1 2	A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE OF DR. WILLIAM H. LINDLEY AND EXTENDING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY UPON HIS PASSING.
3	WHEREAS, Dr. William H. Lindley, a Vicksburg veterinarian for
4	67 years whose life's work provided the basis for the city's Great
5	Animal Adventures Children's Museum, died Sunday, February 20,
6	2000; and
7	WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley was born in Asheville, North Carolina,
8	the son of the late Robert Thomas and Luvina Delle Adams Lindley;
9	and
10	WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley and his family moved to Vicksburg in
11	1919, and he received his degree in veterinary medicine from
12	Kansas State University in Manhattan, Kansas; and
13	WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley practiced in Indiana and in Vicksburg
14	before entering the Army Air Corps in 1942 and then founded
15	Vicksburg Animal Hospital in 1946; and
16	WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley was known throughout the South as an
17	expert in swine production and was one of the most thorough
18	diagnosticians in Mississippi; and
19	WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley also served as a preceptor for
20	Mississippi's veterinary medical school and helped many young vet
21	students learn clinical practice to go along with the theory and
22	scientific information they learned in school; and
23	WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley was a prolific writer and contributed to

scientific journals, was the author of four books and many poems

and wrote many letters to the editor for <a href="The Vicksburg Post">The Vicksburg Post</a>; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley was a member of the Trail Dusters and

- 28 Society and the Vicksburg Rotary Club; and
- 29 WHEREAS, in the later years of his life, Dr. Lindley began
- 30 collecting artifacts, teaching materials and other items dealing
- 31 with veterinary medicine and the contributions animals have made
- 32 to human well-being and human health; and
- 33 WHEREAS, that collection formed the basis of what is now the
- 34 Great Animal Adventures Children's Museum in Vicksburg; and
- 35 WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley's honors included Veterinarian of the
- 36 Year and serving in every office of the Mississippi State
- 37 Veterinary Association, including president; and
- 38 WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley was married to the former Olga Jarvis
- 39 for 55 years, until her death in 1992; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Lindley is survived by two daughters, Suzanne L.
- 41 Williamson and Markie Lindley, two grandsons, Mark R. Williamson
- 42 and Todd L. Williamson, and a son-in-law, Billy Williamson; and
- WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Legislature to recognize and
