7 Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting 8 in lieu thereof the following:

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10 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 12Treasury to the credit of the Administrative Expense Account of 13the Public Employees' Retirement System for the purpose of 14defraying the administrative expenses of the Board of Trustees of 15the Public Employees' Retirement System, or out of any money in 16the State Treasury to the credit of the Retirement System Building 17Account of the Public Employees' Retirement System for the purpose 18of maintenance and general operation of the Retirement System 19Building, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending 20June 30, 2001......\$ 7,228,777.00.

21 SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 22Section 1, not more than the amounts set forth below shall be 23expended for the respective major objects or purposes of 24expenditure:

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With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 41 42the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 43 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 44Services" for Fiscal Year 2002 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2001 45 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 46are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2002 budget by the 47Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 48Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 49determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 50 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 51act. 52that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 53 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2001 appropriation for "Personal 54Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, 55the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 56action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected 57 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2001 "Personal Services" 58 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 59reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 60requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 61 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 62 63 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law. 64 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be

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65used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 66being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 67act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and 68 69allocated in Section 2 in the category "Personal Services: 70 Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits," not more than Fifty Thousand 71Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be used to pay overtime compensation 72 for work on data processing records after regular office hours. SECTION 4. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 73 74necessary while remaining within the project cost of Thirteen 75Million Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$13,260,000.00), is 76 hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the 77 credit of the Administrative Expense Account of the Public 78 Employees' Retirement System for the purpose of defraying the 79 expenses of implementing the information technology plan known as 80 "Genesis," for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, and ending 81June 30, 2001.....\$750,000.00.

SECTION 5. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 83the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 84credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 85warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 86Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 87proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 88 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from 89and after July 1, 2000.
