## HOUSE BILL NO. 244

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-106-29, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF GRANTS UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI RESIDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANT (MTAG) PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-106-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 37-106-29. (1) There is established the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program for college or 8 university freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors to be 9 administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial 10 Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9, which shall 11 set the dates and deadlines for applying for an award under this 12 13 section. The board shall establish such rules and regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry out the purposes and intent 14 15 of this section.

16 (2) The college or university shall approve grants to
17 full-time freshmen, sophomore, junior and senior Mississippi
18 residents who meet the general requirements for student
19 eligibility as provided in subsection (4) of this section.

20 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants shall be (3) 21 for Mississippi students from any Mississippi family whose prior year adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to 22 qualify for full Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal 23 aid. Those Mississippi students receiving less than the full Pell 24 Grant award, as determined by the institution, shall receive a 25 26 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant in an amount not to exceed the maximum Pell Grant allowable for that individual 27

The award shall be applied to tuition, rooms and meals, 28 student. books, materials and fees not to exceed One Thousand Two Hundred 29 Dollars (\$1,200.00) for junior and senior students attending state 30 institutions of higher learning in Mississippi or four-year 31 32 regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit colleges and 33 universities in Mississippi, and Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) for freshmen and sophomores attending state institutions of higher 34 learning or public community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or 35 regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or 36 four-year colleges in Mississippi, which will be prorated per 37 term, semester or quarter of the academic year for costs of 38 attendance, calculated according to the formula specified in 39 40 subsection (8) of this section.

(4) The general requirements for initial eligibility of
students for Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants
consist of the following:

(a) Member of a Mississippi family whose prior year
adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to qualify
for Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal aid.

47 (b) Acceptance for enrollment at any state institution of higher learning or public community or junior college located 48 49 in Mississippi, or any regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit four- or two-year college or university located in 50 Mississippi as listed in subsection (d) of this subsection: 51 (i) a 52 minimum grade point average of 2.5 calculated on a 4.0 scale after seven (7) semesters certified by the high school counselor or 53 other authorized school official on the application and graduation 54 from high school verified by the institution before disbursement 55 of award and has scored fifteen (15) on the American College Test 56 57 Program (ACT); or (ii) has attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through 12, and has scored fifteen (15) on 58 59 the American College Testing Program; or (iii) satisfactory completion of the General Educational Development Test (GED) or 60

have successfully completed the International Baccalaureate 61 62 Program and has scored fifteen (15) on the American College Testing Program; \* \* \* however, \* \* \* any student entering a 63 64 vocational or technical program of study, or who has 65 satisfactorily completed the General Education Development Test 66 and attends a community or junior college will not be required to have a test score under the American College Testing Program 67 except those students enrolled in courses of academic study. Any 68 student currently enrolled in any qualified institution shall have 69 70 to only meet the same requirements as students who are applying 71 for a renewal award.

(c) Resident status for purposes of receiving grants
under this act shall be determined in the same manner as resident
status for tuition purposes as set forth in Sections 37-103-1
through 37-103-29, with the exception of 37-103-17.

76 (d) Must attend one (1) of the following institutions of higher learning: Alcorn State University, Delta State 77 78 University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley 79 80 State University, University of Mississippi, University of Southern Mississippi, Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln 81 82 Community College, East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community College, Hinds Community College, Holmes 83 Community College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior 84 85 College, Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, Northeast 86 87 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community College, Pearl River Community College, Southwest Mississippi 88 Community College, Belhaven College, Blue Mountain College, 89 Millsaps College, Mississippi College, Rust College, Tougaloo 90 College, William Carey College, Mary Holmes College, Magnolia 91 92 Bible College and Wood College.

By accepting a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance 93 (5) Grant, the student is attesting to the accuracy, completeness and 94 correctness of information provided to demonstrate the student's 95 96 eligibility. Falsification of such information shall result in 97 the denial of any pending grant and revocation of any award 98 currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be made. Any student knowingly making false statements in order to 99 receive a grant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon 100 101 conviction thereof, by a fine of up to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), a prison sentence of up to one (1) year in the 102 103 county jail, or both, and shall be required to return all 104 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants wrongfully 105 obtained.

106 (6) Eligibility for renewal of Mississippi Resident Tuition
107 Assistance Grants shall be evaluated at the end of each semester,
108 or term, of each academic year. As a condition for renewal, a
109 student shall:

(a) Make steady academic progress toward a certificate
or degree, as outlined in the school Satisfactory Academic
Progress Standards and certified by the institution's registrar.

Maintain continuous enrollment for not less than 113 (b) 114 two (2) semesters or three (3) quarters in each successive academic year, unless granted an exception for cause by the 115 administering agency; examples of cause may include student 116 117 participation in a cooperative program, internship program or foreign study program. If a student fails to maintain continuous 118 enrollment, and is not granted an exception for cause by the 119 administering agency, the student is ineligible to receive the 120 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following 121 semester or trimester or term of the regular academic year. 122 123 (C) Have a cumulative grade point average of at least

124 2.50 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester or 125 trimester or term.

No. 244 01/HR40/R123 PAGE 4 (RM\BD) 126 (7) Each student, each year, must complete a Free 127 Application for Federal Student Aid form or a Statement of 128 Certification as designed by the administering board to determine 129 his/her eligibility for a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance 130 Grant.

(8) The amount of the Mississippi Resident Tuition 131 (a) Assistance Grant awarded to any one (1) student, up to the maximum 132 amount provided in subsection (3) of this section, shall be the 133 difference of the student's cost of attendance at his accredited 134 college of choice and the amount of federal aid such student may 135 136 receive, not to supplant but to supplement the amount of any federal aid awarded to the student. Cost of attendance is the 137 tuition and fees of the applicable institution plus an allowance 138 for room and meals and books and materials. 139

(b) Payment of the Mississippi Resident Tuition
Assistance Grant shall be made payable to the recipient and the
educational institution and mailed directly to the institution, to
be applied first to tuition.

144 (9) In order for an institution to remain eligible for its 145 students to participate in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 146 Assistance Grant Program, the institution shall comply with the 147 following requirements:

(a) A complete and accurate roster of the eligibility
status of each awarded student shall be made to the board for each
term, semester or quarter of the academic year the student
receives a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant.

152 (b) The institution is required to make refunds to the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Fund for any funds 153 which have not been disbursed to the recipient, in the case of 154 155 students who have received a grant but who terminate enrollment during the academic term, semester or quarter of the academic year 156 157 if an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a 158 refund in such instance. The recipient shall be responsible for

(c) If a student drops below full-time status but does
not terminate all enrollment during the term, semester or quarter
of the academic year no refund will be required for that term.
However, that student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi
Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following term,
semester or quarter of the regular academic year.

167 (d) The board may conduct its own annual audits of any institution participating in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 168 169 Assistance Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an institution's eligibility to receive future monies under the 170 171 program if it finds that the institution has not complied with the provisions of this act. In determining a student's initial 172 eligibility, the number of prior semesters enrolled will not be 173 174 counted against the student.

(10) No student may receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition
Assistance Grant for more than the equivalent semesters or
quarters required to complete one (1) baccalaureate degree or one
(1) certificate or associate degree program per institution.

Subject to the availability of funds specifically 179 (11)180 appropriated therefor, it is the intent of the Legislature to fully fund grant awards to eligible students. If funds are 181 insufficient to fully fund grant awards to eligible students, 182 183 grant awards shall be prorated among all eligible students. No student shall receive any combination of student financial aid in 184 excess of the cost of attendance as defined in subsection (8)(a). 185 No student receiving a Mississippi Eminent Scholars 186 (12)Grant as provided in Section 37-106-31 shall be eligible to 187 188 receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant pursuant to Section 37-106-29 unless he is eligible for such award after 189 190 the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant has been considered by the 191 board when conducting an assessment of the financial resources

H. B. No. 244 01/HR40/R123 PAGE 6 (RM\BD) available to the student. In no case shall any student receive any combination of student financial aid that would exceed the cost of attendance, as defined in subsection (8)(a).

For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean but not be limited to all postsecondary vocational programs in eligible institutions as identified in subsection (4)(d) of this section. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2001.
