SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 5
(As Adopted by Senate)

1 A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING CIVIC EDUCATION AND DECLARING THE
2 THIRD FRIDAY OF SEPTEMBER AS MISSISSIPPI'S LEGISLATORS BACK TO
3 SCHOOL DAY.

4 WHEREAS, Mississippi was created as a representative
5 democracy in which all governmental power is inherent in the
6 people who exercise that power through the legislative, executive
7 and judicial branches; and

8 WHEREAS, in recent years, citizen interest in government and
9 knowledge of the political system has declined in part due to a
10 weakening belief in, and a lack of understanding of the virtues
11 and knowledge needed for a successful republican form of
12 government; and

13 WHEREAS, Benjamin Rush, signer of the Declaration of
14 Independence, stated "There is but one method of rendering a
15 republican form of government durable, and that is by
16 disseminating the seeds of virtue and knowledge through every part
17 of the state by means of proper places and modes of education and
18 this can be done effectively only by the aid of the legislature";

20 WHEREAS, the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL)
21 has passed a resolution that says that the operations of the state
22 legislatures and the roles of individual legislators are often
23 little understood by citizens, and that public understanding of
24 the institutions and processes of the government is critical to
25 building public trust and confidence; and

26 WHEREAS, the NCSL resolution also states that state

27 legislatures need to bring about better understanding of the
28 concept of representative democracy and that education about
29 representative democracy should emphasize the importance of
30 compromise and the difficulty of resolving competing interests in
31 a diverse society; and

32 WHEREAS, civic education is a vital tool to promote greater
33 understanding of the legislative institution and the role of
34 legislators in representative democracy; and

35 WHEREAS, NCSL urges the nation's state legislatures to
36 promote civic education about representative democracy; and

37 WHEREAS, NCSL has established America's Legislators Back to
38 School Day, a national day on which state legislators across the
39 nation visit schools and classrooms to talk about the legislature
40 and to observe activities in the schools; and

41 WHEREAS, legislators will benefit from interacting with
42 students, teachers and administrators:

43 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
44 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby support civic education to promote
45 greater understanding of the legislative institution and the role
46 of legislators in representative democracy.

47 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Senate declares that the
48 third Friday in September shall be designated as Mississippi's
49 Legislators Back to School Day and urges all members of the
50 Legislature to visit schools on that day.
