SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 28  
(As Adopted by Senate)

1 A RESOLUTION TO COMMEND CHALMERS PATTON "PAT" SEABROOK, JR.,  
2 FOR HIS INVOLVEMENT WITH AND DEDICATION TO THE BOY SCOUTING  
3 PROGRAM.

4 WHEREAS, Chalmers Patton "Pat" Seabrook, Jr., was born in  
5 Memphis, Tennessee, on August 29, 1937; and

6 WHEREAS, in 1941 he moved to Jackson where he attended  
7 Jackson Public Schools; and

8 WHEREAS, while in school during the 1950's, Pat was a Boy  
9 Scout with Troop 15 at First Christian Church, attaining the rank  
10 of Life, and enjoying many great camping experiences at Camp  
11 Kickapoo; and

12 WHEREAS, upon graduation from Central High School, he  
13 attended Vanderbilt University, and in 1959 received a B.A. in  
14 Business Administration; and

15 WHEREAS, Mr. Seabrook entered the United States Army after  
16 college, graduating in 1960 from the U.S. Army Provost Marshal  
17 General Center at Ft. Gordon, Georgia; and

18 WHEREAS, he has since been employed by Seabrook Paint Company  
19 of Mississippi, serving as President of the company since 1971;  
20 and

21 WHEREAS, he is married to the former Judy Jens of Tupelo,  
22 Mississippi; they have three children, one of whom is an Eagle  
23 Scout, and two grandchildren; and

24 WHEREAS, Mr. Seabrook has been intensely involved in scouting  
25 activities for many years; he has served as Assistant Scoutmaster,  
26 Unit Commissioner, District Roundtable Commissioner, District

27 Camporee Chief, Instructor Council Train the Trainer Conference -  
28 1981, Council Camporee Program Chairman - 1980, Council Camporee  
29 Program Chairman - 1985, Co-Chairman Council Camporee - 1995,  
30 Council Popcorn Chairman - 1991 and 1992, and presently serves as  
31 a camp evaluator for Region 8 of B.S.A. Southern Region; and

32 WHEREAS, Mr. Seabrook has received many scouting honors from  
33 his years of involvement with Boy Scouts of America, is an Order  
34 of the Arrow Ordeal member, and has received the Arrowhead Honor,  
35 the Scouters Key, the District Award of Merit and was named as  
36 Silver Beaver in 1986; and

37 WHEREAS, he is most active in community affairs, having  
38 served as Chairman of the Board of the Downtown YMCA, a member of  
39 the Executive Board of Andrew Jackson Council Boy Scouts of  
40 America, the President of Mid-City Business Association, a  
41 Director of the Rotary Club of Jackson, a Dealer Advisory Council  
42 Member for Benjamin Moore Paint Company, and is a member of  
43 Meadowbrook Church of Christ where he has served as a Sunday  
44 School Teacher, Deacon, Adult Education Supervisor and Facilities  
45 Chairman; and

46 WHEREAS, to honor Mr. Seabrook, this year's class of Eagle  
47 Scouts was named for him in recognition of his longtime scouting  
48 volunteer activities; and

49 WHEREAS, this honor was bestowed during the Council's Year  
50 2000 Eagle Scout Banquet, which was attended by more than 400  
51 Eagle Scouts, parents, volunteers and community professionals; and

52 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Mississippi Senate to  
53 recognize and commend selfless devotion to volunteer causes such  
54 as demonstrated by Mr. Seabrook, who as a volunteer has devoted so  
55 much time and energy in supporting our youth, who are the future  
56 of this great state:

57 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF  
58 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby congratulate Chalmers Patton "Pat"  
59 Seabrook, Jr., upon the honor bestowed upon him by the Boy Scouts,  
60 and commend him for his years of dedication and hard work in  
61 volunteering with the youth who participate in scouting.
