## HOUSE BILL NO. 219

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-501, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
- 2 TO PROVIDE THAT THE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT FOR TRUCKS SHALL BE FIVE
- MILES PER HOUR LESS THAN THE MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT ESTABLISHED FOR OTHER VEHICLES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-501, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 63-3-501. (1) No person shall operate a vehicle on the
- 9 highways of the state at a speed greater than sixty-five (65)
- 10 miles per hour.
- 11 (2) The Mississippi Transportation Commission may, in its
- 12 discretion, by order duly entered on its minutes, increase the
- 13 speed restrictions on any portion of the Interstate Highway
- 14 System provided such speed restrictions are not increased to more
- 15 than seventy (70) miles per hour. The commission may likewise
- 16 increase the speed limit to seventy (70) miles per hour on
- 17 controlled access highways with four (4) or more lanes.
- 18 (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (1) and
- 19 (2) of this section, the maximum speed limit for trucks shall be
- 20 five (5) miles per hour less than the speed limit for other
- 21 vehicles established under subsections (1) and (2) of this
- 22 section. For the purposes of this subsection the term "truck"
- means a motor vehicle in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds,
- 24 gross vehicle weight.
- 25 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 26 and after July 1, 2001.
