HOUSE BILL NO. 3

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-11-309, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 AS AMENDED BY HOUSE BILL NO. 1281, 2000 REGULAR SESSION, TO REDUCE THE PERCENTAGE USED TO CALCULATE THE AMOUNT OF RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES FROM THE SUPPLEMENTAL LEGISLATIVE RETIREMENT PLAN; TO 3 4 REINSTATE THE CAP ON THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF A RETIREMENT 5 б ALLOWANCE THAT A RETIREE MAY RECEIVE FROM THE SUPPLEMENTAL 7 LEGISLATIVE RETIREMENT PLAN AND THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM; TO AMEND SECTION 25-11-307, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, AS AMENDED BY HOUSE BILL NO. 1281, 2000 REGULAR SESSION, TO REDUCE 8 9 THE AMOUNT OF THE EMPLOYEE AND EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS UNDER THE 10 11 SUPPLEMENTAL LEGISLATIVE RETIREMENT PLAN; AND FOR RELATED 12 PURPOSES

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 25-11-309, Mississippi Code of 1972, as 14 amended by House Bill No. 1281, 2000 Regular Session, is amended 15 16 as follows:

25-11-309. The retirement allowance from the Supplemental 17 Legislative Retirement Plan shall consist of fifty percent (50%) 18 of an amount equal to the retirement allowance determined by 19 20 creditable service as an elected Senator or Representative of the 21 State Legislature or as President of the Senate payable by the Public Employees' Retirement System in accordance with Section 22 23 25-11-101 et seq. However, in no case shall the aggregate amount of the retirement allowance from the Supplemental Legislative 24 Retirement Plan and the Public Employees' Retirement System on 25 legislative service or service as President of the Senate exceed 26 27 one hundred percent (100%) of the average compensation. The percentage of the retirement allowance as provided in 28 this section shall be transferred from the annuity savings account 29

30 of the member and the employer accumulation account in the

31 Supplemental Legislative Retirement Plan to the retirement account 32 of the member in the Public Employees' Retirement System as 33 provided.

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35 SECTION 2. Section 25-11-307, Mississippi Code of 1972, as 36 amended by House Bill No. 1281, 2000 Regular Session, is amended 37 as follows:

25-11-307. (1) The Board of Trustees of the Public 38 Employees' Retirement System of Mississippi shall act as custodian 39 of the funds for members of the State Legislature and the 40 President of the Senate, and shall receive to the credit of such 41 42 fund all donations, bequests, appropriations, and all funds 43 available as an employer's contribution thereto from any source 44 whatsoever. The State Legislature shall each month deduct from 45 the compensation of each member three percent (3%) thereof, and shall pay the amount so deducted to the board of trustees to be 46 credited to the fund for the members. The compensation of each 47 48 member shall include all remuneration or amounts paid, except 49 mileage allowance. From the funds credited to this account, the 50 board of trustees shall pay retirement allowances, disability 51 benefits, survivors' benefits and expenses, and shall refund contributions as provided. The fund for the Supplemental 52 53 Legislative Retirement Plan shall be maintained as a separate fund, separate from all other funds held by the board of trustees 54 and shall be used only for the payment of benefits provided for by 55 56 the plan, or amendments thereto.

On account of each member there shall be paid monthly 57 (2) 58 into the fund for members of the Supplemental Legislative 59 Retirement Plan by the State Legislature from funds available an amount equal to a certain percentage of the compensation of each 60 member to be known as the "normal contributions," and an 61 62 additional amount equal to a percentage of his compensation to be 63 known as the "accrued liability contribution." The percentage rate of such contributions shall be fixed by the board of trustees 64 3 *HR03/R2* H. B. No.

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on the basis of the liabilities of the plan for the various
allowances and benefits as shown by the actuarial valuation.
Until changed by the board of trustees, the contribution rate
shall be <u>six and one-third percent (6-1/3%)</u> of the annual
compensation of all members, which shall include all remuneration
or amounts paid, except mileage allowance.

(3) The board of trustees is hereby authorized to deduct two percent (2%) of all employer's contributions paid into the fund for members of the State Legislature and the President of the Senate to be transferred to the expense fund of the Public Employees' Retirement System of Mississippi to defray the cost of administering this fund.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force fromand after its passage.
