SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 580 (As Adopted by Senate)

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO COMMEND ANDREW LARK, JR., UPON THE 2 OCCASION OF HIS RECEIPT OF A 2000 GOVERNOR'S AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE 3 IN THE ARTS.

WHEREAS, at age 36, Andrew Lark, Jr., is already making
headlines for his innovative approach to teaching visual arts at
Starkville High School; and

7 WHEREAS, in 1999, his students received more gold medals than 8 any other school or school district has ever received in the 9 history of the Mississippi Regional Scholastic Art Competition; 10 and

11 WHEREAS, 22 of his students received gold medals, and two of 12 the five American Vision Awards for best of show went to 13 Starkville High students; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Lark has said that he instills in his students 14 the idea that their creation is not a project, but a work of art, 15 and that, in his classroom, students are treated as artists; and 16 WHEREAS, his expectations of his students are high, and they 17 respond to his high expectations with growth as artists; and 18 WHEREAS, it is Mr. Lark's philosophy that art is a powerful 19 20 tool, and that, while creativity cannot be taught, a teacher can unlock his students' creativity; and 21 WHEREAS, reaching beyond the regular classroom, Mr. Lark has 22 taught art to children as coordinator for the "Artist Is In" 23 program in Itta Bena, where he taught photography to the local 24

25 youth in a summer session; and

26 WHEREAS, he also served as a counselor at the Leflore County

31 WHEREAS, Mr. Lark continues his work with his students during 32 summer vacation, voluntarily providing the guidance and 33 encouragement they need to develop their artistic talents and 34 skills; and

35 WHEREAS, he also involves donors from across the country who 36 recognize his resourcefulness as a visual arts educator and who 37 support his work in the classroom with a constant flow of generous 38 donations of art materials and equipment; and

39 WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Legislature to recognize 40 and commend the dedication of such an outstanding educator, who 41 has devoted uncounted hours and unceasing energy for the 42 betterment of his students:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That we do hereby commend Mr. Andrew Lark, Jr., upon his receipt of the Arts Education Award of the 2000 Governor's Awards for Excellence in the Arts.
