SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 546
(As Adopted by Senate)

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE OF BETTY J.
2 BRUMFIELD, OF SUMMIT, MISSISSIPPI, RETIRED FAMILY PAGE EDITOR AT
3 THE ENTERPRISE-JOURNAL AND EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE
4 LEGISLATURE.

5 WHEREAS, Mrs. Betty Jane Dial Brumfield of Summit,
6 Mississippi, a retired family page editor at The
7 Enterprise-Journal, passed away on Sunday, October 31, 1999; and

8 WHEREAS, Betty was a Wabash, Arkansas, native who moved to
9 Pike County from Memphis in 1941, graduated from McComb High
10 School and attended the Memphis Academy of Arts; and

11 WHEREAS, she was an active and dedicated member of Church of
12 the Mediator for several years where she taught Sunday school and
13 was a member of the Altar Guild; and

14 WHEREAS, Betty was involved in community activities and
15 worked with special children's activities at the Pike County
16 Library, was a life member and past president of the Junior
17 Auxiliary, past president of the Pike County Heart Association,
18 was a 17-year Girl Scout leader, spent 18 years in the McComb
19 Parent-Teacher Association, was a board member of the Pike County
20 Chamber of Commerce, was a member of Mississippi Press Women and
21 National Federation of Press Women, was a member of Colonial Dames
22 XVII Century and was the 1975 Junior Auxiliary Azalea Ball Queen;

24 WHEREAS, she began working at The Enterprise-Journal in 1963
25 and received several awards for work as the family page editor;

27 WHEREAS, her daughter, Patsy Brumfield, is the long-time

28 reading clerk and press secretary for the Mississippi Senate, and
29 Patsy has recalled many stories about her mother's humorous
30 character and that she was a fan of country music artist Willie
31 Nelson; and

32 WHEREAS, Betty was the widow of Robert Love Brumfield, and
33 other survivors include a son, Bill, daughter, Suzy and five
34 grandchildren; and

35 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of this
36 wonderful person who touched many lives and was such a fine
37 example of community and charitable spirit:

38 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
39 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
40 we do hereby commend the life of Betty J. Brumfield of Summit,
41 Mississippi, and express the sympathy of the Legislature on her
42 passing.
