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20	SECTION 1. Section 73-36-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
21	amended as follows:
22	73-36-5. In order to benefit and protect the public and the
23	forest resources, no person in either public or private capacity
24	shall practice or offer to practice forestry, unless he shall
25	first have submitted evidence that he is qualified so to practice
26	and shall be registered by the board \star \star \star or unless he is
27	specifically exempted from registration under * * * this chapter.
28	It <u>is</u> unlawful for any person to practice or offer to practice
29	<u>forestry</u> in this state * * * , as defined by this chapter, or to
30	use in connection with his name or otherwise assume, use or
31	advertise any title or description tending to convey the
32	impression that he is a forester, unless <u>the</u> person has been duly
33	registered or is exempt from registration under * * * this
34	chapter.
35	This chapter shall not be construed to prevent or to affect:
36	(a) The conduct of business and support services
37	including: tree planting, timber stand improvement, pesticide
38	application, pest control, site preparation, heavy equipment
39	operation, prescribed fire application, timber buying, logging

40 <u>contracting</u>, timber <u>cruising</u>, timber <u>marking and the application</u>
41 <u>of best management practices</u>.

(b) The application of forestry principles and
procedures on any timberlands, woodlands or forest in which <u>the</u>
person, firm, partnership or corporation owns <u>the</u> timberlands,
woodlands or forest; or persons, firms, partnerships and
corporations having the right to manage and administer forestlands
in any legal manner.

(c) The work of an employee or a subordinate of any
forester holding a license under this chapter; <u>if</u> that *** * *** work
is done under the direction, supervision and responsibility of a
person holding a license under this chapter.

52 (d) The practice of forestry by officers and employees53 of the United States government on federally-owned lands.

54 (e) The practice of forestry by officers and employees55 of the State of Mississippi on state-owned lands.

(f) Employees of the federal government, state government and educational institutions of the State of Mississippi who, in the exercise of their assigned duties, conduct forestry education programs.

60 (g) Persons who hold valid licenses prior to July 1,61 1989.

62 SECTION 2. Section 73-36-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 63 amended as follows:

73-36-9. There is hereby created the State Board of 64 Registration for Foresters of the State of Mississippi for the 65 purposes of safeguarding forests by regulating the practice of 66 67 forestry and requiring that persons practicing or offering to practice forestry as a registered forester to be registered. The 68 board shall be composed of seven (7) members appointed by the 69 70 Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. One (1) member shall be appointed from each of the six (6) forestry 71 commission districts as * * * constituted on January 1, 1999, and 72 73 one (1) member shall be appointed at large. The State Forester of 74 Mississippi shall serve as an ex officio member of the board.

75 Each of the members shall be a forester within the meaning of this chapter with at least three (3) years' experience in such field, 76 77 and a resident and citizen of the State of Mississippi at the time of his appointment. Within thirty (30) days after the passage of 78 79 this chapter, the Governor shall appoint the members, designating a term of office of one (1), two (2), three (3), four (4) or five 80 81 (5) years for each of the members as appointed; provided, however, 82 two (2) members shall serve a term of one (1) year and two (2) shall serve a term of four (4) years. As the terms of office of 83 84 the members so appointed expire, successors shall be appointed for terms of five (5) years * * *. Any vacancy occurring in the 85 86 membership of the board shall be filled by the Governor for the 87 unexpired term * * *. The Governor shall have the right, upon the approval of a majority of the board, to remove any members of the 88 89 board for inefficiency, neglect of duty or dishonorable conduct.

90 SECTION 3. Section 73-36-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 91 amended as follows:

92 73-36-11. * * * No person shall * * * be appointed a member 93 of <u>the</u> board unless <u>the</u> person at the time appointed has held a 94 license as a registered forester for at least five (5) years. 95 SECTION 4. Section 73-36-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 96 amended as follows:

97 73-36-13. Each year the board shall elect one (1) of its 98 members as chairman, one (1) as vice chairman, and one (1) as secretary, and each shall perform the usual duties of such 99 100 offices. The board may adopt an official seal. Four (4) members 101 of the board shall constitute a quorum, and a majority vote of 102 those present at any meeting shall be necessary for the adoption 103 of any order proposed or the disposition of other business coming 104 before the board.

105 SECTION 5. Section 73-36-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 106 amended as follows:

107 73-36-15. * * * The board shall hold at least two (2)
108 regular meetings during each year and such other meetings as the
109 chairman may find necessary. Notice of the time and place of the

110 meetings of the board shall be mailed to each of the members of 111 the board at least five (5) days before <u>the</u> meeting and, in 112 addition, shall be posted as provided by the rules and regulations 113 of the board at least five (5) days prior to <u>the</u> meeting. 114 SECTION 6. Section 73-36-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 115 amended as follows:

73-36-17. Each member of the board shall receive per diem 116 117 compensation as authorized by Section 25-3-69, and shall be reimbursed for such other expenses at the same rate and under the 118 119 same conditions as provided for public officers and employees in Section 25-3-41. The board shall pay for all expenses incurred by 120 the board, including * * * clerical help as may be needed, if 121 itemized statements of the expenses are first approved by order of 122 the board entered on its minutes. The board shall not expend in 123 124 any fiscal year more monies than the amount of fees collected * * *. All fees * * * shall be paid to the secretary of 125 the board and the secretary shall deposit all monies received 126 under this chapter in the State Treasury. All such monies shall 127 128 be kept in a special fund in the State Treasury known as the 129 "State Board of Registered Foresters Fund" and shall be used for 130 the administration of this chapter. The funds shall not lapse at the end of each year. All expenditures from the fund shall be by 131 132 requisition to the Executive Director of the Department of Finance and Administration <u>and</u> signed by the board chairman * * *. 133 The secretary of the board shall be under a surety bond in the penal 134 sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) with a surety company 135 136 authorized to do business in this state, the bond to be 137 conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties, and the fee shall be paid by the board. 138

139 SECTION 7. Section 73-36-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 140 amended as follows:

141 73-36-19. (1) The State Board of Registration for Foresters
142 shall have the following powers and duties:

143 (a) To adopt rules and regulations governing the144 holding of its meetings, hearings, applications for licenses and

145 any and all other duties provided by this chapter.

(b) To establish and promulgate standards of practice and a code of ethics for registered foresters and provide for the enforcement thereof.

149 (c) To establish minimum requirements for professional150 continuing education.

(d) To prepare a biennial roster showing the names, business addresses and such other information as the board may deem necessary of all * * * foresters <u>registered under</u> * * * this chapter, and to provide copies * * * to the registered foresters and the public. A copy of <u>the</u> roster shall be filed with the Secretary of State of the State of Mississippi on or before April 1 in the year such roster is prepared.

158 (e) To issue, suspend or revoke licenses * * * and to
159 take all actions necessary * * *.

160 (2) At any hearing before the board, any member may 161 administer oaths to witnesses appearing before the board. If any person shall refuse to testify or to produce any books, papers or 162 163 documents, the board may present its petition to any court of 164 competent jurisdiction within the state setting forth the facts, 165 and then the court, in a proper case, may issue its subpoena to the person requiring his attendance before the court and * * * to 166 167 testify or to produce such books, papers and documents as may be 168 deemed necessary and pertinent thereto. Any person failing or 169 refusing to obey the subpoena of the court may be proceeded against in the same manner as for refusal to obey any other 170 171 subpoena of the court.

172 (3) The board shall keep a record of its proceedings and a register of all applications for registration. The register shall 173 174 show the name, age and residence of each applicant, the date of 175 the application and the board's action on the application and any 176 other information as may be deemed necessary by the board. The board shall submit an annual report to the Governor * * * and a 177 178 report to the regular session of the Legislature. The report to 179 the Legislature shall include a financial statement of the

180 transactions of the board during the year.

181 SECTION 8. Section 73-36-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 182 amended as follows:

183 73-36-21. Any person who has graduated with a bachelor's 184 degree or higher degree from a university or college of forestry 185 in a curriculum in forestry acceptable to the board and found by 186 the board to be substantially equivalent to curricula in schools 187 of forestry accredited by the Society of American Foresters shall be eligible for registration as a registered forester, and a 188 189 license shall be issued upon application and payment of the 190 required fee, <u>if the</u> person files an application for registration with the board and successfully passes a written and/or oral 191 192 examination.

SECTION 9. Section 73-36-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

195 73-36-23. Applications for registration shall be made on 196 forms prescribed and furnished by the board. The initial 197 registration fee for a license as a registered forester shall be 198 fixed by the board, but shall not exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). 199 <u>If</u> the board <u>denies</u> the issuance of a license to any applicant, 200 the fee deposited shall be retained by the board as an application 201 fee.

Each application or filing made under this section shall include the social security number(s) of the applicant in accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.

205 SECTION 10. Section 73-36-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 206 amended as follows:

207 73-36-27. The board shall issue a properly authenticated, 208 serially numbered license upon payment of the registration fee * * * to any applicant who in the opinion of the board has 209 210 satisfactorily met all the requirements of this chapter and the rules and regulations of the board duly adopted under * * * this 211 chapter. The issuance of a license by the board shall be evidence 212 213 that the person named therein is entitled to all the rights and 214 privileges of a registered forester while the * * * license

215 remains unrevoked or unexpired.

216 SECTION 11. Section 73-36-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 217 amended as follows:

73-36-29. All licenses issued under the provisions of this 218 219 chapter shall expire after December 31 of odd numbered years and shall become invalid <u>after</u> that date unless renewed. * * * The 220 221 secretary of the board <u>shall</u> mail a notice to every person 222 registered under this chapter notifying the person of the date of the expiration of his license and the amount of fee required for 223 224 its renewal for two (2) years. The notice shall be mailed to the 225 latest known address, according to the board's records, at least one (1) month in advance of the date of the expiration of the 226 227 license. The board shall from time to time fix the fee for 228 renewal of licenses, provided the fee shall not exceed the amount 229 of <u>One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)</u> for <u>two (2)</u> years' renewal. Any registrant failing to renew his license * * * and applying for a 230 license shall be required to pay a fee as set by the board not to 231 exceed twice the total amount of the license fees * * * had his 232 233 license been continued in effect, and also to comply with such 234 other reasonable requirements as may be established by rules and 235 regulations of the board * * *.

236 SECTION 12. Section 73-36-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 237 amended as follows:

73-36-31. A person not a resident of and having no 238 239 established place of business in Mississippi, or who has recently become a resident * * *, may use the title of registered forester 240 241 in Mississippi, provided: (a) such person is legally licensed as a registered forester in his own state or county and has submitted 242 evidence to the board that he is so licensed and that the 243 requirements for registration * * * are at least substantially 244 245 equivalent to the requirements of this chapter; and (b) the state 246 or county in which he is so licensed observes these same rules of reciprocity in regard to persons * * * licensed under * * * this 247 248 chapter. Each person seeking the privileges of reciprocity granted under this chapter shall submit his application * * * to 249

250 the board and must receive a card or certificate from the board 251 before exercising such privileges. The fee for obtaining * * * a 252 license through reciprocity shall be the same as charged a 253 Mississippi licensee.

254 SECTION 13. Section 73-36-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 255 amended as follows:

73-36-35. Any person who * * * practices or offers to 256 257 practice the profession of forestry in this state as a registered 258 forester without being registered in accordance with * * * this 259 chapter, or any person who * * * uses in connection with his name, or otherwise assume<u>s</u>, use<u>s</u> or advertise<u>s</u> any title or description 260 261 tending to convey the impression that he is a registered forester 262 without being registered in accordance with * * * this chapter, or 263 any person who * * * presents or attempts to use as his own the 264 license of another, or any person who * * * gives any false or 265 forged evidence of any kind to the board or any member * * * in 266 obtaining a license, or any person who * * * attempts to use an 267 expired or revoked license, or any person, firm, partnership or 268 corporation who * * * violates any of the provisions of this 269 chapter and has not been issued an administrative fine by the 270 board for the violation is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon 271 conviction, * * * shall be fined not more than <u>Ten Thousand</u> Dollars (\$10,000.00) for each * * * violation. The board, or any 272 273 person or persons as may be designated by the board to act in its 274 stead, is empowered to prefer charges for any violations of this 275 chapter in any court of competent jurisdiction. It shall be the duty of all duly constituted officers of the law of this state to 276 277 enforce the provisions of this chapter and to prosecute any 278 persons, firms, partnerships or corporations violating same. The 279 Attorney General of the state or his designated assistant shall act as legal advisor of the board and render such assistance as 280 281 may be necessary in carrying out the provisions of this chapter. 282 SECTION 14. Section 73-36-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 283 amended as follows:

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73-36-37. Sections 73-36-1 through 73-36-35, which create a

285 board of registration for foresters and prescribe its duties and 286 powers, shall stand repealed as of December 31, <u>2010</u>.

287 SECTION 15. The following shall be codified as Section 288 73-36-36, Mississippi Code of 1972:

289 73-36-36. In addition to the penalties provided under Section 73-36-33 and Section 73-36-35, any person, found by the 290 291 board to be in violation of this chapter or any rule or regulation 292 of the board, shall be subject to an administrative fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each violation. 293 294 The person shall be given at least ten (10) days written notice 295 and an opportunity for a hearing before the board. If the 296 administrative fine is not paid within ninety (90) days after the date of the board's order, the order shall become a judgment and 297 298 may be filed and executed. Any person aggrieved of the board's 299 order may appeal the order to the Circuit Court of Hinds County 300 within thirty (30) days after the date of the order of the board 301 is issued. Appeal shall be on the record made before the board. 302 SECTION 16. This act shall take effect and be in force from 303 and after July 1, 2000.
