Based on data provided by the 46Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 47determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 48appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 49act. With respect to agency programs whose operation 295is dependent on the receipt of federal funds, it is the intent of 296the Legislature, except as hereinafter provided, that no funds 297 from the State General Fund be expended to administer, support or 298in any way continue such programs should federal funds for their 299 operation be reduced or become unavailable and that no funds from 300the State General Fund available for expenditure under this act 301 shall be used to replace federal funds in any major object of 302 expenditure.

303 SECTION 21. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 304State Department of Education and Vocational and Technical 305Education Division shall maintain complete accounting and 306personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 307appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 308same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 3092000. The Department of Finance and Administration shall insure

310 that financial controls comparable to those utilized for Fiscal 311 Year 2000 are maintained throughout Fiscal Year 2001 for this 312 agency. The State Personnel Board shall insure that personnel 313 controls and records comparable to those utilized for Fiscal Year 314 2000 are maintained throughout Fiscal Year 2001 for this agency. 315 It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's 316 budget request for Fiscal Year 2002 shall be submitted to the 317 Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail 318 comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the 319 Fiscal Year 2001 budget request process.

 333purpose of providing financial assistance for the education of
 334exceptional children as determined under Section 37-23-63,
 335Mississippi Code of 1972, children who are certified by the
 336designated authority as requiring inpatient care in a private
 337intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded or
 338psychiatric residential treatment facility, with Medicaid
 339reimbursement, shall be eligible and entitled to receive state
 340financial assistance under the provisions of Section 37-23-69, in
 341an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) from
 342state funds, per child per school year, if an approved private
 343school is operated as an integral part of the facility which
 344provides twenty-four (24) hours a day monitoring, treatment and

345 education, except that the State Department of Education is 346 authorized to pilot a fee-for-service based cost system for 347 children served through Millcreek Schools, Inc.

348 SECTION 25. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 349 of Sections 1 and 2, the amount of One Hundred Sixteen Million 350 Seventeen Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-one Dollars 351 (\$116,017,321.00) shall be derived from the Interim School 352 District Capital Expenditure Fund for the benefit of the school 353 districts as authorized in Senate Bill No. 2649, 1997 Regular 354 Session.

355 SECTION 26. Of the funds provided in Section 1, Five Hundred 356Sixty-four Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-two Dollars (\$564,492.00) 357 shall be used to provide for a Director of School Nurses in the 358State Department of Education and the implementation of three (3) 359pilot projects for a variety of school health programs in an 360 elementary school setting. Evaluations shall be developed to 361determine the program's effect to drop-out rates, suspensions, 362 expulsions, attendance and test scores.

Income generated by the school-based clinics shall remain 364available for expenditure by the programs utilizing any special 365fund authority provided in Section 2 for use by the State 366Department of Education and the pilots shall remain the same as in 367Fiscal Year 2000.

368 SECTION 27. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 369 State Department of Education shall have the authority to accept, 370 budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Thirty Million 371 Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), that become available to the department 372 to carry out the provisions of those funds in a manner consistent 373 with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and 374 Administration.

375 SECTION 28. The State Department of Education shall transfer 376the designated amounts to the appropriate entities, which shall 377assume full responsibility for the expenditure of these funds in 378accordance with state laws and accept all responsibility for any 379improper expenditure. For the following: National Guard Youth 380 Challenge Program, World Class Teacher Programs, USM Special 381 Education Program, Soil and Water Conservation Commission, 382 Mississippi School Boards Association, Mississippi Eye Screening 383 Program and Very Special Arts.

384 SECTION 29. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 10 and 11, 385 the Vocational and Technical Education Division of the State 386 Department of Education shall use Five Hundred Thousand Dollars 387 (\$500,000.00) to expand the Partners-in-Education Construction 388 Initiative Program to all vocational education centers in the 389 state, using the same curriculum and program as developed and 390 piloted by the Department of Education and the Mississippi 391 Construction Education Foundation.

392 SECTION 30. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 393 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 394 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 395 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 396 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 397 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 398 SECTION 31. This act shall take effect and be in force from 399 and after July 1, 2000.
