laws of 1995, as 7 amended by Chapter 947, Local and Private Laws of 1997, is amended 8 9 as follows: 10 Section 1. The following terms as used in this act shall have the meanings herein ascribed unless the context otherwise 11 12 clearly requires: 13 (a) "Hotel" or "motel" means a place of lodging that at any one time will accommodate transient guests on a daily or 14 15 weekly basis, excluding hotels or motels with ten (10) or less overnight rental units; 16 17 (b) "Commission" means the Hattiesburg Tourism Commission; 18 "City" means the City of Hattiesburg. 19 (C) 20 Section 2. There is hereby created and established the Hattiesburg Tourism Commission. 21 2.2 Section 3. (1) The commission shall consist of the following seven (7) members appointed by the mayor and ratified by 23 24 the city council: 25 (a) Two (2) members of the hotel/motel industry; (b) One (1) member either of the Chamber of Commerce or 26 the Economic Development Foundation; 27

28 (c) One (1) member representing the University of29 Southern Mississippi; and

31 (2) The commission shall be appointed within sixty (60) days 32 following the adoption of a resolution pursuant to passage of this 33 act for the following terms:

Three (3) members who serve at large.

34 Two (2) members for a term of one (1) year; (a) Two (2) members for a term of two (2) years; 35 (b) 36 (C) One (1) member for a term of three (3) years; 37 One (1) member for a term of four (4) years; and (d) One (1) member for a term of five (5) years. 38 (e) 39 Thereafter, appointments will be made on a staggered basis for a five-year period. 40

Members of the commission shall serve without 41 (3)42 compensation, shall elect officers and adopt rules and 43 regulations, and shall fix a regular meeting date, but may provide 44 for special meetings. The commission shall keep minutes of its proceedings as are necessary to carry out its responsibilities. 45 Α 46 quorum of the commission shall consist of four (4) members. Any member of the commission may be disqualified and 47 (4) 48 removed from office for any one (1) of the following reasons:

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(d)

(a) Conviction of a felony; or

50 (b) Failure to attend three (3) consecutive meetings 51 without just cause.

(5) Before entering on the duties of the office appointed, 52 53 each member of the commission shall enter into and give bond to be approved by the Secretary of State of the State of Mississippi, in 54 the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) conditioned on the 55 satisfactory performance of his duties. This bond premium shall 56 be paid from the Tourism Commission's funds and payable to the 57 58 City of Hattiesburg in the event of a breech thereof. Suit may be brought by the city for benefit of the commission. 59

60 Section 4. The commission shall have jurisdiction and

61 authority over all matters relating to establishing, promoting and 62 developing tourism in the city and shall be authorized:

(a) To acquire, own, furnish, equip, staff and operate
any and all facilities and equipment necessary or usable in the
promotion of tourism for the City of Hattiesburg;

(b) To receive and expend revenues from any source,
including, but not limited to, private enterprise and those
revenues generated by this act;

69 (c) To own, lease or contract for any equipment useful 70 and necessary in the promotion of tourism and convention business 71 for the City of Hattiesburg;

(d) To sell, convey and otherwise dispose of all or any
part of its property and assets in accordance with the General
Laws of the State of Mississippi; and

75 (e) To have and exercise all powers necessary or 76 convenient to effect any and all of the purposes for which the 77 commission is organized, including the appointment and employment 78 of individuals acting on behalf of the commission.

79 Section 5. (1) For the purpose of providing operating funds 80 for the commission to promote tourism, the governing authorities 81 are hereby authorized, in their discretion, to levy, assess and collect from every person, firm or corporation operating hotels 82 83 and motels in the City of Hattiesburg, and in addition to all 84 other taxes now imposed, an amount not to exceed two percent (2%) of the gross proceeds from overnight room rental, exclusive of 85 86 charges for food, telephone, laundry, beverages and similar 87 charges.

88 (2) Persons liable for the tax imposed herein shall add the
89 amount of the tax to the aforesaid room rentals and collect the
90 same.

91 (3) The tax collected shall be paid to the State Tax
92 Commission on a form prescribed in the same manner that state
93 sales taxes are computed, collected and paid; and the full

94 enforcement provisions and all other provisions of Chapter 65, 95 Title 27, Mississippi Code of 1972, shall apply as necessary to 96 the implementation and administration of this act.

97 (4) The proceeds of such tax shall be paid to the City of
98 Hattiesburg on or before the fifteenth day of the month following
99 the month in which collected.

100 (5) Proceeds of the tax shall not be considered by the City 101 of Hattiesburg as General Fund revenues, but shall be dedicated 102 solely for the purpose of carrying out the programs and activities 103 of the Tourism Commission.

104 (6) Before the taxes authorized by this act may be imposed, 105 the governing authorities shall adopt a resolution declaring its 106 intention to levy the taxes and establishing the amount of the tax 107 levy and the date on which the taxes initially shall be levied and 108 collected. The date shall be the first day of a month but not 109 less than forty-five (45) days from the date of adoption of the 110 resolution. Notice of the proposed tax levy shall be published once each week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in a 111 112 newspaper having a general circulation in such city. The first 113 publication of such notice shall be made not less than twenty-one 114 (21) days prior to the date fixed in the resolution on which the governing authorities propose to levy such taxes, and the last 115 116 publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to 117 such date. If, within the time of giving notice, twenty percent (20%) or fifteen hundred (1500), whichever is less, of the 118 119 qualified electors of the city file a written petition against the levy of such taxes, then such taxes shall not be levied unless 120 authorized by a majority of the qualified electors of such city 121 122 voting at an election to be called and held for that purpose. Prior to the effective date of the tax levy approved as herein 123 124 provided, the governing authorities shall furnish to the Chairman of the State Tax Commission a certified copy of the resolution 125 126 evidencing such tax levy.

Section 6. (1) This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

130 (2) This act shall stand repealed from and after September131 30, <u>2004</u>.

132 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 133 and after its passage.
