## House Bill NO. 932

## By Senator(s) Committee

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting 8 in lieu thereof the following:

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- 10 SECTION 1. Section 19-5-319, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 11amended as follows:
- 19-5-319. (1) Automatic number identification (ANI),

  13 automatic location identification (ALI) and geographic automatic

  14 location identification (GeoALI) information that consist of the

  15 name, address and telephone number of telephone or wireless

  16 subscribers shall be confidential, and the dissemination of the

  17 information contained in the 911 automatic number and location

  18 data base is prohibited except for the following purpose: the

  19 information will be provided to the Public Safety Answering Point

  20 (PSAP) on a call-by-call basis only for the purpose of handling

  21 emergency calls or for training, and any permanent record of the

  22 information shall be secured by the Public Safety Answering Point

  23 (PSAP) and disposed of in a manner which will retain that

  24 security, except upon court order or subpoena from a court of

  25 competent jurisdiction or as otherwise provided by law.
- 26 (2) All emergency telephone calls and telephone call
  27 transmissions received pursuant to Section 19-5-301 et seq., and
  28 all recordings of the emergency telephone calls, shall remain
  29 confidential and shall be used only for the purposes as may be

30 needed for law enforcement, fire medical rescue or other emergency 31 services. These <u>recordings</u> shall not be released to any other 32 parties without court order or subpoena from a court of competent 33 jurisdiction.

34 (3) PSAP and emergency response entities shall maintain and, 35upon request, release a record of the date of call, time of call, 36the time the emergency response entity was notified, and the 37 identity of the emergency response entity. The emergency response 38 entity shall maintain and, upon request, release a record of the 39 date and time the call was received by the emergency response 40 entity and the time the emergency response entity arrived on the 41scene. Requests for release of records must be made in writing 42 and must specify the information desired. Requestors shall pay 43 the cost of providing the information requested in accordance with 44the Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983, Section 25-61-1, et 45 seq. The identity of any caller or person or persons who are the 46 subject of any call, or the address, phone number or other 47 identifying information about any such person, shall not be 48 released except as provided in subsection (2) of this section. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 49 50 and after July 1, 2000.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 19-5-319, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2TO REVISE THE REQUIREMENT THAT ALL EMERGENCY TELEPHONE (911) CALLS 3AND RECORDINGS THEREOF BE KEPT CONFIDENTIAL; TO MAKE 4NONIDENTIFYING RECORDS AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES.
