HOUSE BILL NO. 67

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
REQUIRE THE PAYMENT OF AN ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT AND ONE TIME
PROCESS REIMBURSEMENT TO SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS ACQUIRING THE
NATIONALLY CERTIFIED SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST DESIGNATION; AND FOR
RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

37-19-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited 9 as the Mississippi "Teacher Opportunity Program (TOP)." The 10 allowance in the minimum education program and the Mississippi 11 Adequate Education Program for teachers' salaries in each county 12 and separate school district shall be determined and paid in 13 accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in 14 this subsection. 159 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made 160 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the

The State Board of Education shall have the authority 165 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 166 establish, administer and maintain the system.

Any licensed teacher who has met the 307 (i) requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the 308 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is 309 310 employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education as a teacher and not as an administrator. *** * *** In the 2001-2002 311 312 school year and in school years thereafter, such teacher shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the 313 314 certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be 315 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State 316 317 Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the 318 second term of the school year. 319

(ii) From and after July 1, 1999, any licensed
school counselor who has met the requirements and acquired a
National Certified School Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the
National Board of Certified Counselors and who is employed by a
local school board or the State Board of Education as a counselor
and not as an administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall

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submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the 326 endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be 327 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school 328 329 year, or the licensed school counselor shall submit such 330 documentation to the State Department of Education prior to 331 February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 332 However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be 333 334 discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 335 336 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school counselors, and any school counselor receiving the salary supplement will be 337 required to complete the Master Teacher certificate process under 338 item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such 339 salary supplement. 340

From and after July 1, 1999, any licensed 341 (iii) speech-language pathologist and audiologist who has met the 342 343 requirements and acquired a Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is 344 345 employed by a local school board. Such licensed speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit documentation to the 346 347 State Department of Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be eligible for the 348 full salary supplement in the current school year, or the licensed 349 350 speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such documentation to the State Department of Education prior to 351 352 February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 353 354 However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be 355 discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 356 357 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school 358 speech-language pathologists and audiologists, and any school

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359 speech-<u>language</u> pathologist and audiologist receiving the salary 360 supplement will be required to complete the Master Teacher 361 certificate process under item (i) of this paragraph in order to 362 continue receiving such salary supplement.

363 (iv) From and after July 1, 2001, any licensed 364 school psychologist who has met the requirements and acquired the designation "Nationally Certified School Psychologist (NCSP)" 365 through the National School Psychology Certification System and 366 367 who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education as a psychologist and not as an administrator. A 368 369 nationally certified school psychologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the 370 371 certification was received before October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school 372 year, or the nationally certified school psychologist shall submit 373 such documentation to the State Department of Education before 374 February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary 375 376 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be 377 378 discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 379 380 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school psychologists, and any school psychologist receiving the salary supplement will 381 be required to complete the Master Teacher certificate process 382 383 under item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such salary supplement. 384 385 (b) An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the 386 certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for 387

388 postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)

389 for a school counselor, speech-language pathologist and

390 audiologist <u>or school psychologist</u>, regardless of whether or not 391 the process resulted in the award of the certificate or

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endorsement. A local school district or any private individual or 392 393 entity may pay the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district 394 395 described under paragraph (a), and the State Department of 396 Education shall reimburse the school district for such cost, 397 regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. If a private individual or entity 398 has paid the cost of completing the process of acquiring the 399 400 certificate or endorsement for an employee, the local school district may agree to directly reimburse the individual or entity 401 402 for such cost on behalf of the employee.

All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process 403 (C) 404 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school 405 district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program 406 or Adequate Education Program allotments and not a part thereof in 407 accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of 408 409 Education, and subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any 410 411 employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local supplement to which employees with similar 412 413 training and experience otherwise are entitled.

(d) The State Department of Education may not pay any 414 415 process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who 416 does not complete the certification or endorsement process required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. 417 If an 418 employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a local school district or private individual or entity fails to 419 complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee 420 421 shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on 422 423 behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or

424 endorsement.

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425 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 426 and after July 1, 2001.
