COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 3

1 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE MAKING AND ACCEPTING OF CAMPAIGN 2 CONTRIBUTIONS BETWEEN HIGHWAY CONTRACTORS AND TRANSPORTATION 3 COMMISSIONERS; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF; AND 4 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified in Chapter 15, 7 Title 23, Mississippi Code of 1972:

It shall be unlawful for any Transportation 8 (1)9 Commissioner, any candidate for Transportation Commissioner, or any employee of the Department of Transportation to knowingly 10 accept any gift, pass, money, campaign contribution or any 11 emolument or other pecuniary benefit whatsoever, either directly 12 or indirectly, from any person acting in any respect for such 13 owner, agent or representative of any owner, agent or 14 representative, in the business of contracting or subcontracting 15 to build or maintain roads or in the business of the manufacture, 16 sale, distribution or purchase of any kind of road building 17 machinery or equipment, or of any kind of material for 18 constructing or maintaining roads, or in the business of writing 19 surety bonds for contractors engaged in road building. Any person 20 found guilty of violating the provisions of this subsection shall 21 immediately forfeit his or her office or position and shall be 22 fined not less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or 23 imprisoned in the State Penitentiary for not less than one (1) 24 year nor more than three (3) years, or both. 25

(2) It shall be unlawful for any person interested as owner,
 agent or representative, or any person acting in any respect for
 such owner, agent or representative of any person or entity in the
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business of contracting or subcontracting to build or maintain 29 30 roads or in the business of the manufacture, sale, distribution or purchase of any kind of road building machinery or equipment, or 31 of any kind of material for constructing or maintaining roads, or 32 33 in the business of writing surety bonds for contractors engaged in 34 road building. Any person found guilty of violating the provisions of this subsection shall be fined not less than Five 35 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or imprisoned in the State 36 Penitentiary for not less than one (1) year or more than three (3) 37 38 years, or both.

39 (3) For the purposes of this section the term "emolument"
40 shall include salary, donations, contributions, loans, stock tips,
41 vacations, trips, honorarium, directorships or consulting posts.
42 Expenses associated with social occasions afforded public servants
43 shall not be deemed a gift, emolument or other pecuniary benefit
44 as defined in Section 25-4-103(k).

45 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 46 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, 47 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 48 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States 49 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the 50 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 51 extended.

52 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 53 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 54 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
