13	SECTION 1. Section 73-65-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
14	reenacted and amended as follows:
15	73-65-1. As used in this chapter, unless the context
16	otherwise requires:
17	(a) "Board" means the State Board of Health;
18	(b) " <u>Licensed</u> professional art therapist" means a
19	person who has completed a master's or doctoral degree program in
20	art therapy, or an equivalent course of study, from an accredited
21	educational institution and who is <u>licensed</u> by the <u>State Board of</u>
22	<u>Health</u> , or who received registration from the American Art Therapy
23	Association (ATR) before 1980;
24	(c) " <u>License</u> holder" means a <u>licensed</u> professional art
25	therapist <u>licensed</u> under the provisions of this chapter;
26	(d) "Accredited institution" means a university or
27	college accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency
28	of institutions of higher education, or an institution or clinical
29	program approved by the American Art Therapy Association, Inc.
30	SECTION 2. Section 73-65-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
31	reenacted and amended as follows:
32	73-65-3. (1) There is created the Professional Art

- 33 Therapists Advisory Council. The purpose of the council is to
- 34 advise the State Board of Health on matters relating to the
- 35 administration and interpretation of the provisions of this
- 36 chapter. The council shall consist of three (3) members who are
- 37 professional art therapists <u>licensed</u> pursuant to Section 73-65-7
- 38 and who have engaged in art therapy practice for at least five (5)
- 39 years and two (2) members shall be family members of consumers of
- 40 art therapy services. All council members shall be citizens of
- 41 the United States and residents of Mississippi. The initial
- 42 council members who are not family members of consumers shall meet
- 43 requirements for <u>licensure</u> and be <u>licensed</u> within one (1) year
- 44 after July 1, 2000. Beginning July 1, 2000, each council member
- 45 who is not a family member of a consumer shall be <u>licensed</u> as an
- 46 art therapist before appointment and shall be actively engaged in
- 47 the practicing or teaching of art therapy. The initial council
- 48 members shall be appointed by the board for the following terms:
- 49 one (1) member shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year; one
- 50 (1) member shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years; two (2)
- 51 members shall be appointed for terms of three (3) years; and one
- 52 (1) member shall be appointed for a term of four (4) years. After
- 53 the expiration of the initial terms, all subsequent members of the
- 54 council shall be appointed by the board for terms of four (4)
- 55 years.
- 56 (2) Members of the council shall receive no compensation or
- 57 per diem for their service on the council, but may receive
- 58 reimbursement for travel expenses incurred in attending council
- 59 meetings, as provided in Section 25-3-41.
- 60 (3) The council shall elect annually from its membership a
- 61 chairman and any other officers as necessary to carry out its
- 62 duties. The council shall meet at least two (2) times each year.
- 63 Additional meetings may be called by the chairman, upon the
- 64 written request of at least two (2) members of the council. Three
- 65 (3) council members shall constitute a quorum of the council.
- SECTION 3. Section 73-65-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 67 reenacted and amended as follows:

- 68 73-65-5. The board shall:
- 69 (a) Promulgate regulations necessary to carry out the
- 70 provisions of this chapter;
- 71 (b) Require that all applicants register for, take and
- 72 pass the national board certification exam as administered by the
- 73 Art Therapy Credentials Board of the American Art Therapy
- 74 Association;
- 75 (c) Establish the application deadline for and score
- 76 required to pass the examination;
- 77 (d) Process applications and conduct and review the
- 78 required examinations;
- 79 (e) Issue <u>licenses</u> to applicants who meet the
- 80 requirements of Sections 73-65-7 through 73-65-13;
- 81 (f) Deny, suspend, or revoke a <u>license</u> to practice art
- 82 therapy;
- 83 (g) Censure, reprimand, or place a <u>license</u> holder or
- 84 applicant on probation for a period not to exceed one (1) year;
- 85 (h) Maintain a current register of <u>license</u> holders as a
- 86 matter of public record;
- 87 (i) Establish criteria for continuing education;
- 88 (j) Establish procedures for receiving, investigating,
- 89 and resolving complaints against <u>license</u> holders;
- 90 (k) Approve the level of supervision and experience
- 91 required for persons seeking <u>licensure</u>;
- 92 (1) Assess fees for the issuance and renewal of
- 93 <u>licenses</u> to cover expenses of the board in administering this
- 94 chapter;
- 95 (m) Implement an impaired professional art therapist
- 96 treatment program; and
- 97 (n) Adopt a code of ethics as established by the
- 98 American Art Therapy Association.
- 99 SECTION 4. Section 73-65-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 100 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 101 73-65-7. (1) The board shall issue a <u>license</u> as a <u>licensed</u>
- 102 professional art therapist to any person who files a completed

103 application, accompanied by the required fees, and who submits

104 satisfactory evidence that the applicant is at least twenty-one

105 (21) years of age, demonstrates professional competency by

106 satisfactorily passing the required examination, is a registered

107 art therapist as defined by the Art Therapy Credentials Board,

108 Inc., is a <u>licensed</u> art therapist as defined by the Art Therapy

109 Credentials Board, Inc., and has:

- 110 (a) Received a master's degree or doctoral degree in
  111 art therapy that includes six hundred (600) hours of supervised
  112 internship experience from an accredited institution and has
  113 completed an additional one thousand (1,000) client contact hours
- 114 of postgraduate experience under appropriate supervision; or
- 115 (b) Received a master's degree or doctoral degree in a
- 116 related field, has a minimum of twenty-one (21) semester hours of
- 117 sequential course work in the history, theory, and practice of art
- 118 therapy, has completed seven hundred (700) hours of supervised
- 119 internship experience from an accredited institution, and has
- 120 completed an additional two thousand (2,000) client contact hours
- 121 of postgraduate experience under appropriate supervision.
- 122 (2) The board may approve on a case-by-case basis applicants
- 123 who have a master's degree or a doctoral degree from nonaccredited
- 124 institutions.
- 125 (3) If an applicant has met all of the requirements for
- 126 <u>licensure</u> except satisfactorily passing the required examination,
- 127 the applicant shall be scheduled to take the next examination
- 128 following the approval of the examination.
- 129 (4) An applicant for <u>licensure</u> as a professional art
- 130 therapist may be <u>licensed</u> without examination if the applicant
- 131 files a completed application within one (1) year of July 1, 1998,
- 132 accompanied by the required fees, and if the board determines that
- 133 the applicant meets all other requirements for <u>licensure</u> as a
- 134 professional art therapist.
- 135 (5) The board may issue a <u>license</u> to an applicant without
- 136 examination if the person possesses a valid regulatory document
- 137 issued by the appropriate examining board under the laws of any

- 138 other state or territory of the United States, the District of
- 139 Columbia, or any foreign nation that in the judgment of the board
- 140 has requirements substantially equivalent to or exceeding the
- 141 requirements in this section.
- 142 (6) The board may issue provisional <u>licensure</u> as a
- 143 professional art therapist to any person who has completed the
- 144 educational requirements in subsection (1)(a) or (1)(b) of this
- 145 section and is fulfilling the client contact hours requirement,
- 146 but has not taken the examination or received registration from
- 147 the American Art Therapy Association (ATR).
- 148 (7) The board may set criteria for continuing education and
- 149 supervisory experience.
- SECTION 5. Section 73-65-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 151 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 73-65-9. (1) Each <u>license</u> holder shall renew the <u>license</u> to
- 153 practice art therapy biennially by submitting a renewal
- 154 application on a form provided by the board, paying a <u>license</u>
- 155 renewal fee, and producing evidence of completion of relevant
- 156 professional continuing education experience satisfactory to the
- 157 board, not to exceed forty (40) hours per renewal cycle.
- 158 (2) A ninety-day grace period shall be allowed for each
- 159 <u>license</u> holder after the <u>licensure</u> period, during which time the
- 160 <u>license</u> may be renewed upon payment of the renewal fee, the late
- 161 fee, and compliance with all renewal requirements.
- 162 (3) Any <u>license</u> granted by the board shall be automatically
- 163 suspended if the holder fails to apply for the <u>license</u> renewal
- 164 pursuant to this section within a period of three (3) months after
- 165 the renewal deadline; however, any suspended <u>license</u> may be
- 166 restored by the board upon payment of a reinstatement fee not to
- 167 exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) in addition to any unpaid
- 168 renewal or late fees. Failure to renew a <u>license</u> within three (3)
- 169 months from the date of suspension as provided in this section
- 170 shall cause the <u>license</u> to be automatically revoked.
- 171 Reinstatement of a revoked <u>license</u> shall require the <u>license</u>
- 172 holder to reapply and meet all current standards for <u>licensure</u>.

- 173 (4) A person <u>licensed</u> under the provisions of Section
- 174 73-65-7 who intends to retire as a <u>licensed</u> professional art
- 175 therapist shall notify the board in writing before the expiration
- 176 of his current <u>licensure</u>. If, within a period of five (5) years
- 177 from the year of retirement, the <u>license</u> holder wishes to resume
- 178 practice as a <u>licensed</u> professional art therapist, he shall notify
- 179 the board in writing, and upon giving proof of completing the
- 180 required continuing education and the payment of an amount
- 181 equivalent to elapsed renewal fees, the <u>license</u> shall be restored
- 182 in full effect.
- SECTION 6. Section 73-65-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 184 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 185 73-65-11. The board shall set the amount of the fees
- 186 required to be paid by applicants for <u>licensure</u> and <u>license</u>
- 187 holders including, but not limited to, the following:
- 188 (a) For an application for initial <u>licensure</u>, the fee
- 189 shall be nonrefundable and shall not exceed Two Hundred Dollars
- 190 (\$200.00);
- 191 (b) The renewal fee shall not exceed Two Hundred
- 192 Dollars (\$200.00);
- 193 (c) For a duplicate or replacement <u>license</u>, the fee
- 194 shall not exceed Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00);
- 195 (d) For failure to renew a <u>license</u> within the allotted
- 196 grace period pursuant to Section 73-65-9, the fee shall not exceed
- 197 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00); and
- 198 (e) Other reasonable fees for administrative services.
- 199 SECTION 7. Section 73-65-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 200 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 73-65-13. (1) The board may deny any application, or
- 202 suspend or revoke any <u>license</u> held or applied for under the
- 203 provisions of Section 73-65-7 if the person:
- 204 (a) Is found guilty of fraud, deceit, or
- 205 misrepresentation in procuring or attempting to procure a <u>license</u>
- 206 to practice art therapy;
- 207 (b) Is adjudicated mentally incompetent;

- 208 (c) Is found guilty of a felony or misdemeanor
- 209 involving moral turpitude;
- 210 (d) Is found guilty of unprofessional or unethical
- 211 conduct in this or any other jurisdiction;
- (e) Has been using any controlled substance or
- 213 alcoholic beverage to an extent or in a manner dangerous to the
- 214 person, any other person, or the public, or to an extent that the
- 215 use impairs the ability to perform as a <u>licensed</u> professional art
- 216 therapist;
- 217 (f) Has violated any provision of this chapter; or
- 218 (g) Willfully or negligently divulges a professional
- 219 confidence.
- 220 (2) A certified copy of the record of conviction shall be
- 221 conclusive evidence of the conviction.
- 222 (3) Disciplinary proceedings may be initiated upon the
- 223 receipt by the board of a sworn complaint by any person, including
- 224 members of the board.
- SECTION 8. Section 73-65-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 226 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 73-65-15. (1) The provisions of this chapter shall not
- 228 apply to persons licensed, certified, or registered under any
- 229 other provisions of Mississippi law, including, but not limited
- 230 to, physicians, social workers, psychologists, and nurses, or
- 231 students within accredited training programs of these professions.
- 232 The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to "activities
- 233 professionals" at licensed nursing facilities. Nothing in this
- 234 chapter shall be construed to limit, interfere with, or restrict
- 235 the practice, descriptions of services, or manner in which these
- 236 persons hold themselves out to the public.
- 237 (2) No person shall use the title "licensed professional art
- 238 therapist" or hold himself out as having this status, unless he is
- 239 <u>licensed</u> as such by the board.
- SECTION 9. Section 73-65-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 241 reenacted as follows:
- 242 73-65-17. Any person who violates the provisions of this

- 243 chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
- 244 thereof, shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars
- 245 (\$500.00), or sentenced to three (3) months in the county jail, or
- 246 both, for each violation.
- SECTION 10. Section 73-65-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 248 amended as follows:
- 249 73-65-19. Sections 73-65-1 through 73-65-17 shall stand
- 250 repealed on July 1, <u>2002</u>.
- 251 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 252 and after June 30, 2000.
