1 2 3	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CREATE THE WORLD CLASS TEACHERS PROGRAM AND TO PRESCRIBE THE COMPONENTS OF THE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to establish, administer and maintain the system.

All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no school district shall receive any funds under this section for any school year during which the local supplement paid to any individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties from local supplement during the immediately preceding school year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a part of the amount of individual local supplement.

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$660.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$675.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license

until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Ten Dollars (\$610.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Sixty-five Dollars (\$465.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience.

Education, the annual increments shall be as follows:

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$770.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Five Dollars (\$705.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Forty Dollars (\$640.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four

Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$480.00) for each year of teaching
experience possessed by the person holding such license until such
person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience.

The level of professional training of each teacher to be used in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current school year.

- (2) (a) The following employees shall receive an annual salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other compensation to which the employee may be entitled:
- (i) Any licensed teacher who has met the requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education as a teacher and not as an administrator. \* \* \* In the 2001-2002 school year and in school years thereafter, such teacher shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school year.
- From and after July 1, 1999, any licensed school counselor who has met the requirements and acquired a National Certified School Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified Counselors and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education as a counselor and not as an administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be

eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school 324 year, or the licensed school counselor shall submit such 325 documentation to the State Department of Education prior to 326 327 February 15 in order to be eliqible for a prorated salary 328 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be 329 discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National 330 Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 331 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school counselors, 332 and any school counselor receiving the salary supplement will be 333 334 required to complete the Master Teacher certificate process under item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such 335 336 salary supplement. 337 From and after July 1, 1999, any licensed (iii) speech-language pathologist and audiologist who has met the 338 requirements and acquired a Certificate of Clinical Competence 339 from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is 340 341 employed by a local school board. Such licensed speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit documentation to the 342 343 State Department of Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be eligible for the 344 345 full salary supplement in the current school year, or the licensed 346 speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such documentation to the State Department of Education prior to 347 348 February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 349 However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be 350 351 discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National 352 Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 353 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school speechlanguage pathologists and audiologists, and any school speech-354 355 language pathologist and audiologist receiving the salary 356 supplement will be required to complete the Master Teacher

certificate process under item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such salary supplement.

- An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for 359 (b) 360 the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the 361 certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) 362 for a school counselor or speech-language pathologist and 363 audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in 364 the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school 365 district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of 366 367 completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district described under paragraph 368 (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the 369 370 school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. 371 If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing 372 the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an 373 374 employee, the local school district may agree to directly 375 reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the 376 employee.
- 377 All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process (C) 378 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school 379 district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program 380 381 allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to 382 appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall 383 not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving 384 such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local 385 386 supplement to which employees with similar training and experience otherwise are entitled. 387
- 388 (d) The State Department of Education may not pay any
  389 process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who
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390	does not complete the certification or endorsement process
391	required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. If an
392	employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a
393	local school district or private individual or entity fails to
394	complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee
395	shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for
396	all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on
397	behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or
398	endorsement.
399	(3) (a) The World Class Teachers Program is created to
400	support Mississippi teachers in their efforts to become certified
401	by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards.
402	(b) The World Class Teachers Program contains the
403	following components:
404	(i) A system for recruiting and screening
405	<pre>participants;</pre>
406	(ii) A systematic program of training and
407	technical assistance; and
408	(iii) Multiple routes for participants to provide
409	services to the state as repayment for inclusion in the program.
410	(c) In order to initiate the program, sufficient
411	funding shall be appropriated by the Legislature. Policies and
412	practices that define the relationship of the Mississippi World
413	Class Teachers Program to the Mississippi Teacher Center shall be
414	<u>established.</u>
415	(d) The purposes of the program are:
416	(i) To create an avenue for rewarding excellence
417	<u>in teaching;</u>
418	(ii) To establish a pool of master teachers who
419	can serve as mentors, supervising teachers, or in a variety of
420	<pre>leadership roles;</pre>
421	(iii) To positively influence programs of teacher
422	education as colleges strive to have their graduates gain

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423	certification by the National Board for Professional Teaching
424	Standards; and
425	(iv) To encourage master teachers to stay in the
426	profession in Mississippi.
427	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2001.
