100 SECTION 5. The State Department of Education is authorized 101to transfer district allotments for insurance separately from 102regular Minimum Program allotments to insure funds are received by 103school districts for timely payment of premiums.

104 SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 105Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 106the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 107in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 108intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 109this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 110performance measures provided below:

- SECTION 7. Should revenues generated and deposited to the 147Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), 148Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section 14937-61-33(6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds 150appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of 151Education shall notify the Department of Finance and 152Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure 153expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.
- SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 155State Department of Education be allowed to receive, budget and 156 expend funds from any source available not to exceed Ten Million 157Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), that may become available to the 158 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the 159 Department of Finance and Administration.
- SECTION 9. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 161the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 162credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 163warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 164Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 165proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 166 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from 167 and after July 1, 2000.
