Gordon, Georgia; and 17 WHEREAS, he has since been employed by Seabrook Paint Company 18 of Mississippi, serving as President of the company since 1971; 19 20 and WHEREAS, he is married to the former Judy Jens of Tupelo, 21 22 Mississippi; they have three children, one of whom is an Eagle Scout, and two grandchildren; and 23 WHEREAS, Mr. Seabrook has been intensely involved in scouting 24 activities for many years; he has served as Assistant Scoutmaster, 25 26 Unit Commissioner, District Roundtable Commissioner, District

46 WHEREAS, to honor Mr. Seabrook, this year's class of Eagle 47 Scouts was named for him in recognition of his longtime scouting 48 volunteer activities; and

WHEREAS, this honor was bestowed during the Council's Year 49 2000 Eagle Scout Banquet, which was attended by more than 400 50 Eagle Scouts, parents, volunteers and community professionals; and 51 52 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Mississippi Senate to 53 recognize and commend selfless devotion to volunteer causes such as demonstrated by Mr. Seabrook, who as a volunteer has devoted so 54 55 much time and energy in supporting our youth, who are the future 56 of this great state:
