HOUSE BILL NO. 53

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A "NO PASS, NO PLAY" LAW FOR STUDENTS 1 ENROLLED IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS; TO PROHIBIT STUDENTS FAILING TO 2 3 MAINTAIN AN AVERAGE OF 70 OR HIGHER IN ACADEMIC CLASSES OTHER THAN 4 HONORS CLASSES FROM PARTICIPATING IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES; TO PROVIDE THAT THE SUSPENSION FROM EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES 5 MUST BE AT LEAST THREE WEEKS IN DURATION; TO REQUIRE THE 6 7 SUSPENSION TO BE REMOVED IF, AFTER THREE WEEKS, A STUDENT ACHIEVES AN AVERAGE OF 70; TO AUTHORIZE STUDENTS UNDER SUSPENSION FROM 8 EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES TO PRACTICE OR REHEARSE WITH OTHER 9 10 STUDENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 SECTION 1. (1) A student who is enrolled in a school district in this state must be suspended from participation in any 13 extracurricular activity sponsored or sanctioned by the school 14 district after a grade evaluation period in which the student 15 receives an average grade for that evaluation period lower than 16 the equivalent of seventy (70) on a scale of one hundred (100) in 17 any academic class other than an identified honors or advanced 18 class. The suspension from participation in extracurricular 19 activities must continue for at least three (3) school weeks and 20 may not be removed during the school year until the conditions of 21 subsection (2) of this section are met; however, a suspension may 22 not last beyond the end of a school year. For purposes of this 23 section, the term "grade evaluation period" means a grade 24 reporting period of six (6) or nine (9) weeks, whichever is 25 utilized by the school district in which the student is enrolled. 26 27 (2) Until the suspension from participation in extracurricular activities is removed under this subsection or the 28 school year ends, a school district shall review the grades of a 29 student under the suspension at the end of each three-week period 30 following the date on which the suspension began. At the time of 31

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this review, the suspension must be removed if the student's average grade for the three-week period in each class, other than an identified honors or advanced class, is equal to or greater than the equivalent of seventy (70) on a scale of one hundred (100). The principal and each of the student's teachers shall make the determination concerning the student's grades.

Suspension from participation in extracurricular 38 (3) activities of an exceptional child with a disability that 39 significantly interferes with the student's ability to meet 40 regular academic standards must be based on the student's failure 41 to meet the requirements of the student's individualized education 42 program (IEP), as defined in Section 37-23-133. The determination 43 44 of whether a disability significantly interferes with a student's ability to meet regular academic standards must be made by the 45 local educational agency, as defined in the federal Individuals 46 with Disabilities Education Act. For purposes of this subsection, 47 48 the term "exceptional child" has the meaning ascribed in Section 49 37-23-3.

(4) A student suspended from participation in
extracurricular activities under this section may practice or
rehearse with other students for an extracurricular activity but
may not participate in a competition or other public performance.
SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2001.
