SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 634
(As Adopted by Senate)

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING DR.
2 MELVIN I. EVANS FOR 30 YEARS OF SERVICE TO JACKSON STATE
3 UNIVERSITY AND TO HIS COMMUNITY.

4 WHEREAS, Dr. Melvin I. Evans has had a stellar career in
5 education, having served as Chair of the Department of Health,
6 Physical Education and Recreation at Jackson State University for
7 the past 30 years; and

8 WHEREAS, the faculty and staff of Jackson State University
9 will host a "Banquet/Roast" in honor of Dr. Evans on Monday, May
10 8, 2000, and will establish a scholarship in his honor; and

11 WHEREAS, his career has spanned over 45 years and he has
12 contributed immensely to his profession, church and community at
13 large; and

14 WHEREAS, he holds a B.S. degree from Allen University, a
15 Master's degree from Springfield College and a Doctorate from
16 Oklahoma State University, he received certification from Yale
17 University School of Medicine, Department of Psychiatry as a Drug
18 Educator, the University of Georgia as a Specialist in Alcoholism,
19 and Rutgers University in Comprehensive Health, and his
20 professional experiences include: instructor, department chair
21 and assistant athletic coach, Sterling High School, Greenville,
22 S.C.; instructor, Physical Education, Health, General Science and
23 athletic coach, Howard High School, Georgetown, S.C.; Chairman and
24 Athletic Director, Department of Physical Education and
25 Recreation, Choppe High School, Georgetown, S.C.; Assistant
26 Professor of Physical Education, head track coach, head football

27 coach, and head basketball coach at Allen University; Dean of Men,
28 Allen University; Acting Chair, Department of Physical Education
29 and Recreation, Maryland State College; and Administrative
30 Assistant to Director of Student Union and Assistant to the Dean
31 of Students (graduate assistant), Oklahoma State University; and

32 WHEREAS, Mel belongs to or has been a member of the following

75 the Mississippi Alliance; he has been honored by many
76 organizations including his Alma Mata, Certificate of Appreciation
77 and Athletics Hall of Fame, Kappa Alpha PSI Kappa Man of the Year,
78 Optimist International Outstanding Club President and Lt.
79 Governor; Clinton NAACP Outstanding Civic Award, and Salutation
80 from the Garden Club of Jackson; he is a sought-after speaker not
81 only in the professional area but also in the religious arena; he
82 has been a certified basketball and football official in the
83 states of South Carolina, Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania and
84 Mississippi; and

85 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the
86 contributions of this individual who has brought honor to his
87 institution, his community and to the State of Mississippi:

88 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
89 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
90 we do hereby join the faculty of Jackson State University in
91 commending and congratulating Dr. Melvin I. Evans for 30 years of
92 service to Jackson State University and to his community, and wish
