HOUSE BILL NO. 246

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A GRANT PROGRAM FOR PERSONS TAKING 1 ACADEMIC COURSES ON THE INTERNET; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PURPOSE OF 2 THE PROGRAM IS TO ENCOURAGE MISSISSIPPI RESIDENTS TO FURTHER THEIR 3 4 POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION; TO AUTHORIZE GRANTS UNDER THE PROGRAM FOR COURSES TAKEN OVER THE INTERNET IN FURTHERANCE OF A HIGHER 5 EDUCATION DEGREE; TO REQUIRE THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE 6 7 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE BOARD, ACTING JOINTLY WITH THE STATE BOARD FOR COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES, TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM; TO ESTABLISH INITIAL 8 9 10 11 ELIGIBILITY GRADE POINT AVERAGE REQUIREMENTS; TO PROVIDE THAT GRANTS MUST BE AWARDED ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS; AND 12 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 13

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 14 SECTION 1. (1) There is created a special grant program for 15 persons participating in academic courses available on the 16 Internet in furtherance of an associate, baccalaureate, graduate 17 18 or specialist degree. The purpose of the program is to encourage eligible residents of Mississippi to further their education by 19 offering such persons, particularly nontraditional students, a 20 21 financial incentive for availing themselves of postsecondary 22 academic courses accessible by computer away from campus.

23 (2) Any legal resident of the state who enrolls in an academic course or courses made available on the Internet by an 24 accredited community or junior college or institution of higher 25 26 learning in furtherance of an associate, baccalaureate, graduate or specialist degree may apply for a grant under this program. 27 Grants may not exceed the actual tuition or enrollment costs for 28 the specific course or courses in which a student is enrolled, 29 plus any required fees imposed as a condition for the enrollment. 30 31 Subject to the availability of funding, the Board of Trustees of 32 State Institutions of Higher Learning, in its discretion, may

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authorize grants to be applied toward the cost of books and other 33 34 materials required for a course. However, no funds awarded under 35 this program may be used for the purchase of computer equipment or for Internet services made available to the public by 36 37 subscription, membership or other affiliation with an Internet 38 service provider. The maximum annual grant that may be awarded to a student under this program shall be One Thousand Dollars 39 (\$1,000.00) per academic year. For purposes of this section, the 40 term "academic year" means August 1 through the next succeeding 41 42 July 31.

(3) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
Learning shall administer the grant program established under this
section. The board, acting jointly with the State Board for
Community and Junior Colleges, shall promulgate rules and
regulations necessary to carry out the purposes and intent of this
section, which must include provisions addressing the following:

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(a) The application process and deadline;

50 (b) Initial eligibility requirements, which may vary51 depending on the degree being sought by the applicant;

52 (c) The documentation required from an applicant to 53 establish the person's enrollment in the Internet course and that 54 the course is required for the degree being sought by the 55 applicant;

(d) The accreditation requirements for community and
junior colleges and institutions of higher learning offering
courses on the Internet;

(e) The maximum amount which may be awarded to a person
and the maximum number of years which a person may receive awards
under the program; and

62 (f) Any other provisions deemed necessary by the boards63 for the proper administration of the program.

64 (4) A person who has a baccalaureate degree may receive
65 grants only in furtherance of a master's, doctorate or specialist

A person who has a master's degree may receive grants 67 only in furtherance of a doctorate or specialist degree. Persons 68 possessing a doctorate degree or specialist degree are not 69 eligible to receive grants under the program.

70 (5) As a requirement for initial eligibility, an applicant for a grant must have a cumulative minimum grade point average of 71 2.50 calculated on a 4.00 scale for all coursework attempted in 72 73 the two (2) years preceding the date of application. As a condition for additional grants, an applicant must make steady 74 academic progress toward the degree being sought and must maintain 75 76 a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 calculated on a 77 4.00 scale.

(6) If funds are insufficient to fully fund grants for all
eligible applicants, the board shall award the grants to
first-time students on a first come, first served basis; however,
priority consideration must be given to persons previously
receiving grants under the program who are making steady academic
progress toward completion of the degree being sought.

84 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 85 and after July 1, 2001.
