HOUSE BILL NO. 202

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF REIMBURSING COUNTIES AND MUNICIPALITIES FOR A PORTION OF THE COST OF 3 PURCHASING AUTOMATIC EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS (AEDs) FOR USE BY LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, FIRE FIGHTERS AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONS; TO CREATE A SPECIAL FUND IN THE STATE TREASURY TO BE DESIGNATED AS THE "AUTOMATIC EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR 6 7 REIMBURSEMENT FUND"; TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE FISCAL OFFICER SHALL TRANSFER THE SUM OF \$1.1 MILLION FROM THE STATE GENERAL FUND TO THE SPECIAL FUND IN TWO EQUAL PAYMENTS, WITH THE FIRST PAYMENT ON JULY 1, 2001, AND THE SECOND PAYMENT ON JANUARY 1, 2002; TO 8 9 10 PROVIDE THAT THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF REIMBURSEMENT FROM THE FUND FOR A 11 COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY, AND THE PORTION OF THE AED PURCHASE PRICE 12 THAT WILL BE REIMBURSABLE FROM THE FUND, WILL BE BASED ON THE POPULATION OF THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY; TO SPECIFICALLY 13 14 AUTHORIZE ANY LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, FIRE FIGHTER OR 15 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSON TO USE AN AED FOR THE PURPOSE OF 16 SAVING THE LIFE OF ANOTHER PERSON IN CARDIAC ARREST; TO PROVIDE 17 THAT BEFORE ANY SUCH PERSON MAY USE AN AED, THE PERSON MUST OBTAIN 18 APPROPRIATE TRAINING AS SPECIFIED BY THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY, 19 20 AND OBTAIN CERTIFICATION FROM THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY AS HAVING RECEIVED THE TRAINING AND HAVING A DEMONSTRATED PROFICIENCY IN THE 21 22 USE OF AN AED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 23 SECTION 1. (1) There is established a program for the 24 25 purpose of reimbursing counties and municipalities for a portion of the cost of purchasing automatic external defibrillators (AEDs) 26 for use by county sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, municipal police 27 officers, other county and municipal law enforcement officers, 28 fire fighters and emergency medical services (EMS) persons who are 29 employed by the counties and municipalities. The program shall be 30 administered by the Department of Finance and Administration. For 31 32 the purposes of this act, the term "AED" shall be defined as in

34 (2) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to

35 be designated as the "Automatic External Defibrillator

36 Reimbursement Fund." The State Fiscal Officer shall transfer the

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- 38 from the State General Fund to this special fund. The transfer
- 39 shall be made in two (2) equal payments, with the first payment to
- 40 be made on July 1, 2001, and the second payment to be made on
- 41 January 1, 2002. Such monies as are deposited into the fund under
- 42 the provisions of this section may be expended by the Department
- 43 of Finance and Administration upon appropriation by the
- 44 Legislature, and upon requisition therefor by the executive
- 45 director of the department, in accordance with the provisions of
- 46 this section. Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000.00)
- 47 shall be available for expenditure after July 1, 2001, and Five
- 48 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000.00) shall be available
- 49 for expenditure after January 1, 2002. Unexpended amounts
- 50 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
- 51 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
- 52 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund.
- 53 (3) (a) A county shall be eligible to receive reimbursement
- 54 from the fund for the purchase of AEDs as follows:
- (i) If the population of the county in the areas
- 56 outside of the incorporated municipalities in the county is five
- 57 thousand (5,000) or more, according to the most recent federal
- 58 decennial census, the county shall be reimbursed fifty percent
- 59 (50%) of the actual purchase price of each AED purchased, not to
- 60 exceed a total reimbursement amount of Five Thousand Dollars
- 61 (\$5,000.00) for all AEDs purchased by the county.
- 62 (ii) If the population of the county in the areas
- 63 outside of the incorporated municipalities in the county is under
- 64 five thousand (5,000), according to the most recent federal
- 65 decennial census, the county shall be reimbursed seventy-five
- 66 percent (75%) of the actual purchase price of each AED purchased,
- 67 not to exceed a total reimbursement amount of Two Thousand Five
- 68 Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for all AEDs purchased by the county.
- (b) A municipality shall be eligible to receive
- 70 reimbursement from the fund for the purchase of AEDs as follows:

(i) If the population of the municipality is five thousand (5,000) or more, according to the most recent federal decennial census, the municipality shall be reimbursed fifty percent (50%) of the actual purchase price of each AED purchased, not to exceed a total reimbursement amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for all AEDs purchased by the municipality.

(ii) If the population of the municipality is

under five thousand (5,000), according to the most recent federal decennial census, the municipality shall be reimbursed seventy-five percent (75%) of the actual purchase price of each AED purchased, not to exceed a total reimbursement amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for all AEDs purchased by the municipality.

governing authorities of a municipality, as the case may be, shall submit their requests for reimbursement from the fund to the Department of Finance and Administration, and shall provide documentation of the purchase of each AED and the actual purchase price of each AED. The department shall review each request, and if adequate documentation has been provided, the department shall reimburse the county or municipality as provided in this section. Monies in the fund shall be available on a first come, first served basis, and no county or municipality has a right to reimbursement if there are not sufficient monies in the fund to make the reimbursement.

- (4) The Department of Finance and Administration shall:
- 97 (a) Maintain an accurate record of all monies paid to 98 counties and municipalities from the fund, those records to be 99 kept separate from other records of the department;

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103	(c) Adopt and promulgate such rules and regulations as
104	may be necessary and desirable to implement this section; and
105	(d) File with the Legislature on or before January 2,
106	2002, and on or before July 1, 2002, a report detailing how the
107	monies in the fund were expended during the preceding portion of
108	the fiscal year.
109	SECTION 2. Any county sheriff, deputy sheriff, municipal
110	police officer, other county or municipal law enforcement officer,
111	fire fighter or emergency medical services (EMS) person who is
112	employed by a county or municipality may use an automatic external
113	defibrillator (AED) for the purpose of saving the life of another
114	person in cardiac arrest. However, before any such person may use
115	an AED, the person must obtain appropriate training as specified
116	by the county or municipality in which the person is employed, and
117	obtain certification from the county or municipality as having
118	received the training and having a demonstrated proficiency in the
119	use of an AED. The training shall include, at a minimum,
120	completion of a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or
121	successful completion of a basic first aid course that includes
122	CPR training, and a course in the use of an AED.
123	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
124	and after July 1, 2001.
