31	Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting
32	in lieu thereof the following:
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34	SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section
35	37-143-6, Mississippi Code of 1972:
36	37-143-6. (1) There is established a medical education
37	scholarship program, which shall be administered by the Board of
38	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning. The program
39	shall provide a certain number of eligible applicants each year
40	with a full scholarship to obtain a medical education at the
41	University of Mississippi School of Medicine at no cost to the
42	recipient, if the recipient meets the conditions upon which the
43	scholarship is granted.
44	(2) The program shall provide scholarships to up to twenty
45	(20) new recipients each year, and the program shall be funded
46	from monies appropriated from the Health Care Expendable Fund
47	established under Section 43-13-407 and from any other funds
48	appropriated to or otherwise made available to the board of
49	trustees for that purpose. The amounts that may be expended
50	annually for scholarships under the program shall not exceed the
51	following: Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) in fiscal
52	year 2001; One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in fiscal year
53	2002; One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars in fiscal year

54 2003; and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in fiscal year 2004 55 and in any later fiscal year.

56 (3) The scholarship shall be in an amount that will pay the full cost of attendance, as defined by federal law and regulation, 57 58 at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine for the entire time necessary for the recipient to complete the requirements for 59 60 a medical degree. The actual amount of the scholarship shall be determined by the Office of Financial Aid of the University of 61 Mississippi Medical Center but shall not exceed Twenty Five 62 63 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per year for any recipient.

64 (4) Before being granted a scholarship, each applicant shall enter into a contract with the board of trustees, which shall be 65 deemed a contract with the State of Mississippi, agreeing to the 66 67 terms and conditions upon which the scholarship will be granted. 68 In order to receive a scholarship under the program, the recipient must agree in the contract to practice family medicine for a 69 70 period of not less than ten (10) years after completion of his or 71 her residency in an area of the state that is a critical needs area for primary medical care at the time of the recipient's entry 72 73 into medical practice. The determination and designation of the areas of the state that are critical needs areas for primary 74 75 medical care shall be made by a committee to be known as the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee, which shall be composed of 76 77 the following persons: the Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs of the University of Mississippi Medical Center, who shall be 78 chairman of the committee; the Executive Director of the State 79 Department of Health; the Executive Director of the Division of 80 81 Medicaid; the President of the Mississippi State Medical Association or his designee; the President of the Mississippi 82 State Hospital Association or his designee; and the Director of 83 84 the Mississippi Primary Health Care Association or his designee. The committee shall meet at least once annually to determine and 85 86 designate the areas of the state that are critical needs areas for primary medical care in which scholarship recipients may practice 87 88 family medicine in order to fulfill their contractual obligation.

89 In designating those critical needs areas, the committee shall 90 consider, but shall not be limited to, areas that are:

91 (a) A Group 1 degree-of-shortage health professional
92 shortage area for primary medical care, as designated by the
93 United States Department of Health and Human Services;

94 (b) Classified as a rural area by the United States95 Census Bureau; and

96 (c) Located more than fifty (50) miles from any 97 standard metropolitan statistical area, as defined and established 98 by the United States Census Bureau, and from any incorporated 99 municipality having a population of twenty-five thousand (25,000) 100 or more, according to the most recent federal decennial census.

101 (5) If a scholarship recipient leaves the University of 102 Mississippi School of Medicine before graduation, or leaves his or 103 her residency before completion, or fails to practice family 104 medicine for a period of ten (10) years in a critical needs area 105 for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care 106 Critical Needs Committee under subsection (4) of this section, the full amount that the recipient received under the scholarship 107 108 shall be due and payable within ninety (90) days, together with 109 interest. The amount of interest due shall be equal to the annual 110 rate of return on the Health Care Trust Fund established under Section 43-13-405 for each year from the time the recipient 111 112 received the scholarship money until the time the scholarship money is repaid. The board of trustees may bring suit against any 113 scholarship recipient to recover the amount due to the state under 114 this section for the recipient's failure to comply with the 115 116 conditions upon which the scholarship was granted, as provided in 117 this section and in the contract between the recipient and the board of trustees. The board of trustees is authorized to 118 119 postpone or forgive the repayment of all or part of the amount that a recipient received under the scholarship and the interest 120 that would otherwise be due under this subsection if the 121 recipient's failure to comply with the conditions upon which the 122 123 scholarship was granted was due to circumstances beyond the

124 recipient's control that caused the recipient to be physically 125 unable to comply with those conditions, such as suffering a severe 126 illness, injury or other disabling condition.

127 (6) The board of trustees shall establish such rules and
128 regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry out the
129 purposes and intent of this section.

SECTION 2. (1) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions 130 131 of Higher Learning shall prescribe rules and regulations which, subject to available appropriations, provide for reimbursement to 132 133 licensed physicians who practice family medicine in a critical 134 needs area for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee under subsection (4) of Section 135 37-143-6, for the expenses of moving when the employment 136 137 necessitates the relocation of the physician or his family to a 138 different geographical area than that in which the physician If the reimbursement is approved, the board of trustees 139 resides. 140 shall provide funds to reimburse the physician an amount not to 141 exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the documented actual expenses incurred in the course of relocating, including the 142 143 expense of any professional moving company or persons employed to 144 assist with the move, rented moving vehicles or equipment, mileage 145 in the amount authorized for state employees under Section 25-3-41 if the physician used his personal vehicle for the move, meals and 146 147 such other expenses associated with the relocation in accordance with the established rules and regulations. 148

(2) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 149 Learning shall prescribe rules and regulations which, subject to 150 151 available appropriations, provide for reimbursement to licensed 152 physicians who practice family medicine in a critical needs area for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care 153 154 Critical Needs Committee under subsection (4) of Section 37-143-6, for the direct expenses associated with starting a full-time 155 medical practice, including the cost of building, lease payments, 156 equipment purchases, furniture, medical supplies and medical 157 158 malpractice insurance associated with a family practice. If the

reimbursement is approved, the board of trustees shall provide funds to reimburse the physician an amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) over a two-year period for the documented actual expenses incurred in starting the physician's practice.

(3) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 164 165 Learning shall prescribe rules and regulations which, subject to 166 available appropriations, provide for income subsidies for 167 licensed physicians who practice family medicine full time in a 168 critical needs area for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee under subsection (4) of 169 Section 37-143-6, to recognize the reduced earning capacity 170 associated with practicing in a rural area. If the income subsidy 171 172 is approved, the board of trustees shall provide funds to 173 compensate the physician in an amount not to exceed Twenty 174 Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) annually for two (2) years.

175 SECTION 3. (1) Any licensed physician who practices family 176 medicine full time in any critical needs area for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee 177 178 under subsection (4) of Section 37-143-6 shall be allowed a credit 179 against the taxes imposed by this chapter in an amount equal to 180 fifty percent (50%) of the physician's income tax liability that results from income derived from his or her practice in any such 181 182 critical needs area. The credit shall be allowed for a maximum of ten (10) years for all family medicine practice in any such 183 184 critical needs areas in which the physician practices during his 185 or her career.

186 (2) Subsection 1 of this section shall be codified as a new
187 section in Article 1, Chapter 7, Title 27, Mississippi Code of
188 1972.

189 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 190 and after July 1, 2000, except that Section 3 of this act shall 191 take effect and be in force from and after January 1, 2000.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 37-143-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 21972, TO ESTABLISH A MEDICAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM TO 3 PROVIDE UP TO 20 NEW RECIPIENTS EACH YEAR WITH A FULL SCHOLARSHIP 4 TO OBTAIN A MEDICAL EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI 5 SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AT NO COST; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM SHALL 6 BE ADMINISTERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF 7 HIGHER LEARNING; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM SHALL BE FUNDED FROM 8 MONIES APPROPRIATED FROM THE HEALTH CARE EXPENDABLE FUND; TO 9 PROVIDE THAT SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS MUST AGREE TO PRACTICE FAMILY 10 MEDICINE FOR AT LEAST TEN YEARS IN AN AREA OF THE STATE THAT IS A 11 CRITICAL NEEDS AREA FOR PRIMARY MEDICAL CARE; TO ESTABLISH A 12 COMMITTEE THAT WILL ANNUALLY DETERMINE AND DESIGNATE THE CRITICAL 13NEEDS AREAS IN WHICH SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS MAY PRACTICE IN ORDER 14TO FULFILL THEIR CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATION; TO PROVIDE THAT IF A 15 SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT LEAVES MEDICAL SCHOOL OR HIS OR HER 16 RESIDENCY BEFORE COMPLETION OR LEAVES PRACTICING FAMILY MEDICINE 17 IN A CRITICAL NEEDS AREA BEFORE THE END OF TEN YEARS, THE FULL 18 AMOUNT THAT THE RECIPIENT RECEIVED UNDER THE SCHOLARSHIP SHALL BE 19 DUE AND PAYABLE WITHIN 90 DAYS, TOGETHER WITH INTEREST; TO PROVIDE 20 FOR THE REIMBURSEMENT OF RELOCATION EXPENSES FOR PHYSICIANS TO 21 MOVE AND PRACTICE FAMILY MEDICINE IN AN CRITICAL NEEDS AREA; TO 22 PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT OF START-UP EXPENSES AND MEDICAL 23 MALPRACTICE INSURANCE PREMIUMS FOR PHYSICIANS WHO PRACTICE FAMILY 24 MEDICINE IN AN CRITICAL NEEDS AREA; TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT OF 25 ANNUAL INCOME SUBSIDIES FOR PHYSICIANS WHO PRACTICE FAMILY 26MEDICINE FULL TIME IN A CRITICAL NEEDS AREA; TO PROVIDE A CREDIT 27 AGAINST STATE INCOME TAXES FOR PHYSICIANS WHO PRACTICE FAMILY 28 MEDICINE FULL TIME IN A CRITICAL NEEDS AREA; AND FOR RELATED 29 PURPOSES.
