A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1 109, MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890, TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROHIBITION OF A PUBLIC OFFICIAL FROM HAVING ANY INTEREST IN A 2 3 4 CONTRACT WITH ANY BOARD OF WHICH HE IS A MEMBER SHALL NOT APPLY TO 5 CITIES WITH A POPULATION LESS THAN 2,000. б BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF 7 MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi 8 Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the 9 state: Amend Section 109, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read 10 11 as follows: Section 109. (1) No public officer or member of the 12 13 Legislature shall be interested, directly or indirectly, in any 14 contract with the state, or any district, county, city, or town thereof, authorized by any law passed or order made by any board 15 of which he may be or may have been a member, during the term for 16 which he shall have been chosen, or within one (1) year after the 17 expiration of such term. 18 (2) This section does not apply to any city or town with a 19 population of less than two thousand (2,000). 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at 2.2 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday 23
