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- CONTRACT SHALL NOT BE MORE THAN THE FAIR MARKET VALUE OF THE COMMODITIES; TO PROVIDE THAT IN ANY PURCHASE BY A STATE AGENCY FROM A STATE CONTRACT VENDOR, THE VENDOR MUST SELL THEIR 4
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- COMMODITIES TO THE AGENCY AT PRICES NOT MORE THAN THE FAIR MARKET 6
- VALUE OF THE COMMODITIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 5. Section 31-7-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 9
- 10 amended as follows:
- 31-7-9. (1) The Office of Purchasing and Travel shall adopt 11
- purchasing regulations governing the purchase by any agency of any 12
- commodity or commodities and establishing standards and 13
- specifications for a commodity or commodities and the maximum fair 14
- 15 prices of a commodity or commodities, which prices shall be not
- more than the fair market value of the commodities, subject to the 16
- approval of the Public Procurement Review Board. It shall have 17
- the power to amend, add to or eliminate purchasing regulations. 18
- The adoption of, amendment, addition to or elimination of 19
- 20 purchasing regulations shall be based upon a determination by the
- Office of Purchasing and Travel with the approval of the Public 21
- Procurement Review Board, that such action is reasonable and 22
- 23 practicable and advantageous to promote efficiency and economy in
- 24 the purchase of commodities by the agencies of the state. Upon
- the adoption of any purchasing regulation, or an amendment, 25
- addition or elimination therein, copies of same shall be furnished 26
- to the State Auditor and to all agencies affected thereby. 27
- 28 Thereafter, and except as otherwise may be provided in subsection
- (2) of this section, no agency of the state shall purchase any 29

- 30 commodities covered by existing purchasing regulations unless such
- 31 commodities be in conformity with the standards and specifications
- 32 set forth in the purchasing regulations and unless the price
- 33 thereof does not exceed the maximum fair price established by such
- 34 purchasing regulations. The * * * Office of Purchasing and Travel
- 35 shall furnish to any county or municipality or other local public
- 36 agency of the state requesting same, copies of purchasing
- 37 regulations adopted by the Office of Purchasing and Travel and any
- 38 amendments, changes or eliminations of same that may be made from
- 39 time to time.
- 40 (2) The Office of Purchasing and Travel shall adopt, subject
- 41 to the approval of the Public Procurement Review Board, purchasing
- 42 regulations governing the purchase of unmarked vehicles to be used
- 43 by the Bureau of Narcotics and Department of Public Safety in
- 44 official investigations pursuant to Section 25-1-87. Such
- 45 regulations shall ensure that purchases of such vehicles shall be
- 46 at a fair price and shall take into consideration the peculiar
- 47 needs of the Bureau of Narcotics and Department of Public Safety
- 48 in undercover operations.
- 49 SECTION 2. Section 31-7-12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 50 amended as follows:
- 51 31-7-12. (1) Except in regard to purchases of unmarked
- 52 vehicles made in accordance with purchasing regulations adopted by
- 53 the Department of Finance and Administration pursuant to Section
- 54 31-7-9(2), all agencies shall purchase commodities at the state
- 55 contract price from the approved source, unless approval is
- 56 granted by the Department of Finance and Administration to solicit
- 57 purchases outside the terms of the contracts. However, prices
- 58 accepted by an agency shall be less than the prices set by the
- 59 state contract. Prices accepted by an agency shall be obtained in
- 60 compliance with paragraph (a), (b) or (c) of Section 31-7-13. It
- 61 shall be the responsibility of the Department of Finance and
- 62 Administration to ascertain that the resulting prices shall

provide a cost effective alternative to the established state contract.

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- Governing authorities may purchase commodities approved (2) by the Department of Finance and Administration from the state contract vendor, or from any source offering the identical commodity, at a price not exceeding the state contract price established by the Department of Finance and Administration for such commodity, without obtaining or advertising for competitive bids. Governing authorities that do not exercise the option to purchase such commodities from the state contract vendor or from another source offering the identical commodity at a price not exceeding the state contract price established by the Department of Finance and Administration shall make such purchases pursuant to the provisions of Section 31-7-13 without regard to state contract prices established by the Department of Finance and Administration, unless such purchases are authorized to be made under subsection (5) of this section.
- (3) Nothing in this section shall prohibit governing authorities from purchasing, pursuant to subsection (2) of this section, commodities approved by the Department of Finance and Administration at a price not exceeding the state contract price established by the Department of Finance and Administration.
- The Department of Finance and Administration shall 85 ensure that the prices of all commodities on the state contract 86 87 are the lowest and best prices available from any source offering that commodity at the same level of quality or service, utilizing 88 89 the reasonable standards established therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration. All such prices shall be not more 90 than the fair market value of the commodities, as determined by 91 the Department of Finance and Administration. If the Department 92 93 of Finance and Administration does not list an approved price for 94 the particular item involved, purchase shall be made according to statutory bidding and licensing requirements. To encourage 95

96	prudent purchasing practices, the Department of Finance and
97	Administration shall be authorized and empowered to exempt certain
98	commodities from the requirement that the lowest and best price be
99	approved by order placed on its minutes.

- 100 (5) <u>In any purchase by an agency from a state contract</u>
 101 <u>vendor, the vendor must sell their commodities to the agency at</u>
 102 prices not more than the fair market value of the commodities.
 - (6) Any school district may purchase commodities from vendors with which any levying authority of the school district, as defined in Section 37-57-1, has contracted through competitive bidding procedures pursuant to Section 31-7-13 for purchases of the same commodities. Purchases authorized by this subsection may be made by a school district without obtaining or advertising for competitive bids, and such purchases shall be made at the same prices and under the same conditions as purchases of the same commodities are to be made by the levying authority of the school district under the contract with the vendor.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2001.

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
